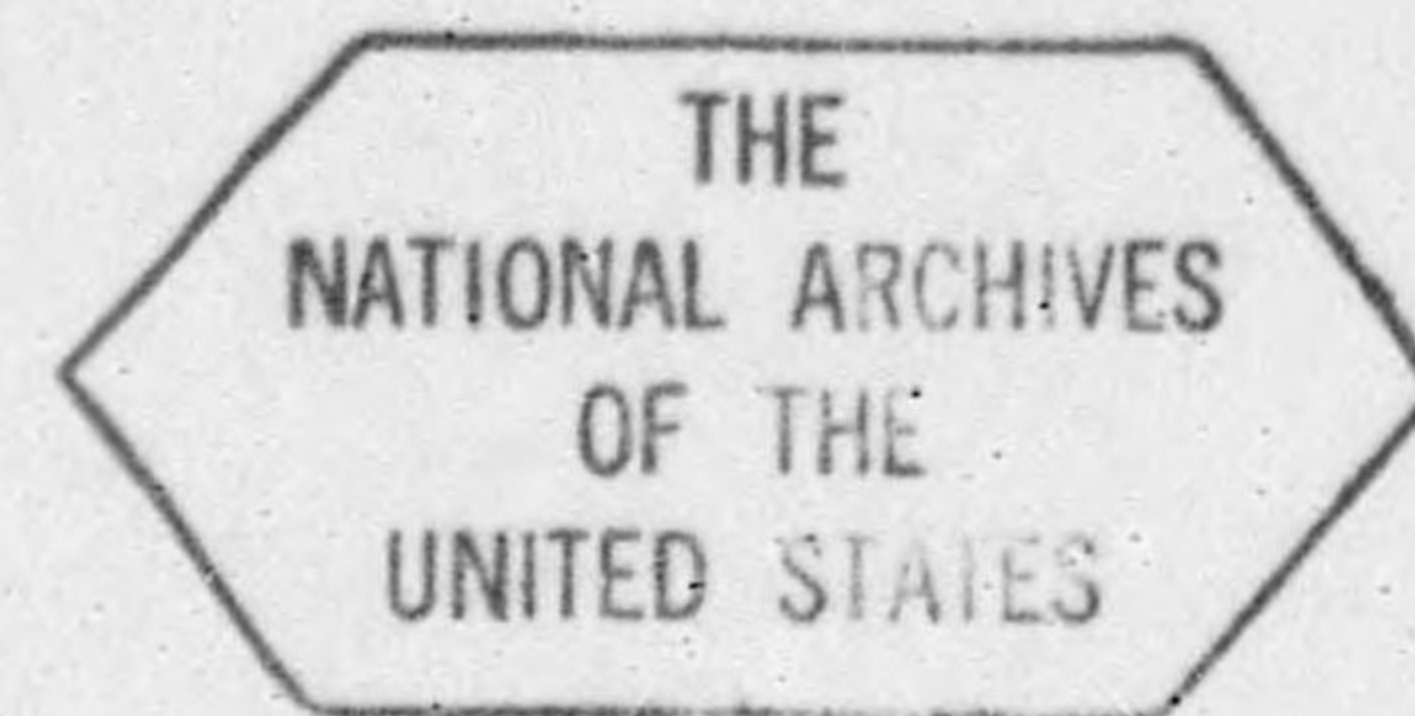

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 121 (7 Nov 49)CPC/OD, SCAPIN 2124, 28 September 1950, subject, "Release of United Nations Nationals' Funds Blocked by the Japanese Government in Korea and Transferred to Japan," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Ministry of Finance is directed to authorize payment of 94.5% of the amount listed opposite the names of the individual on the inclosed list unless such sums have already been withdrawn either in Tokyo or Korea.

3. Identification data for each individual is not too explicit but where known, the individual's affiliated agency is noted. It is possible that a recognized representative of this agency in Japan may have adequate authorization to withdraw funds on deposit for individuals formerly affiliated with that agency.

SUBJECT: Release of Notes and Coins to the Government of the
United Kingdom

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 410.2 (12 May 51) CPC/USV, SCAPIH 7439-A, 12 May 1951, subject, "Release of Invalid and Non-convertible Japanese Owned Foreign Currencies and Foreign Currency Instruments," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. Inclosed as Annex A is a list of notes and coins in currencies of the United Kingdom. These notes and coins were among those foreign currencies returned to the Japanese Government for custody under memorandum referenced in paragraph 1 above.

3. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers has received a request for return of these notes and coins from the United Kingdom Liaison Mission in Japan.

4. The Ministry of Finance, Japanese Government is therefore directed to deliver these notes and coins to the Government of the United Kingdom. Mr. Cooper Blyth, Chairman of the United Kingdom Reparations and Restitution Delegation will sign the receipt for the currencies as listed. The Ministry of Finance will contact Mr. Blyth to arrange for suitable delivery date.

5. Upon completion of this delivery to the United Kingdom Liaison Mission in Japan a report will be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

1. Reference is made to:

a. Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 091.112 (13 Sep 45)MG, SCAPIN 26, 13 September 1945, subject, "Protection of Allied and Axis Property," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers

b. Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 386.7 (13 Oct 49)CPC/PLD, SCAPIN 2051, 13 October 1949, subject, "Notification that the United States, United Kingdom and France are Owners of Certain Categories of Former German Property in Japan," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, as amended.

2. Investigation has revealed that Gumucio y Cie. of La Paz, Bolivia, has acquired all assets of the former German-owned firm of Kyllmann Bauer y Cie. also of Bolivia and therefore assets in Japan formerly belonging to Kyllmann Bauer y Cie. which were impounded with the assets of, and taken into custody from the Standard Braid and Produce Co. of Kobe, Japan do not fall within the purview of reference 1b above and are hereby released from the provisions of reference 1a above.

3. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers has received advice through diplomatic channels that Gumucio y Cie. have appointed the Standard Braid and Produce Company of Kobe to act as their agents in Japan for receiving property now in custody of the Civil Property Custodian.

4. The Ministry of Finance is directed to inform Mr. Thomas Thordean, the Managing Partner of Standard Braid and Produce Co., that upon delivery to the Office of the Civil Property Custodian of a check in the amount of One Hundred Seventeen Thousand Thirty-Four Yen and Eighty-Nine Sen (¥117,034.89) and the original letter from Gumucio y Cie. appointing them as agents, the following securities will be released to them:

1,600 shares Nihon Cement K.K.
5,100 shares Nitto Kagaku Kogyo K.K.
200 shares Nippon Chisso Hiryo K.K.

Standard Braid and Produce Co. will be furnished a complete transcript of all transactions at the time of release of these shares.

6. The Ministry of Finance is further instructed to inform officials of the issuing companies of the shares involved of the correct ownership of these shares and that all future correspondence should be directed to Gumucio y Cie in care of the Standard Braid and Produce Company, Kobe.

7. It is the desire of this office that this release be effected not later than 21 December 1951.

2. The aforementioned credit in actuality represents assets which were and are the property of the Japanese Government, not the deceased, since the property from which the proceeds derived was legally confiscated by Japanese court order on 29 September 1943.

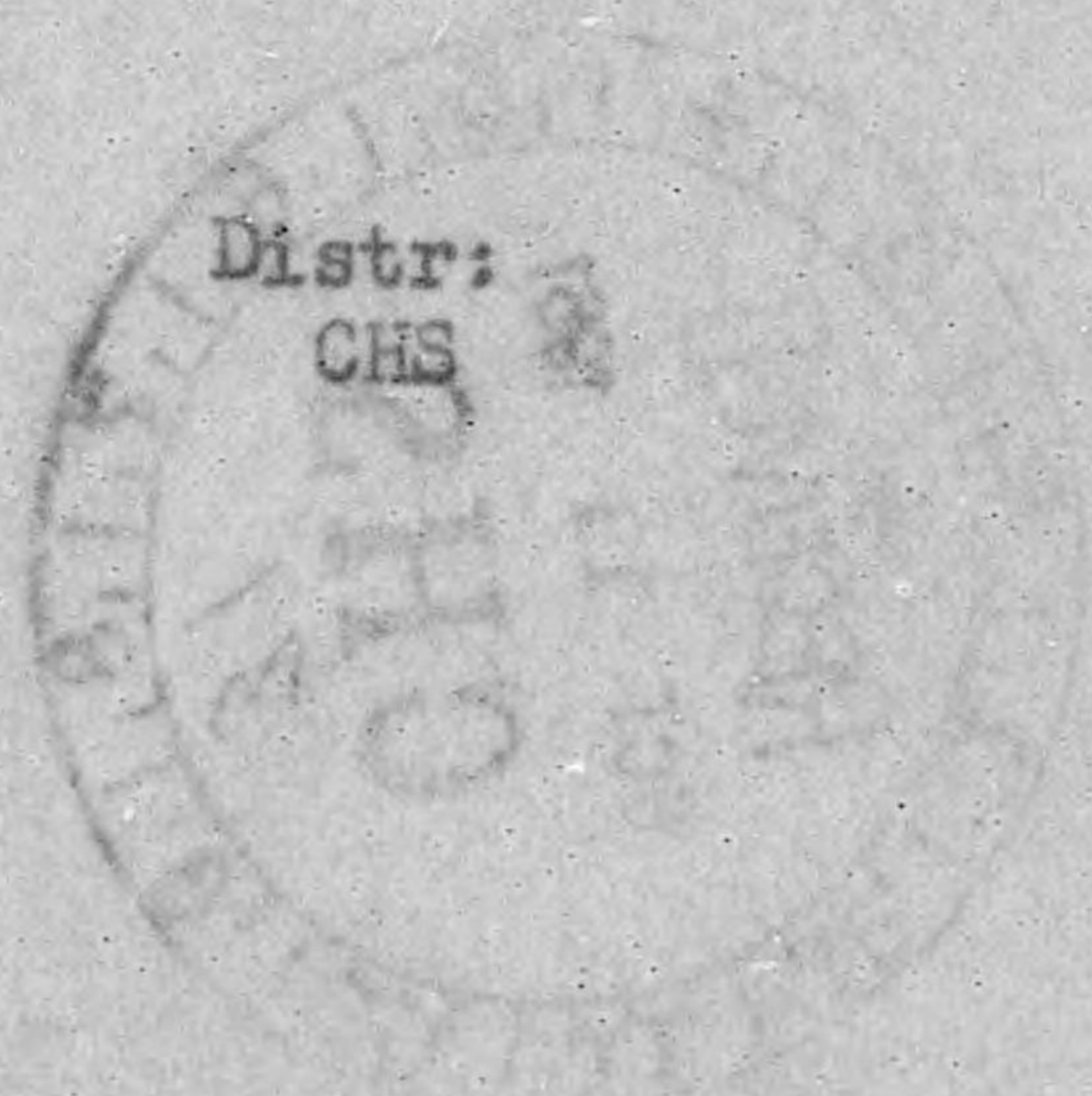
2. Application referenced in paragraph 1b above is approved.

4. Disbursement of deposited funds plus interest is to be made in accordance with the contract between the Manchuria Aviation Co. and its former employees and/or their beneficiaries.

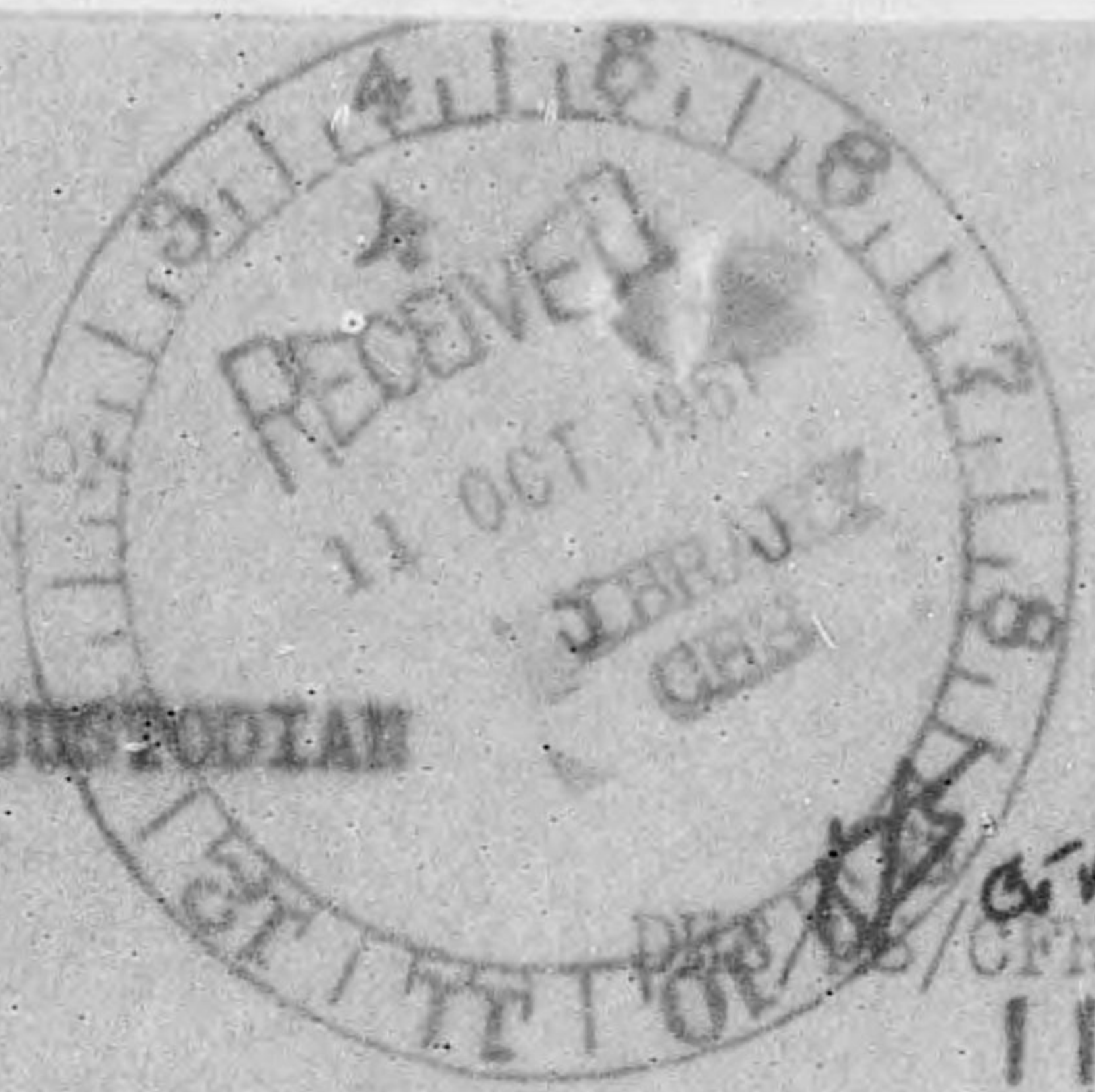

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, SCAPIN 7280-A, subject, "Radium Surrendered by Yoshio Kodama," dated 3 October 1950.

2. The Japanese Government, within fifteen (15) days of the publication of this memorandum, will receive the miscellaneous property in inclosure titled "List of Miscellaneous Property" from the Office of the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, at the United States Vaults, Bank of Japan, Tokyo.

3. Items listed after the identifying numbers 5071, 5310, 5364, 6403 and 6451 appear to be private personal property. Upon receipt, the Japanese Government will determine property rights and return items found to be private personal property to the true owners. Compensation will be made to the true owners in the event Japanese laws prohibit the release of these items from Japanese Government stocks.

4. Items listed after the identifying numbers 322, 6437, 6438 and 6759 were impounded by Japanese and Occupation authorities in various investigations of unlawful transactions in narcotics and precious metals. These items have been held in custody and are released as property of unknown ownership. Information available fails to indicate that any of the items came under the war-time ownership or control of the Japanese Government. Upon receipt, property will be retained in government stocks or disposed of under the provisions of Japanese laws.

5. Identifying numbers 6558 and 6763 refer to radium. This radium has been identified as public property and upon receipt will be used as directed in reference 1 above.

6. Items listed after the identifying numbers 342, 5088, 5393, 6708 and 7011 have been identified as containing precious metals which came under the war-time ownership or control of the Japanese Government. Upon receipt the Japanese Government will determine the precious metal contents of these items and report ascertained contents to the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, within thirty (30) days of the receipt of the property.

2. Basic memo releases from custody to JG all Japanese owned items of personal jewelry.

3. Items have been segregated from lots containing precious metals and bulk diamonds, which came under the war-time ownership or control of JG, and which were impounded as directed by JCS 1380/15. This basic occupation directive (confirmed by FRC as FRC 015, 11 Mar 1945) directed occupation authorities to block and impound "all gold, silver, platinumand all other assets" owned by JG, its agencies or instrumentalities. In actions taken to locate and impound precious metals, it was found that JG owned or controlled corporations and guilds, including Kooki Eiden and the Central Materials Utilization Assn, had accumulated sizeable stocks of bulk diamonds. As the Japanese had taken steps to conceal and distribute this national bulk diamond stock, steps were taken to place this national bulk diamond stock under occupation custody.

4. Although the destruction of records at the time of surrender prevents exact conclusions, it appears that the diamond and platinum purchasing programs included a plan under which Japanese nationals were encouraged and, at times, almost forced to donate personal ornaments and trinkets to collecting agencies (ref 1a above).

5. Although many of the more than 200 different types of property included in action may be the property of JG, it is believed that it is not proper to retain these personal jewelry items in custody as part of the war-time national precious metal and bulk diamond stockpile.

6. As noted in ref 1b above, the total value of items included in action is estimated by Japanese technicians to be \$15,653.98. This estimated value, however, is based on the items as personal ornaments. Any program to remove the stones from their settings and to melt and

The Japanese Government, within fifteen (15) days of the publication of this memorandum, will receive from the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, at the United States Vaults, Bank of Japan, Tokyo, the personal ornaments and trinkets described in inclosure titled, "List of Personal Ornaments and Trinkets."

2. Property was impounded in custody from stated sources co-mingled with nationally owned or controlled bulk stocks of precious metals and diamonds.

3. Many of the items released appear to be personal ornaments and trinkets which were owned by Japanese nationals as private personal property and which were delivered under real or imagined compulsion by these citizens to the nationally owned or controlled collections agencies during the war.

4. Upon receipt, the Japanese Government will determine whether or not any private personal property rights exist in the property. Items found to be private personal property will be returned to the true owners. Proper records as to ultimate disposition will be maintained by the Japanese Government.

5. The fact that an item was impounded from a nationally owned or controlled collection agency will not be conclusive as to its true ownership without additional supporting evidence. Records available in the Historical Records Section, Liquidation Division, Second Demobilization Bureau, and other records available to the Japanese Government, will be examined in determining ownership.

1. Basic memo releases from custody all Japanese owned lots which contain coins except:
 - a. Several items of coins in lots still under investigation
 - b. A few very large items of modern Japanese gold coins which are stored in sealed boxes.
2. Action parallels past miscellaneous property and coin releases. It provides for the realization of U.S. Dollars for coins which can be liquidated for U.S. Dollar values in excess of their precious metal content value. (For example: A U.S. silver dollar contains about \$.60 worth of silver.)
3. Several lots included in release (Nos. 5295, 5306, 5307, 5363, 5425, 6493 and 8518) appear to be private personal property. Lot 5425 contains items impounded from repatriated Japanese diplomats, their families and staffs. Memo directs JG to return all items, which are determined to be private personal property, to the true owners. It further provides that compensation will be made to the true owners in the event that certain items cannot be released from government stocks under prevailing exchange or precious metal regulations.
4. Upon receipt of reports directed by memo, values of nationally owned property released will be balanced by:
 - a. Directing transfer of U.S. Dollar credits to the Foreign Exchange Assets Account
 - b. Directing JG to deposit into custody precious metals in standard forms having values equivalent to the precious metal content values of unliquidated precious metal coins released.
5. It is estimated that \$5,000.00 in U.S. Dollars will be accumulated by the liquidation of coins having realizable foreign exchange values and that the precious metal content value of coins which cannot be liquidated will also amount to \$5,000.00.

The Japanese Government, within fifteen (15) days of the publication of this memorandum, will receive from the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, at the United States Vaults, Bank of Japan, Tokyo, the coins and miscellaneous items described in inclosure titled, "List of Coins and Miscellaneous Items."

2. Items listed after the identifying numbers 5293, 5306, 5307, 5363, 5425, 6493 and 6518 appear to be private personal property. Upon receipt, the Japanese Government will determine ownership and will return to the true owners, items found to be private personal property. Compensation will be made to the true owners if such items cannot be released from Government stocks, under prevailing exchange or precious metal regulations.

3. After segregation of items identified in paragraph 2 above, the Japanese Government will segregate coins which are convertible to United States dollars from remaining coins received. The segregated group will be liquidated immediately. A report of the United States dollar credits accruing from this liquidation will be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, on or before 1 May 1951. The Japanese Government will block and retain these dollar credits pending further instructions.

4. The Japanese Government will ascertain and report the precious metal contents of coins received, which are not segregated and treated as directed by paragraphs 2 and 3 above, using the procedures detailed below:

a. Coins will be examined by Japanese coin experts. These experts, using standard publications where available, will estimate and report the precious metal contents of coins segregated as collector's items. Generally, this group will include coins:

- (1) Minted prior to the memory of living persons
- (2) Which have readily realizable values as numismatic items substantially in excess of their face values

(3) Selected as rarities, or for some other material reason.

b. All remaining coins will be examined by Japanese technicians who will estimate and report total precious metal contents, using standard publications where available.

5. A report will be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of the computed precious metal contents of the coins, ascertained as directed in paragraph 4 above, within thirty (30) days of the receipt of the property. Upon receipt of this report, the Japanese Government will be directed to deposit into custody precious metals in standard forms:

a. Equal in weight or value to the computed and reported precious metal fine gram contents of the collector's items segregated under the procedures cited in paragraph 4a above.

b. Equal to 99.75% of the computed and reported precious metal fine gram contents of the class described in paragraph 4b above.

6. Invalid currencies and base metal coins not disposed of under the procedures cited in paragraphs 2 and 3 above, and other miscellaneous items, are released to the Japanese Government as Japanese property, and will be retained by the Japanese Government or disposed of according to pertinent Japanese laws and regulations.

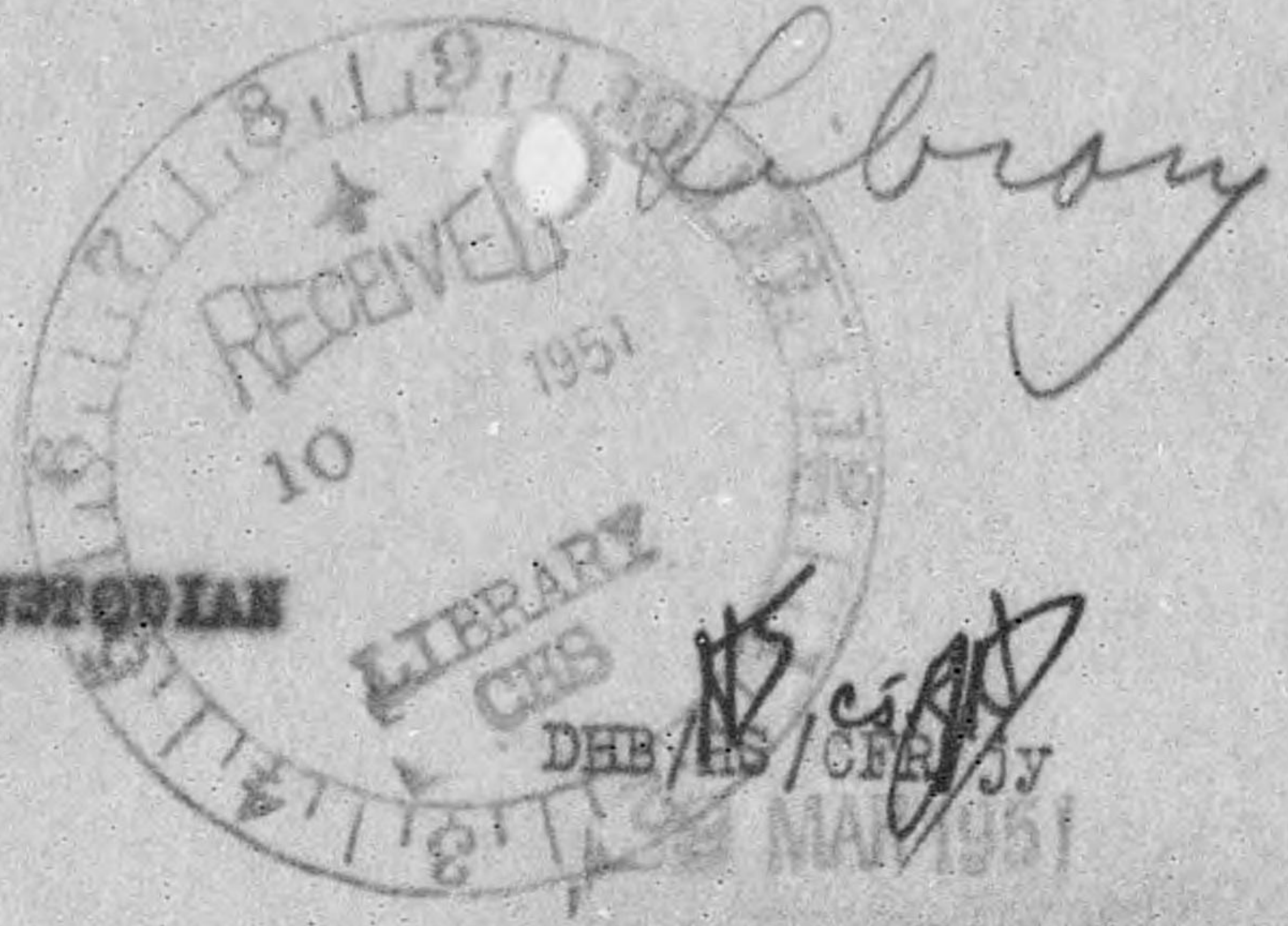

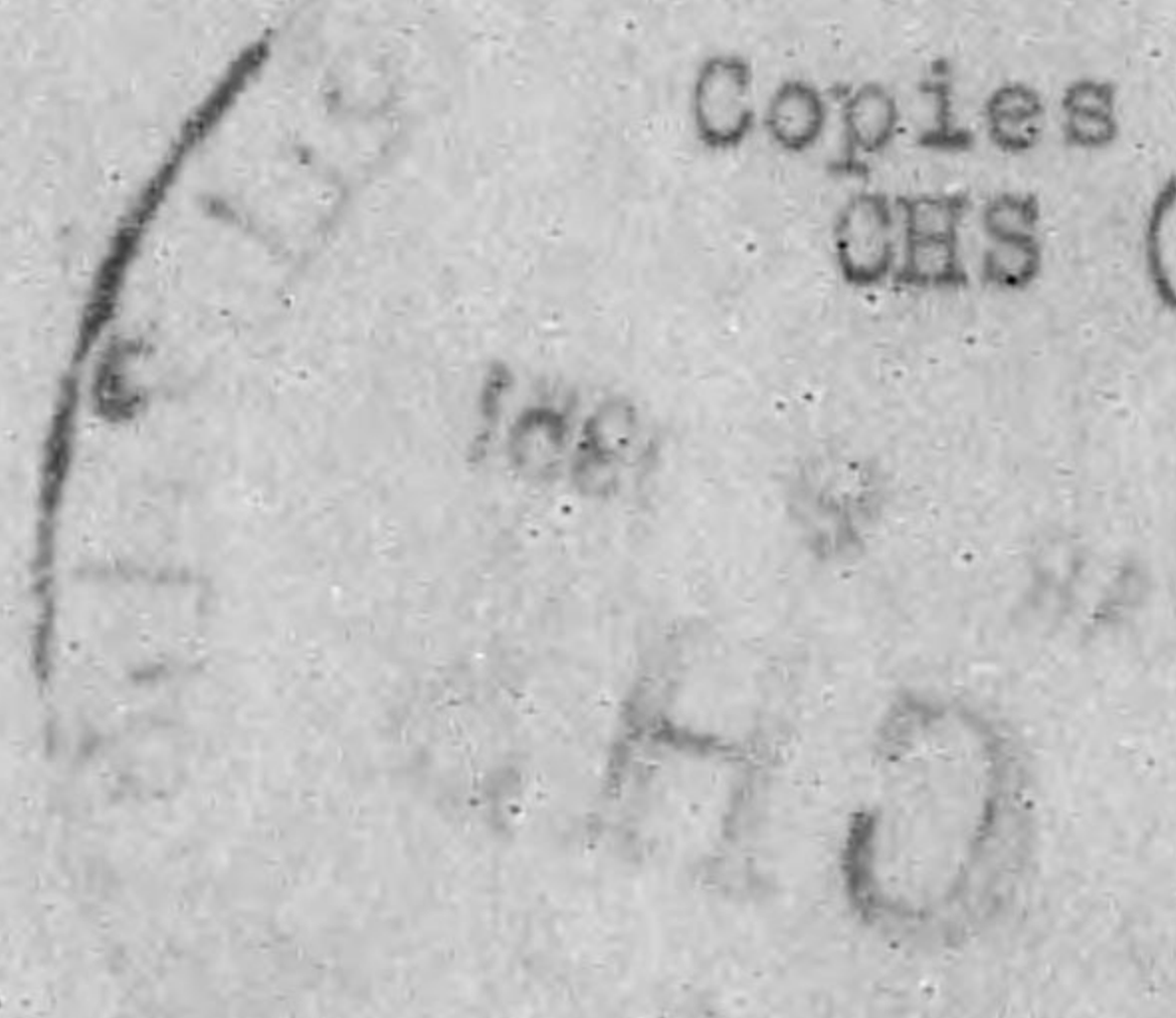

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Release of Coins and Miscellaneous Items from Custody

1. The Japanese Government, within fifteen (15) days of the publication of this memorandum, will receive from the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, at the United States Vaults, Bank of Japan, Tokyo, the coins and miscellaneous items described in inclosure titled, "List of Coins and Miscellaneous Items."

2. Upon receipt, the Japanese Government will ascertain and report the precious metal contents of coins and items received using the procedures detailed below:

a. Gold coins and articles, of the types and in the quantities corresponding to those purchased by the Bank of Japan under repurchase agreement, which have not been released from custody to the Japanese Government by past actions, will be segregated to represent undelivered repurchase agreement coins and articles. Fine gram precious metal contents, as computed at the time of purchase by the Bank of Japan, will be reported as the contents of this segregated group

b. Coins not segregated to make up the group described in paragraph 2a above, will be examined by Japanese coin experts. These experts, using standard publications where available, will estimate and report the precious metal contents of coins segregated as collector's items. Generally, this group will include coins:

- (1) Minted prior to the memory of living persons
- (2) Which have a readily realizable value as numismatic items substantially in excess of their face values
- (3) Selected as rarities, or for some other material reason

c. All other coins, not included in the classes described in paragraphs 2a and 2b above, will be examined by Japanese technicians who will estimate and report total precious metal contents, using standard publications where available

d. Precious metal contents of miscellaneous items released, not covered by procedures detailed above, will be estimated and reported:

- (1) Based on standard assay methods in the event the items are melted
- (2) Based on estimates of Japanese technicians in other instances


e. No report of precious metal contents will be required for items which are washed or plated with precious metals, or for non-precious metal items which have small precious metal parts or units.

3. A report will be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of the computed precious metal contents of the property released, ascertained as directed by paragraph 2 above, within sixty (60) days of the receipt of the property. Upon receipt of this report, the Japanese Government will be directed to deposit into custody precious metals in standard forms:

a. Equal in weight or value to the computed and reported precious metal fine gram content of the classes described in paragraphs 2a and 2b above, and

b. Equal to 99.75% of the computed and reported precious metal fine gram contents of the classes described in paragraphs 2c and 2d above.
