Subject: Delay in Assignment of Enlisted Men

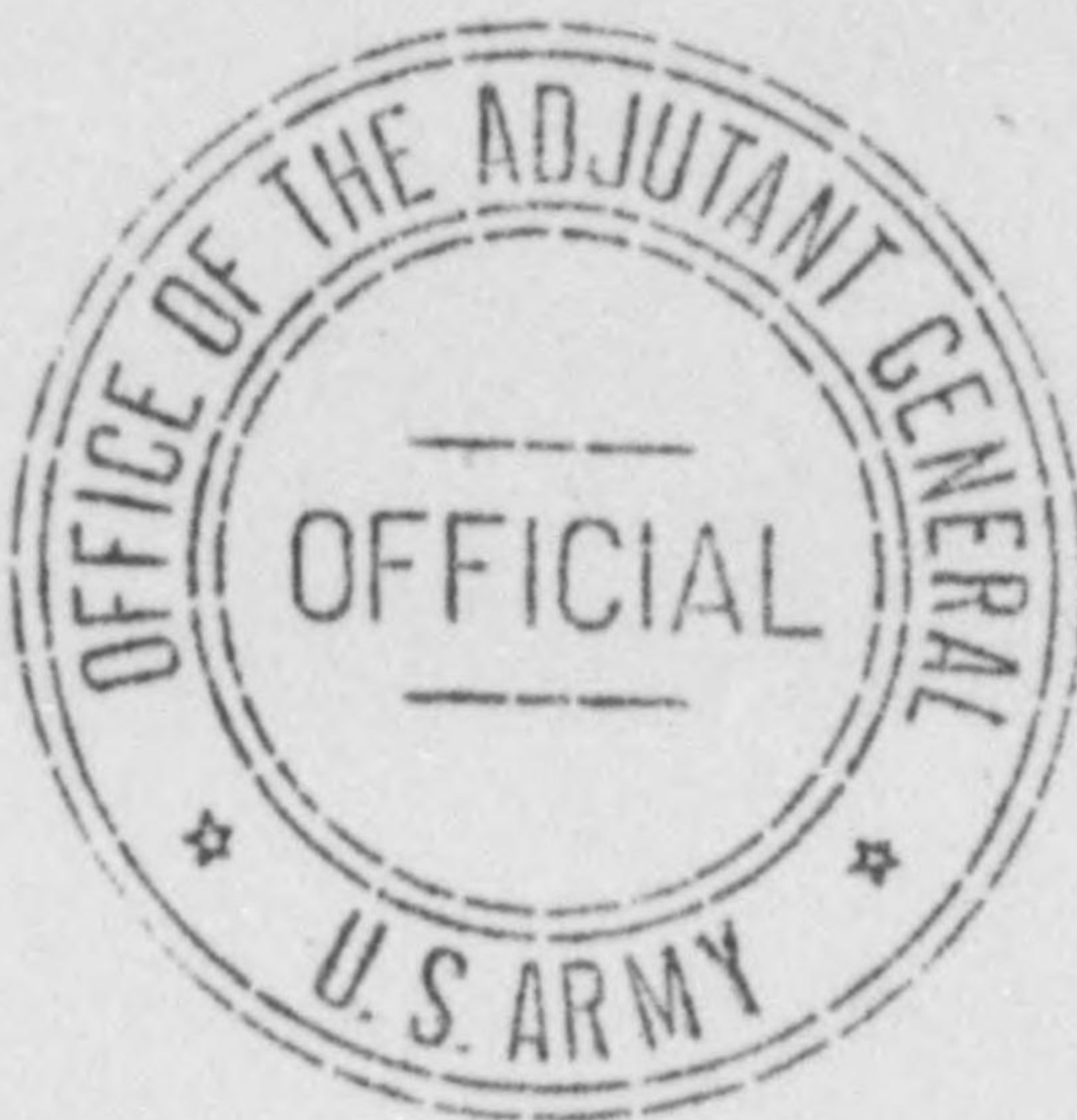

1. It has come to the attention of the Department of the Army that considerable delay has occurred in the assignment of enlisted men to Divisions in oversea theaters for which they enlisted. Commanders listed above will have records of enlisted personnel under their jurisdiction reviewed to determine if personnel who enlisted for specific divisions in overseas assignments and who have not signed waivers are misassigned. All such misassigned personnel will be reported as immediately available personnel to The Adjutant General, Attention: AGPA-A, for assignment instructions. Report will be by number, MOS, Race, and theater for which enlisted. This review will be accomplished not later than 28 September 1948.

2. Commanders of Training Divisions will maintain a continual check to insure that personnel who have enlisted for a specific divisions in an overseas theater and have not waiver their choice are assigned without delay.

1. Requisitions submitted under the provisions of Circular 237, WD, 29 August 1947, for enlisted replacements, have not accurately reflected the requirement of the command concerned by SSN and particularly by grade within SSN. Thus there is no apparent relationship between the requisitions submitted for replacements and the shortages indicated by the retainable status of the command as reflected by the Inventory and Projection of Army Strength (RCS CSGPA-45). The monitoring of subsequent requisitions will avoid the indicated discrepancies that have appeared in past requisitions.

2. To insure equitable Army-wide allocation and assignment of enlisted replacements by SSN and grades, effective 1 August 1948, and until the publication of the revision of Circular 237, WD, 1947, the following amended requisitioning procedures pertaining to Department of the Army Administrative Area enlisted replacements will be adhered to by Zone of Interior commands.

a. A requisition, in triplicate, will be submitted to The Adjutant General (Attn: AGPA-A) by action addressees authorized to requisition on the Department of the Army Administrative Area for enlisted replacements under the provisions of Circular 237, WD, 1947, to arrive not later than the 15th day of each month, which will reflect properly monitored actual requirements for enlisted replacements during the next calendar month. The consolidated requisition submitted to reach The Adjutant General on 15 September 1948 for replacements to be assigned in October 1948 will reflect in total and by SSN and grade the same shortages indicated in the latest available Inventory and Projection of Army Strength (Reports Control Symbol (CSGPA-45) as amended by known or anticipated gains or losses for the period ending 31 October 1948. Requisitions submitted to reach The Adjutant General on the 15th of subsequent months will also reflect shortages shown on the latest available Inventory and Projection of Army Strength (Reports Control Symbol CSGPA-25), as amended by known or anticipated gains or losses.

b. Special or emergency requisitions submitted to the Department of the Army Administrative Area will not be given consideration except in two specific instances:

- (1) When an individual or individuals are ordered from the command by the Department of the Army without replacements being furnished. In submitting a special requisition in this case, the Department of the Army order must be stated, and reference made to this letter.

(2) In emergencies occasioned by the loss of personnel for whom immediate replacements are necessary. Such emergency will be explained.

c. Requisitions may indicate priority for units only within the jurisdiction of the requisitioning agency. Priority for SSN's may be indicated by statement entered in "remark" Section of form.

d. All requisitions for enlisted personnel submitted will be properly numbered and dated by the requisitioning command for record and administrative purposes. The date appearing on any requisition will be the date on which it is forwarded. Each monthly consolidated requisition will be numbered (1); any emergency requisition submitted thereafter, during the month, will be numbered consecutively beginning with the number (2). Each arabic number will be preceded by a letter of the alphabet to denote the months of transmittal beginning with the letter A in January and ending with L in December.

Example: Date of requisition: 10 August 1948
 Number of requisition: H-1

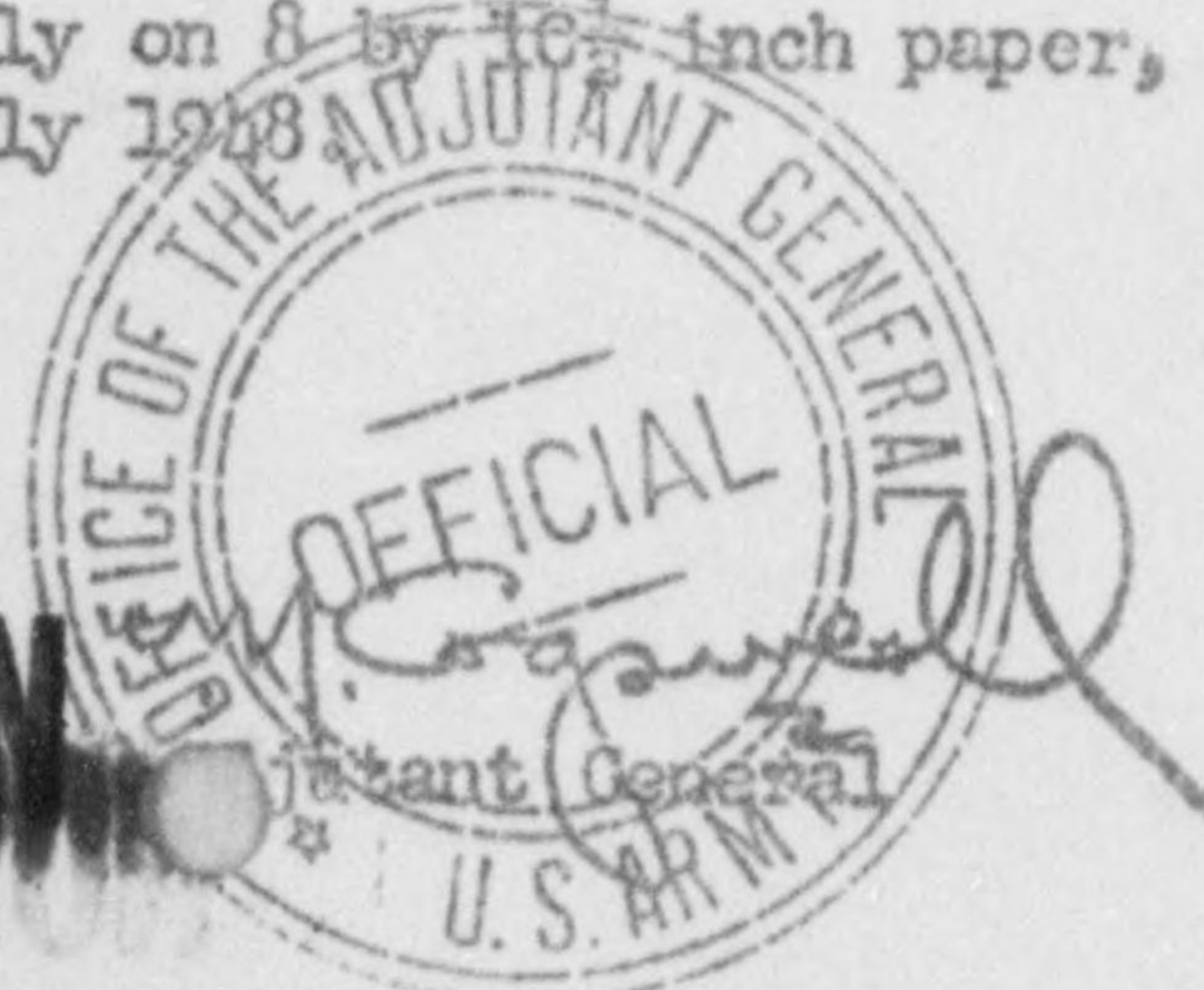
e. The number of the requisition against which enlisted personnel are assigned will be included as a reference in all transfer directives or special orders in order that proper accounting may be made by the receiving command.

f. The Department of the Army Administrative Area will notify the requisitioning agency of the Department of the Army's approval of replacement allocation against requisitions received. This notification will preclude the overlapping of requisitions and will enable the requisitioning agency to requisition with full knowledge of estimated replacements to be assigned against current requisitions. This notification will provide the estimated number of replacements by race, and announce the allocation of school trained replacements by SSN.

g. Assignments will begin on or about the 1st of the month subsequent to that in which requisitions are received by the Department of the Army and will terminate on the last day of the same month at which time the next allocation against the next requisitions will become effective. For example: Assignment of replacements during the period 1-31 October will be against requisitions submitted on 15 September 1948.

h. Authority is granted to duplicate locally on 8 by 10 1/2 inch paper, the approved requisition form DA AGO Form R-5443 July 1948.

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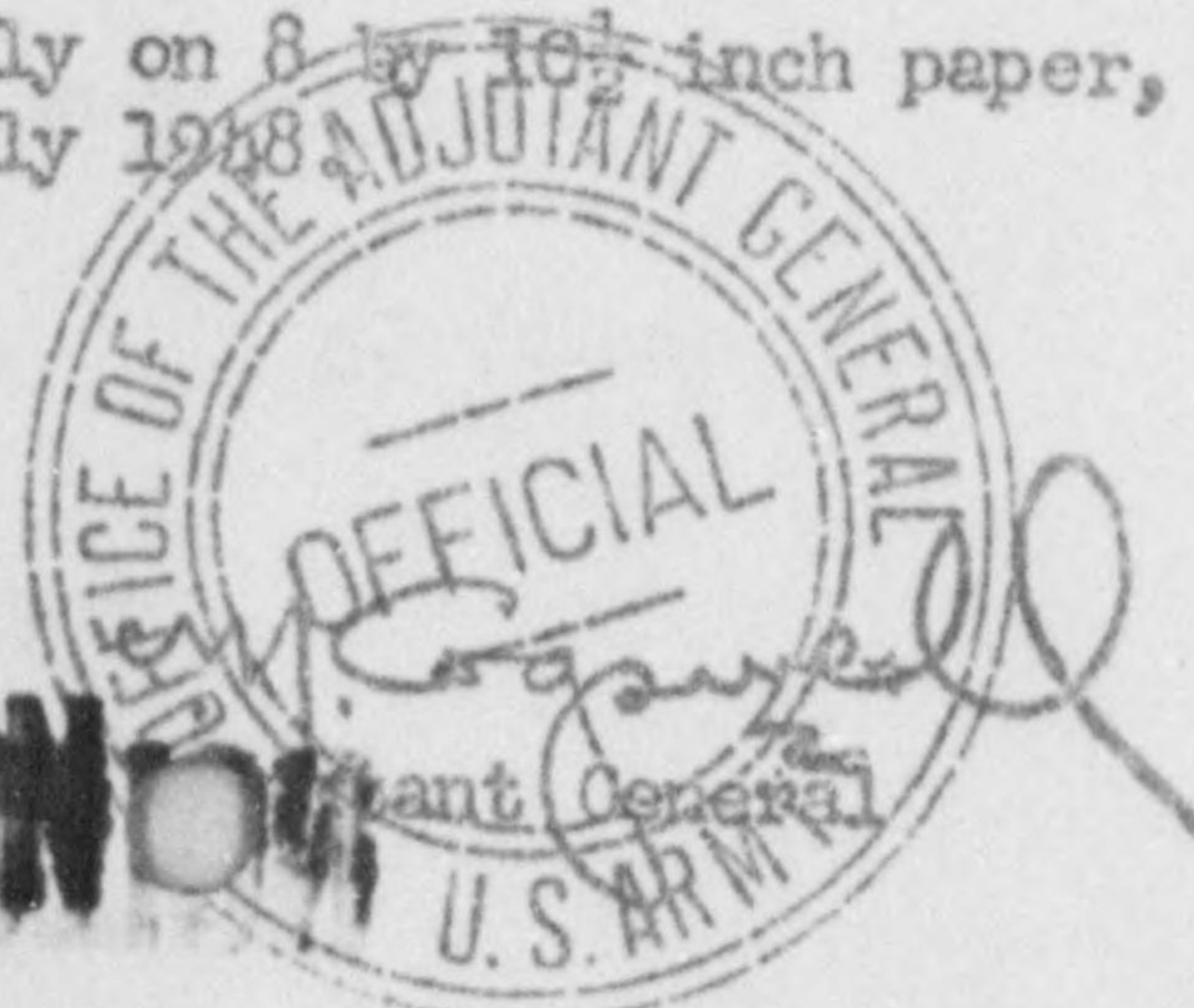

SUBJECT: Officer Requisitions

TO: Chairman
State-Army-Navy-Air Force Coordinating Committee

1. Requisitioning procedure for officer personnel is currently prescribed in Department of the Army Circular 6, dated 9 January 1948, as amended. In the past, many agencies of the Department of the Army Administrative Area have disregarded requisitioning procedures and have relied on their ability to obtain officers on an emergency basis.

2. With the existing and anticipated shortage of officers, particularly those with staff experience, it behooves all concerned to anticipate their officer requirements and have them reflected in authorized requisitions. Such compliance with instructions will insure consideration of needs and an equitable distribution of officer resources. In this connection, officers required for oversea assignment to D/AAA should be requisitioned in accordance with instructions on overseas requisitions.

3. It is emphasized that the Director of Personnel and Administration does not have an officer pool from which officers may be drawn in meeting unexpected officer requirements. As discussed in Circular 6, officers are obligated to zone of interior commands three months in advance and, to oversea commands, five months in advance.

4. Pending revision of Circular 6, agencies of the D/AAA will submit their requisitions to The Adjutant General (Attn: AGPA-CC).

5. As a matter of information, it is anticipated that an authorization, by arm or service, will be established for each agency of the D/AAA in the near future. When such a breakdown is accomplished, it will be required that requisitions be within the authorized branch strengths.

1. A revision of WD Circular 249, 1947, subject: "Foreign Service," is being published in the near future which requires that applications of personnel volunteering for transfer overseas under AR 615-200 be forwarded to The Adjutant General, Department of the Army for final decision whether or not approved by the field commanders. Pending receipt of this revision it is desired that all such applications be forwarded to The Adjutant General's Office through normal channels; in forwarding disapproved applications, commanders will state the reasons for disapproval.

2. An erroneous practice is becoming widespread in that applications of enlisted personnel requesting convenience of the Government Discharge under AR 615-365 for the purpose of volunteering for overseas assignment are being forwarded to The Adjutant General's Office in guise of application for transfer even though authority to discharge, reenlist and dispose of such personnel without reference to The Adjutant General's Office is now vested in commanders forwarding such applications. In this connection authority to discharge personnel under AR 615-365 is delegated to commanders listed in AR 615-360; authority to enlist personnel for certain overseas commands is contained in DA Memo 600-750-9 (Far East Command unassigned, specific divisions in the Far East Command and the Alaskan Command), and DA Memo 600-750-22 (for direct initial assignment to the European Command); authority to dispose of personnel enlisted under DA Memo 600-750-9 by shipment upon enlistment direct to the training division serving the area in which enlistment is effected is contained in WD Memo 615-500-4 as amended. Disposition of personnel enlisted from within the Army area for the European Command is direct from place of enlistment to Camp Kilmer Personnel Center as prescribed in DA Memo 600-750-22 and WD Memo 615-500-4 as amended.

3. Where authority does not exist for enlistment of personnel for specific overseas commands, i.e., USARPAC (Hawaii) and USARCARIB (Panama and Antilles), or if personnel not authorized for enlistment because of grade, e.g., first 3 grade enlisted men are not authorized to enlist for European Command, and Negro personnel are not currently authorized to enlist for direct overseas assignment except limited quota for European Command, applications of such personnel for transfer under AR 615-200, will be submitted through proper channels to The Adjutant General's Office for consideration, containing in addition to data required by AR 615-200, the following information:

- (1) Statement of applicant that he is a volunteer for overseas assignment under the provision of paragraph 8a, VD Circular 249, 1947, as amended by Section III, DA Circular 54, 1947.
- (2) Individuals below grade 3 who are married, will include statement to the effect that they understand their dependents will not be permitted to accompany them to overseas area or to join applicant later in overseas area.
- (3) Enlisted personnel volunteering for overseas service will indicate three (3) preferences in choice of theaters. In considering enlisted personnel for voluntary foreign service, the commander will forward pertinent information to The Adjutant General. The enlisted personnel will be ordered to a theater of his choice if the requirements of the overseas command permit; otherwise his voluntary application will be administratively withdrawn and he will be ordered overseas only through normal processes. Individual will be notified of action taken.

4. It is desired that the foregoing be brought to the attention of all personnel concerned in processing applications of personnel requesting overseas assignments and that strict adherence of all concerned be enjoined with the view of eliminating unnecessary forwarding of requests to the Department of the Army in instances where authority is resident in subordinate commanders.

5. It remains the Department of the Army policy that enlisted personnel desiring overseas assignment be encouraged to submit application therefor, and that all possible administrative assistance be extended such personnel.
