Why this presentation?



2018 Olympic Winter Games

- End of 2017
 - idea to ask for an accreditation for the Olympic Winter Games 2018
 - request at the IOC
 - rejection because way too late
- no Wikimedia photographers





2018 Winter Paralympics



PARALYMPIC GAMES

→ as we learnt later, a larger international group of Wikimedia users got accreditations



- → for logistical reasons no realization of the project
 - ◆ visa
 - international coordination
 - **♦** ...

Youth Olympic Games

- → found on IOC pages by accident
- → first idea to gain experiences with this lesser-known YOG

- → 1998 first idea of Youth Olympic Games, first YOG 2010 in Singapore (Summer Games), 2012 in Innsbruck (Winter Games, one German photographer)
- → only athletes of the ages 14 to 18



2018 Summer Youth Olympic Games in Buenos Aires

- → 3rd edition of Summer Youth Olympic Games
- → 15 days
- → ~ 200 nationals
- → ~ 4'000 athletes
- → 241 competitions in 32 sports (**not** all of them also with seniors)
- → first timers: some sports, gender equality, opening ceremony not in a stadium



Challenge 1:

Should we look for a team when we don't even know whether accreditations are possible?



request for accreditations

- → several requests to the local organizers (BAYOGOC) for an open number of international volunteers before we were directed to the IOC
- → several requests to the IOC before we were directed to their official accreditation plattform where only individuals could apply
- → we (as part of Wikimedia Deutschland) got our accreditations on 21 April 2018



We are happy to confirm that your accreditation request to cover the 3rd Summer Youth Olympic Games in Buenos Aires, Argentina, has been accepted.

Your Youth Olympic Accreditation Card (YOAC) will allow you to cover the following events:

- IOC Executive Board meeting 3 and 4 October 2018
- Olympism in Action Forum 5 and 6 October 2018
- IOC Session 8 and 9 October 2018
- 3rd Summer Youth Olympic Games 6 to 18 October 2018

The Buenos Aires Youth Olympic Games Organising Committee (BAYOGOC) Accreditation Section will send the YOAC to all successfully accredited international media directly by 31 July 2018. The YOAC will serve as an entry visa for Argentina. We kindly refer you to the Entry Visa Guide, please click here to download it.

challenges ahead

- → a lot of communications with BAYOGOC
 - portrait photos for accreditation cards
 - further information from passports, hotels,
 etc. required
 - previous visits to Argentina
 - **♦** ...
- → all messages were URGENT and sent two days before the deadline → a lot of support by WMDE
- → **but**: no approved budget by WMDE nor other volunteers

The digital photograph must meet the following general requirements:

- The person must be easily identifiable in the photograph
- The photo should be recent (taken within the last six months) and be an accurate likeness of the applicant
- · The facial expression must be neutral, mouth closed
- The eyes must be open and clearly visible
- The face must take up 70 to 80 per cent of the photo
- Face and shoulders must be centred in the photo and squared to the camera
- The photograph must show a full front view of the head with both edges of the face clear
- · The photograph must not show shadows or flash reflections on the face and head
- Glasses are not allowed
- Hats and head coverings are allowed for medical or religious reasons only if the facial features are fully and clearly visible
- · The photograph must be in colour
- · The background of the photograph must be plain white
- All images must be submitted in digital format (JPG or JPEG)
- . The photo must have a file size of between 50kb and 300kb
- The dimensions of the photo must be 4 cm of width per 5 cm of height
- The recommended resolution must be of approximately 300 DPI

Photographs that do not meet the above BAYOGOC Accreditation requirements will be rejected by BAYOGOC Accreditation.


Should we ask local Wikipedians, Commons photographers, or Chapters for support?

Reaching out to Argentina

- \rightarrow too close to the event to involve the global community \rightarrow focus on local community
- → DerHexer used private contact to former WMAR chair → connection to local chapter
- → request to Wikimedia Argentina whether there are local users who are interested in joining us to take photos of the event
 - they were aware of the event + some of their volunteers wanted to help on site
 - since they haven't had a focus on photography yet, they haven't thought photo accreditations
 - ◆ 3 volunteers were interested, asked for accreditations for Wikimedia Argentina and were approved

arrangements

- → arrangements with Wikimedia Argentina
 - ◆ Argentinian participants haven't had much experience with sports photography → idea: tandem photography
 - ◆ capacity building about sports photography for the local community desired →
 idea: organizing a workshop with local community
 - preparations of equipment, schedules, workshop, etc. with Argentinians
 - organisation of required local equipment (collapsible chairs, additional cameras for Argentinian volunteers, etc.)
- → Wikimedia Argentina initiated an edit-a-thon on the 2018 Summer YOG in Spanish Wikipedia

- → Project Grants
 - ♦ minimum budget of USD 2,000
 - two limited periods for applications
 - January → too early
 - November \rightarrow after the conference
- → Rapid Grants
 - ♦ maximum budget of USD 2,000
 - could only cover a nuance of the project costs
- → WMF support not useful for the project at this time → support by local chapters necessary

- → Grant request as part of the project support
 - travel costs (flights, hotel, per diems)
 - equipment and transportation costs
 - ♦ ca. 12'550 Euro requested
- → technical equipment from the German + Austrian collection, including back-up external HDDs
- → long discussions with Wikimedia Deutschland about the usefulness of such multinational projects
- → support letter by Wikimedia Argentina
- → final approval by 5 July 2019 (> 1.5 months after accreditation approval)

- → coordination and arrangements with Argentinian volunteers
- → logistical support
- → provision of a camera for the photo project → rest covered by private and German/Austrian equipment
- → organisation and support of the workshop
 - ◆ rooms
 - catering
 - translation of slides
 - interpreting at the workshop



Schedule

- → 1 October: flights from germany
- → 2 October 2018: picking up accreditations, orientation in the city
- → 3-5 October 2018
 - meeting each other
 - getting to know the venues and transportation
 - preparing and sharing cameras
 - schedules for the next days, esp. opening ceremony
 - taking photos of trainings
 - eating the worst Steak Milanesa of everyone's lifes

- → 18 October 2018
 - ♦ last finals
 - closing ceremony
- → 19 October 2018
 - "free" day: last workshop preparations with Argentinians, visit of the city of Buenos Aires
- → 20 October 2018
 - photo workshop with Argentinians at WMAR's
 - preparations for the return travel
- → 21 October 2018
 - ◆ short visit of the main place, second time robbed
 - return travel (until late 22 October)






Goals for Wikimedia Argentina

- Since there was no WikiLovesTheOlympics, we organized a contest to create and improve articles related to the YOG in eswiki, and get an instant use of our images.
- 12 participants, 919 edits.
- 300 articles created, every country covered, most of the sports and relevant athletes.
- After the games ended, we organized a Sports photography workshop, with participation of new members.








