"Mr. Hamilton, Chairman, (United States): I might recall that in the Committees the first statement was somewhat broader than that made; it was to the effect that these categories were g enerally the same. It had been pointed out that the political systems in force—the setup in Germany and the setup in Japan—are not completely parallel.

"Mr. Kirpalani (India): I think that if we could take it that generally and in spirit they are not broader, that would satisfy the

"Mr. Graves (United Kingdom:): In an earlier edition of the paper, in C 6-371/14, in the relevant para, there was an additional sub para which read:

"SCAP should ensure that the prison regime applicable to United Nations conforms to Humanitarian principles and that, from the point of view of religion, hygiene, and nutrition, the regime is adapted to the customs and needs of the person detained."

"That sub para, Mr Chairman, is not in the present paper. But it would be our wish and we hope that it might also be the desire of the other members of the Commission that SCAP's attn should be drawn to that and that those broad provisions which I just read out should be regarded
