Re Tokyo's 1519, Feb 7, 1951, question raised by USSR only as set forth in W 95707, Nov 2, 1950 and W 97796, Dec 1, 1950. Note also SCAP's C 68253, Nov 4, 1950. Attention is called to fact that while US has denied use of Japanese Mil personnel by US in mil actions in Korea, no statement has been made re use of Japanese in auxiliary capacity. So far as estab Natl Police Reserve is concerned, Dept has only SCAP's ltr to Prime Minister to reply upon for counter-action purposes despite statements by Jap officials concerned and discussion US press and elsewhere suggesting para-mil organization and tng.

Tokyo's C 60088, Aug 15 and Tokyo's 1002, Nov 14. Re use Jap munitions plants for production articles required in Korean campaign, Dep prepared to reply along lines of W 90738, Sep 6, 1950. With respect to any charge that SCAP is making avail to UN forces any occupation facilities, US has be prepared to state that forces in question are UN forces and SCAP as supreme commander, of course, cooperating with UN in its attempt to repel aggression in Korea and that US believes such action entirely justified.

In connection with foregoing your attention is also called to Mr McDermott's statement contained in wireless bulletin, Dec 14, 1950.

Part 2. A previously rptd in CG RYCOM Msg R 16611, 1 Dec 50 Ryukyuan ves oprs have been warned to keep out of territorial waters of trust territory. Whenever there is definite proof of such violation vigorous action will be taken.

Part 3. Investigation re activities of 2 ves previously rptd as violators not yet completed. CINCPAC Msg Z 24784, 10 Nov 50 rptd the ves marked MG 82 was not offender. Later HICOMTERPACIS Msg 160330 Z identified vess as MF 82 registered in Miyako. CIVAD team Miyako has been instructed to conduct investigation and submit rpt.

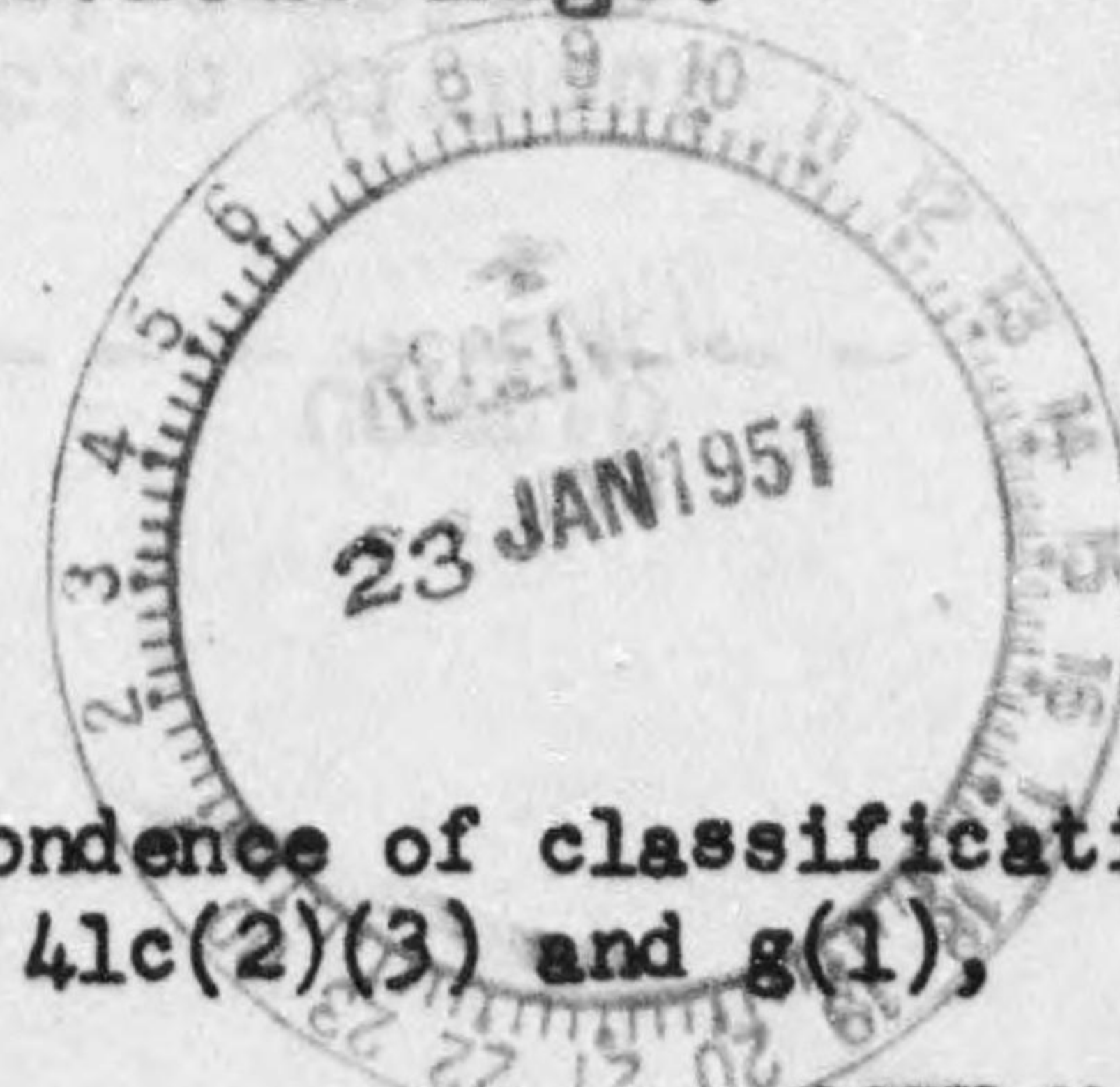
Part 4. Other ves identified as Okinawa Registry OF 605. Capt soutly denied entering trust territorial waters, taking trochus shell there or having any intercourse with other ves. Claimed he passed aprx 4 miles off Palau 27 Oct 50 on way back from Mapia believed to be outside of trust territory. Stated he saw another unidentified ves aprx 2 miles off starboard while passing Palau. CINCPAC Msg Z 24784 merely stated CIVAD Palau rptd MG 605 sighted but not boarded and HICOMTERPACIS Msg 160330 Z contained nothing conclusive in ref the OF 605 only rptg a suspicion that this ves might be rendezvousing nightly with other ves. Final action in case of OF 605 has been held up pending receipt of investigation rpt on the MF 82 to check statements made by pers of OF 605.

Part 5. CINCPAC Msg CX 53041, 9 Jan 51 states HICOMTERPACIS now rpts pers from OF 605 involved in acts of vandalism on Ngulu Islands. No such allegations contained in any previous msgs.

A. The head of the mission charged with the protection of his interests should be informed immediately.

B. The United Nations National concerned should be made aware immediately of his right to inform the mission charged with the protection of his interests of his circumstances and should be given the facilities to communicate with that mission. Any such communication should be forwarded without delay.

C. A representative of the mission charged with the protection of his interests should be permitted to visit without delay, to converse privately with, and to arrange legal representation for, the United Nations National concerned.

"5. Where a United Nations National has been convicted and is serving a sentence of imprisonment, a representative of the mission charged with the protection of his interests should, without limit to the nbr of visits, have the right to visit him in prison upon giving notice, that need not exceed 24 hrs, to the appropriate authority, and to converse with him privately. The representative should also be allowed, subject to the prison regulations, to transmit communications between the prisoner and other persons.

"6.

A. Any sentence imposed by a Japanese Court on a United Nations National should be brought immediately to the attn of the head of the mission charged with the protection of the interests of the United Nations National concerned.

B. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers should undertake the review of any capital or life sentence imposed by a Japanese Court with respect to a United Nations National.

C. SCAP may, on his own authority or upon the request of the head of the mission charged with the protection of the interests of the United Nations National concerned, review any other decision of a Japanese Court with respect to a United Nations National and take further action in respect thereto. SCAP should consult regarding any particular case with the head of the mission charged with the protection of the interests of the United Nations National concerned if so requested by the head of the mission.

"7. The Supreme Commander should take such steps as he deems necessary to ensure that the right of United Nations Nationals subject to Japanese jurisdiction are protected.

"8. The term, "United Nations Nationals", as used in this document includes, wherever applicable, organizations and corporations of present or future members of the United Nations as well as natural persons.

"9. This policy decision shall supersede the Far Eastern Commission Policy Decision of 15 Aug 1946.

"In approving the foregoing directive, certain mbrs of the Commission made statements which they requested be sent to you. These remarks are contained in the excerpts from Verbatim Transcript of 200th Mtg of FEC on 21 Sep 1950 quoted below:

EXERCISE OF CRIMINAL AND CIVIL

"Dr Lee (China): I wish to avail myself of this opportunity to recall the fact that the meeting of the Steering Committee held on Tuesday last, the Chinese representative called attn to the nbr of cases that may still be pending before the occupation courts on the date of the coming into force of this policy decision. The point was raised as to whether these cases should be handed over to the Japanese Courts. Opinion was expressed by 2 or 3 members of the committee--and 3 was no dissension from it--that it would be both unwise and impracticable to effect such a transfer. Now my delegation would like to record the understanding that substantive cases of such a category should continue to be handled by the occupation courts until they are disposed of. (\*\*\*\*)

"Mr Chairman, India is in support of the paper with the following understandings:

"1. The understanding is that the excepted categories in this paragraph should not be broader than similar excepted categories in Law No 13 for Germany.

"7. The understanding is that the term "Rights" will mean only the rights of United Nations Nationals contained in the paper and not extraterritorial rights.

"Mr. Hamilton, Chairman, (United States): I might recall that in the Committees the first statement was somewhat broader than that made; it was to the effect that these categories were generally the same. It had been pointed out that the political systems in force--the setup in Germany and the setup in Japan--are not completely parallel.

"Mr. Kirpalani (India): I think that if we could take it that generally and in spirit they are not broader, that would satisfy the requirement. (\*\*\*\*)

"Mr. Graves (United Kingdom): In an earlier edition of the paper, in C 6-371/14, in the relevant para, there was an additional sub para which read:

"SCAP should ensure that the prison regime applicable to United Nations conforms to Humanitarian principles and that, from the point of view of religion, hygiene, and nutrition, the regime is adapted to the customs and needs of the person detained."

"That sub para, Mr Chairman, is not in the present paper. But it would be our wish and we hope that it might also be the desire of the other members of the Commission that SCAP's attn should be drawn to that and that those broad provisions which I just read out should be regarded

as necessary performance of the sub paras 6 A, B, C. We should therefore like that point of view to be put forward, not as part of the paper but as remarks accompanying the policy decision if and when it gets to SCAP. And if those remarks are endorsed by colleagues on the Commission so much the better. Those are the only remarks we have to make on the paper and if it comes to a vote I shall vote in favor of it.

"Mr Millet (France): Mr Chairman, I wish to associate myself and my delegation with the remarks just made by the UK delegate.

"Mr. Reuchlin (Netherlands): I too, Mr. Chairman.

"Mr. McNicol (Australia): The same here, Mr Chairman.

"Mr. Dunlop (New Zealand): I, also, Mr. Chairman."

PEC has agreed to release to press the policy decision upon which the foregoing directive is based. Unless you advise to contrary release will be at 1700 Z 3 Oct. This msg declassified concomitantly.
