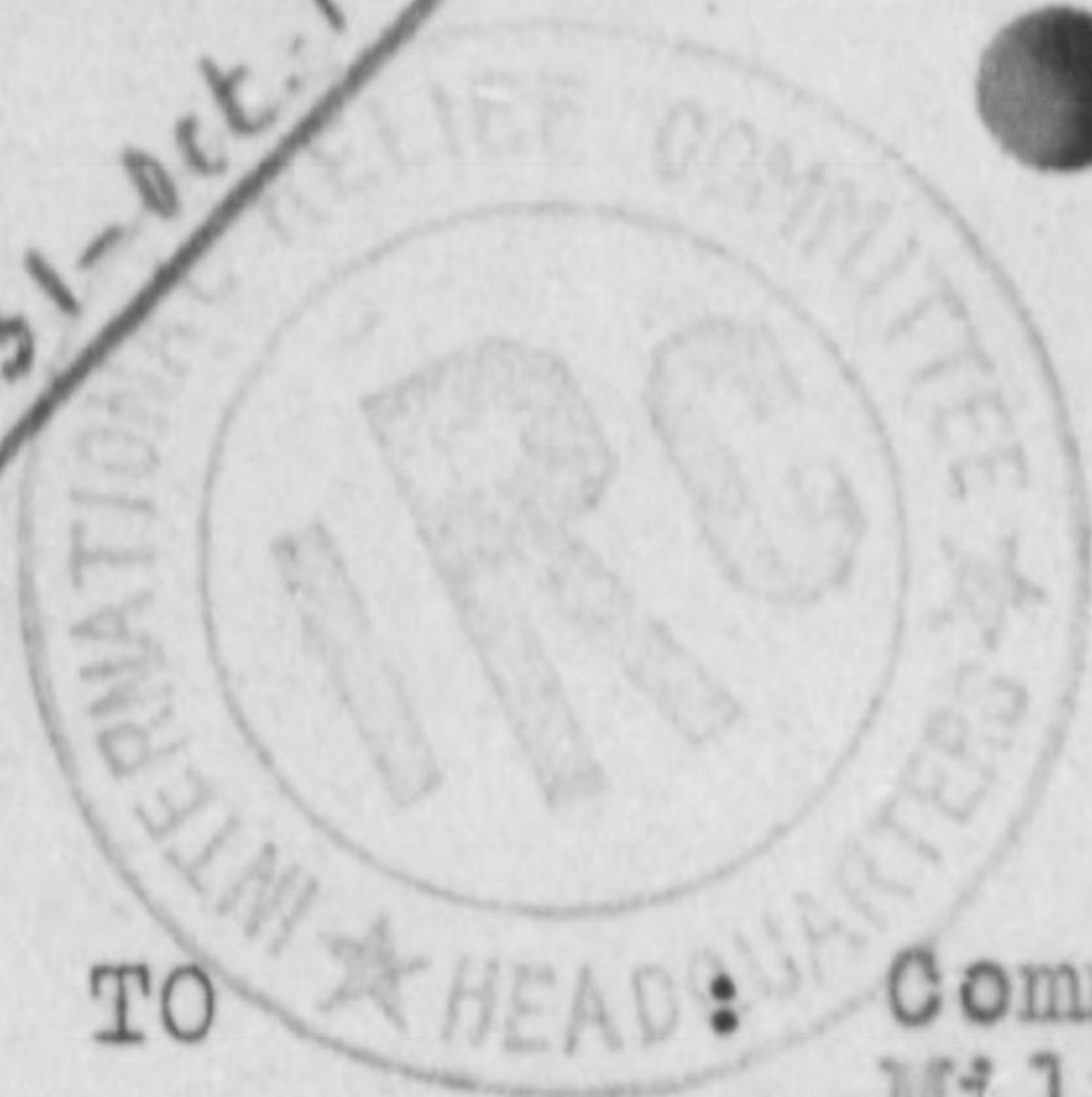

Dear Captain,

referring to my visit on June 7. I, herewith, give you the data of the "rations for Foreigners" as they have been actually distributed in Yokohama in April and May.

In April I received nothing, the distribution of the rationed goods for April took place in the middle of May. It was received 1 Kin of sugar, $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of butter completely spoiled, 0.9 litre of oil of minor quality, 1.5 kg. of a blackish flour, no potatoes, instead of them 3 kg. of the same flour. The meat (1.125 kg.) is so bad, expensive (35 Yen for 100 monme) and difficult to get, that nobody buys it. Canned goods have not been distributed. The rations for May have not yet been given out, the tickets for them have been issued, save for butter. Sugar and oil was distributed. I remain
