HOW DO YOU SUPPORT YOUR COMMUNITIES?

How do you support your communities?

- Small grants (e.g. for library fees)
- Travel grants
- Meeting places / rooms
- Software & literature access (media)
- Merchandise
- Insurance
- Mentoring program for newcomers
- Help with help pages

- Group dynamics
- Advice concerning legal questions
- Trainings / webinars
- Help with help pages
- Coordination / organizational support in general
- Edit-a-thons / events (often including food / catering + accommodation)

Local meetings (organized by chapter) Photo and writing competitions (including getting prizes from volunteers or organizations / museums)

- Group dynamics
- Support with PR
- Support with requests to officials / official contracts etc.

WHAT WOULD HAPPEN WITHOUT THIS SUPPORT?

What would happen without this support?

- Without travel grants → less people would be able to attend meetings, less ideas and learnings would be exchanged there, volunteers might contribute less because they are less motivated or don't feel appreciated
- Without small grants (e.g. for library fees or literature) → people would not write about certain topics they don't have literature for, the quality of the content of Wikipedia might suffer
- Without coordination / organizational support → volunteers might not initiate big projects when feeling they are "on their own", contact to institutions would be made more difficult
 - Without support with PR → there would be less press coverage and thus less awareness of Wikimedia projects
- Without legal support → volunteers might feel left alone and leave projects when encountering problems

- Without insurance for meetups → volunteer organizers might be afraid of being held liable for accidents, they might refrain from organizing meet-ups
- Without support for photo and writing competitions or technical equipment → people would probably contribute content anyway, but the quality might be less good and people might be less motivated

In general: without volunteer support in the Wikimedia movement, volunteers would probably still contribute, but their possibilities would in many cases be more limited. One central aspect of volunteer support seems to be its effect on a volunteer's motivation, so that a lack of support would probably have a negative impact on the motivation to keep contributing to Wikimedia projects. *Note: These examples were named by the participants during the workshop.*

Why is motivation so important?

Motivation is crucial for volunteer RETENTION

What is motivation?

Motivation is the totality of motives and influences which impact a decision or action.

In other words:

Motivation = motives + motivating situation




Intrinsic (from Within) Extrinsic (from the outside)

"motivating kills motivation" (the overjustification effect)

What influences motivation?

Motivation = motives + motivating situation

In order to have a positive effect on motivation, it is necessary to positively shape the motivating situation.
