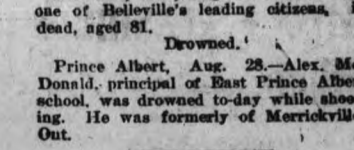

THE GAME.

To the Editor:—I have noticed in several of your issues during the past season a number of letters regarding the game law, I read them, and thought over them, but had no opportunity to intrude further. We have to thank our agricultural representative, Mr. Hayward, for the act passed prohibiting hunting over enclosed lands. This still remains game and sporting sufficient for both town and country folks, there being thousands of acres of good sporting land in general.

There is one other matter which I should like to bring before the eyes of the sportsman, and that is the way in which the game of the country is being destroyed by dogs being allowed to roam around during the laying season. It is just two years ago since I lost nine hens that were setting in the bush. The animal ate eggs, and hens also chewed through pickets, which a cook would never do. The fender may say that the bush is no place for a hen to nest, and I must admit that that is the place, and only place, for a pheasant, grouse, or quail to nest, and if a dog will eat an old hen and her eggs, he would not eat a bit of game.

What about the crows? I cannot say, but the pheasant I know too well from former experience is a bird that once disturbed from the nest by a dog he will never return. There must be many a hundred pheasants destroyed around the Island in that way alone. This year I am thankful to be able to admit I have come across almost as many nests safely hatched as were destroyed last year, all owing to the death of the running dogs.

I hope the next law to be passed for the protection of the game will be to enforce people to keep their dogs tied up during the laying season. If it was not for the thick bush which hides the bird from the hunter and with the poor protection there would be but few pheasants on the Island.

I am of an opinion that if the city sportsmen will only show the rancher all possible consideration this will make him their best game preserver, and a kindly host to any stranger who is courteous to him. H. T. OLDFIELD, Lake District.

There are two new school districts. Boundaries Defined in This Week's Issue of the Official Organ.

More openings for teachers. Two new school districts have been created, and all are on the Island. They are Crofton and Minto.

The boundary of the Crofton district, according to last night's Official Gazette, has been defined as follows: Commencing at the northeast corner of section 2, range 10, Chemalun district, being a point on the seashore; thence due west to the northwest corner of section 2, range 9, of said district; thence due south, following the range line to the southwest corner of section 18, range 1, Comolien district; thence due east to the southeast corner of section 18, range 1, of said district; thence northerly and westerly, following the shore line to the point of commencement.

The following are the boundaries of the Minto district: Commencing at the northeast corner of lot 23, Comox district, being a point on the seashore; thence westerly, following the boundary line of lots 22, 153 and 152, to the northwest corner of lot 152, of said district; thence south to the southern boundary line of township 11, Nelson district; thence east along said boundary line to the seashore; thence northerly and westerly along the shore line to the point of commencement.

The owners of four dairies, one at Steveston and three on Lulu Island, have refused the usual certificates under provisions of the "Contagious Diseases (Animal) Act," owing to "dirty byres."
