

## MEDICAL DEPARTMENT.

---

The Annual Course of Lectures in this Department will commence on Monday, the 11th of November, 1861, and terminate in March, 1862.

Preliminary Lectures will be delivered daily in the Amphitheatre of the Hospital, from the 14th of October, on Clinical Medicine and Surgery and other subjects, without any charge to Students.

In 1860—'61, there were four hundred and four Matriculates, and one hundred and thirty-four Graduates in the Department.

The Students of the Class were from Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Texas, Arkansas, Tennessee, Kentucky, South Carolina, Georgia, Virginia, Missouri, Maryland, Illinois, New York, and Mexico.

The Faculty announce to the public the continued prosperity of the Medical College of Louisiana.

Four thousand and twenty-four names are on the Register of Matriculates.

The College is endowed by the State.

## MUSEUM.

---

The Museum of Anatomy is extensive. The preparations are chiefly works of Scientific artists in England, France and Italy.

In Human and Comparative Anatomy there are:—

- I.—A collection of Muscular preparations, from the Academy of Anatomy at Florence. They represent more than three hundred and fifty separate dissections:
- II.—Thibert's Tableaux of the Microscopic Anatomy of the Tissues:
- III.—Auzou's Cabinet of Human and Comparative Anatomy:
- IV.—A Cabinet of Human Bones, and a collection in Comparative Osteology:
- V.—Preparations in Wax, representing the Anatomy of the Viscera; of the Nervous and Vascular Systems; and of every organ in the human body.

The Pathological Department is enriched by models from England and France, which represent diseases of the Eye and diseases of the Skin; and by a great number of specimens of Urinary and Biliary Calculi, obtained from Dupuytren's Museum, at Paris; from the College of Surgeons, London, and from amongst ourselves.

The models of the diseases of the Skin were made by Mr. Towne, of Guy's Hospital, London. They are perfect, and disease can be studied with their aid almost as well as in nature.

Besides the collections brought from Europe, the Museum contains preparations made by members of the Faculty, and others presented by their scientific brethren.

The Pathological collection of Bones is excellent.

The other specimens of Pathological Anatomy are highly interesting and instructive.

## CHARITY HOSPITAL.



## CLINICAL INSTRUCTION.

The number of Admissions into the Hospital in 1860, was 14,000.

The number of Medical cases treated during the last year in the Hospital was about 10,400; the Surgical patients numbered 3,000; and the Obstetrical cases, and those of special diseases of Women and Children, numbered about 600. The number of births was 134.

The College presents opportunities to Students unsurpassed by any institution in the world. The Act which established the University of Louisiana, gives the Professors of the Medical Department the use of the Charity Hospital as a school of practical instruction.

There are about 750 cases usually in the wards of the Charity Hospital. The Professors visit every morning, between 8 and 10 o'clock, the Medical, Surgical and Obstetrical wards, prescribe and make Clinical remarks.

The Students of this Department are taught at the bed-side the nature and treatment of diseases—the modes of examining patients—the practical uses of Auscultation, Percussion, Mensuration, Palpation, and the uses of the Microscope and other instruments, and of Chemical reagents.

The facilities of the Charity Hospital, for professional study, have, after a long series of years of assiduous labor, been improved, and, almost fully developed by the Faculty. So that, in this Hospital, we have in New Orleans a practical School of Medicine and of Surgery, which will bear a favorable comparison with St. Bartholomew's of London, or Hotel Dieu of Paris.

There is no great City in the World which can boast of an institution, where the Student visits every form of disease so unrestrictedly as in the Charity Hospital—where he can so familiarly look disease in the face.

In Rome, Vienna, Paris, London and other justly celebrated Capitals famed for Medical Science and instruction, in Great Britain and in Continental Europe, the Student, at a respectful distance, accompanies the Professor in his visits, listens to his speech, looks at the patients in bed arranged as tableaux, and is favored with

glimpses of the picture-like representations of the various forms and phenomena of disease. The Professor informs him of the condition of the pulse, the respiration, the temperature of the body, and of the signs and symptoms which occur during disease, and which the Master observes.

But the pupil cannot place his hand upon the patient—he cannot question him to satisfy his own mind—he is not permitted to speak aloud—and he is excluded from visiting patients except in the presence of his teachers.

In New Orleans the Student can visit patients in the Charity Hospital from morning until night, and devote his talents and industry to the study of every disease in the wards. He can question and examine for himself, that he may the better learn, and resolve his doubts of knowledge.

Members of the Classes of the Medical Department have gratuitous admission to the Hospital, and to all Lectures in the Hospital.

Attendance on cases of Labor in the Obstetrical wards is provided for by the Professor of Obstetrics, from among the candidates for Graduation.

The Professor of Surgery performs operations and dressings in the presence of the Students in the Amphitheatre of the Hospital; and here Lectures are delivered on Wednesday and Saturday of every week, on Clinical Medicine and Surgery, on special Pathological Anatomy, on Physical Diagnosis, and on Auscultation and Percussion.

Post Mortem examinations are also made in presence of the Class.

## LECTURES.

---

- I.—The Professor of Anatomy Lectures five days of every week during the session.
- II.—The Professor of Physiology and Pathology Lectures five days of every week.
- III.—The Professor of the Theory and Practice of Medicine Lectures six days of every week.

- IV.—The Professor of Surgery Lectures six days of every week.  
V.—The Professor of Obstetrics Lectures four days of every week.  
VI.—The Professor of Materia Medica and Therapeutics Lectures  
four days of every week.  
VII.—The Professor of Chemistry Lectures four days of every week.  
Military Surgery.—A Department confided to the charge of Professor Stone, will receive most particular attention during the ensuing session of the College.

The Professors have every thing deemed necessary to aid them in teaching the various branches of Medical Science, viz:

- 1.—Chemical and Philosophical Apparatus, of modern style.
- 2.—Specimens of Materia Medica and Chemical products.
- 3.—Surgical Instruments.
- 4.—Paintings, Plates, Models, Drawings, Books and Special Apparatus

The Medical Department of the University of Louisiana affords the Student ample means of acquiring knowledge of the causes, nature and treatment of diseases peculiar to our climate, and to negroes.

## CANDIDATES FOR THE DEGREE OF DOCTOR OF MEDICINE.

- I.—The candidate must be twenty-one years of age, of moral character, and must have studied Medicine three years.
  - II.—He must have attended two full Courses of Lectures, the last of which must have been in this Institution.
  - III.—He must write a Thesis on a Medical subject, and present it to the Dean one month before the close of the session.
  - IV.—He must be examined by the Faculty.

The Rooms for Practical Anatomy will be open from the Second Monday in October to the First of April; and from 7 P. M., to 10 P. M., the Demonstrators will be constantly in attendance, for the purpose of instructing the Students.

Graduates of respectable schools will be admitted to the course without charge except for Matriculation.

Students who desire further information will address themselves to the Dean.
