- 1 1. Reference is made to ltr AGAO-C 201 Furniss, Robert L. (11 Oct 50), 12 Oct 50, subj: Travel Orders, IJ-Tokyo, Japan-A F G. (Copy attached as inclosure 1.)
2. Paragraph 3 of cited orders placed Mr Furniss, who is employed by U. S. Department of Agriculture, on duty with Dept of Army for period of 90 days or 60 working days. The 90 calendar day period expires 24 January 1951, necessitating Mr Furniss' departure from Japan on or about 20 January.
3. The 60 working day period was established on the basis of NR original request for Mr Furniss' services. The request was predicated on the assumption that the 60-day period would include full 8-hour days only. In view of the facts that the vast majority of federal agencies operates on a five-day work week and that a 90 calendar day period is authorized, it is believed that the only purpose of the 60 working day specification is to limit expenditure of funds to the equivalent of twelve 40-hour weeks of work. On this basis the 60 day period will expire 19 January 1951, necessitating Mr Furniss' departure on or about 15 January.
4. Discussion with personnel of G-1/CPD indicates that the interpretation of that office is that each half day of GHQ six day work week is counted as a full day of employment. On this basis the 60 working day period will expire 8 January, necessitating Mr Furniss' departure on or about 4 January.
5. It is desired that, in order for Mr Furniss to be able to complete his mission, he remain in Tokyo until 20 January 1951. Departure on or about that date will enable Mr Furniss to return to his home in the U. S. by 24 January 1951, within the 90 calendar day period of reimbursable loan authorized. Accordingly, if considered necessary, request that Dept of Army be asked to extend the working day tour of Mr Furniss an additional 16 days.

1. Reference is made to ltr AGAO-C 201 Furniss, Robert L. (11 Oct 50), 12 Oct 50, subj: Travel Orders, IJ-Tokyo, Japan-A F G. (Copy attached as inclosure 1.)

2. Paragraph 3 of cited orders placed Mr Furniss, who is employed by U. S. Department of Agriculture, on duty with Dept of Army for period of 90 days or 60 working days. The 90 calendar day period expires 24 January 1951, necessitating Mr Furniss' departure from Japan on or about 20 January.

3. The 60 working day period was established on the basis of NR original request for Mr Furniss' services. The request was predicated on the assumption that the 60-day period would include full 8-hour days only. In view of the facts that the vast majority of federal agencies operates on a five-day work week and that a 90 calendar day period is authorized, it is believed that the only purpose of the 60 working day specification is to limit expenditure of funds to the equivalent of twelve 40-hour weeks of work. On this basis the 60 day period will expire 19 January 1951, necessitating Mr Furniss' departure on or about 15 January.

4. Discussion with personnel of G-1/CPD indicates that the interpretation of that office is that each half day of GHQ six day work week is counted as a full day of employment. On this basis the 60 working day period will expire 8 January, necessitating Mr Furniss' departure on or about 4 January.

5. It is desired that, in order for Mr Furniss to be able to complete his mission, he remain in Tokyo until 20 January 1951. Departure on or about that date will enable Mr Furniss to return to his home in the U. S. by 24 January 1951, within the 90 calendar day period of reimbursable loan authorized. Accordingly, if considered necessary, request that Dept of Army be asked to extend the working day tour of Mr Furniss an additional 16 days.

1. PH&W in Checknote 1 requests approval for the appointment of Dr. Merlin L. Cooper, Visiting Expert, Dysentery Vaccine Consultant. This project was not included in the approved program for FY 1951.

2. Dr. Cooper's services are requested for two periods of 90 days each for this program. The first period beginning 1 February 1951 will be for the purpose of supervising the preparation and standardization of the vaccine and for planning field studies. The second period beginning 1 July 1951 will be for the purpose of supervising field studies which will be conducted at the height of the dysentery season. Epidemiological, statistical, and laboratory personnel to assist Dr. Cooper will be furnished from the PH&W staff.

3. It is estimated that each 90 day period will cost a maximum of \$4500. Sufficient funds are available within the approved program for FY 1951 to cover the cost of that part of the project falling within this fiscal year. No FY 1952 visiting expert program has been approved as yet; however, the projected budget amount for FY 1952 provides sufficient funds to cover this cost.

4. The proposed draft radio attached extends an invitation to Dr. Cooper to come to Japan for two 90-day periods, beginning 1 February 1951 and 1 July 1951, respectively, to advise PH&W on the production of bacillary dysentery vaccine and on the establishment of a program of prophylactic vaccination against dysentery.

5. Recommend approval of:

a. The proposed Visiting Expert project.

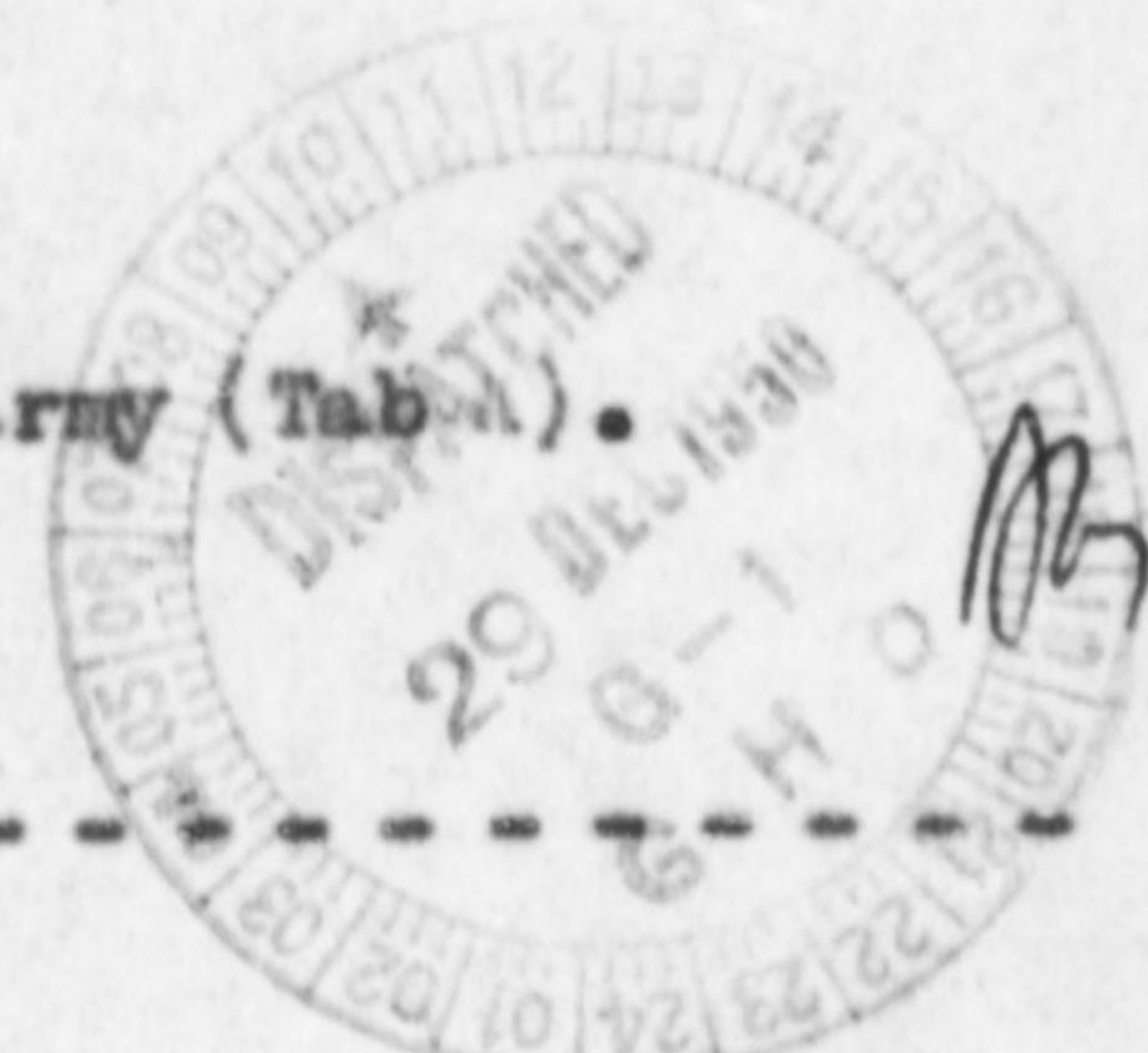

1. 1. Bacillary dysentery is a major public health problem in Japan. Japanese morbidity and mortality rates from this disease are the highest of the modern countries of the world. In 1949 there were 23,533 cases reported, of which 7,709 terminated in death. Of the cases reported, 12,014 occurred in children less than five years of age resulting in 5,692 deaths.
2. Prevention of dysentery depends upon health education, environmental sanitation and insect and rodent control. Emphasis of these programs by SCAP has resulted in a significant lowering of morbidity and mortality rates for dysentery in Japan in the post-war period, as compared with the pre-war and war periods. Other types of major enteric infections, the typhoid fevers, respond to prophylactic immunizations as a control measure, but the value of prophylactic immunization as an adjuvant in the control of dysentery has not been conclusively demonstrated.
3. The cost of programs of environmental sanitation, insect and rodent control, and health education sufficient to eliminate dysentery in a country such as Japan is practically prohibitive when undertaken on a short term basis. They involve, among other things, discontinuance of the use of nightsoil as fertilizer by substituting chemical fertilizers and the construction of new and additional water purification, sewerage, and sewage disposal systems. Such programs have been instituted in Japan, and although tremendous progress has been made, several more years will be required before these programs can be completed.
4. Much research and investigation has been conducted in various countries of the world, including Japan, on the development and determination of clinical effectiveness of bacillary dysentery vaccine. Until the recent work of an American worker, all efforts have failed. During World War II Dr. Merlin L. Cooper, Associate Professor of Bacteriology and Assistant Professor of Pediatrics of the University of Cincinnati, working under the auspices of the Committee of Medical Research of the Office of Scientific Research and Development, was apparently successful in developing an improved Shigella dysentery vaccine for use in the prophylactic immunization against bacillary dysentery. This work included field studies conducted on U. S. Navy personnel, which terminated in inconclusive results, because the ships involved were decommissioned prior to the collection of sufficient data.

There are several differences between Dr. Cooper's vaccine and its usage and those vaccines developed in the past. Data are inadequate to permit conclusions to be drawn as to the total effectiveness or ineffectiveness of this new vaccine. Lack of conclusive data is due to the fact that adequately exposed study groups do not exist in the United States or among United States Military personnel.

5. Bacillary dysentery is a problem of major importance to United States Military Forces because of the necessity for operation in countries of high case incidence. The Armed Forces Epidemiological Board has been consulted with respect to the proposal contained herein and is highly in favor of conducting in Japan a study to evaluate the effectiveness of the Shigella dysentery vaccine developed by Dr. Cooper, stating that "On the part of this office, it is desired to point out that Dr. Cooper's material is perhaps the best Shigella vaccine that can be presently prepared, but that knowledge on a large scale concerning its role for preventing or ameliorating Shigella dysentery is not available."

6. An efficient and successful vaccination procedure would aid immeasurably in reducing morbidity and mortality from bacillary dysentery in Japan. It is requested that the services of Dr. Merlin L. Cooper be procured to serve as an Expert Consultant to Public Health and Welfare Section, GHQ, SCAP, for the purpose of conducting a study to evaluate the Shigella dysentery vaccine developed by him. Dr. Cooper's services will be required for two periods of 90 days each for this purpose. The first period should begin as of 1 February 1951 for the purpose of supervising the preparation and standardization of the vaccine and in planning field studies. The second period should begin 1 July 1951 for the purpose of supervising field studies which will be conducted at the height of the dysentery season. Dr. Cooper has signified his willingness to come to Japan to serve as consultant to PHW on this problem.

7. Request approval for dispatch of the attached radio which extends an invitation to Dr. Cooper to come to Japan as a Visiting Expert Consultant for two 90-day periods, beginning 1 February and 1 July 1951, respectively, to advise PHW Section on the production of bacillary dysentery vaccine and the establishment of a program of prophylactic vaccination against dysentery.

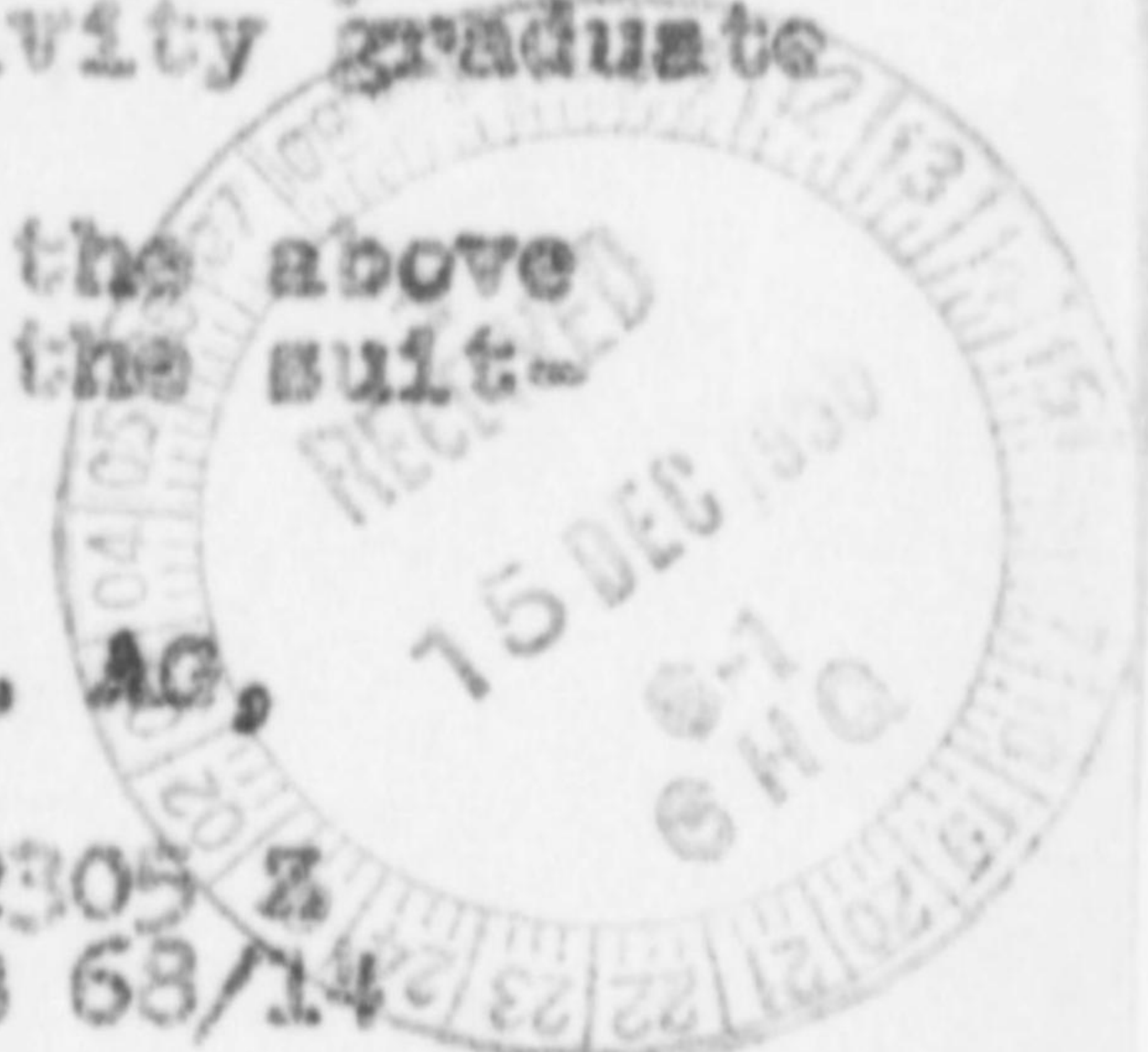

1. C/N from NRS transmits report from Mr. Albert K. Dexter and Mr. Joseph C. Kircher, Visiting Expert Consultants, NRS, who have investigated the management of the privately owned coniferous forests of Japan. The present rapid depletion of Japan's coniferous forest reserves under private ownership presage a critical shortage within the next 10 or 15 years unless drastic regulation and control is imposed. For example, 1950 cut in the coniferous stands is estimated at 209% of growth. The situation in privately owned forests is in direct contrast with the National Forests which are already on a sustained yield basis.

2. Messrs. Dexter and Kircher recommend immediate action including legislation to place privately owned forests on a sustained yield basis rather than a graduated program since they feel any other solution will result in more complex problems at a later date. Adverse effects on the economy such as unemployment and increased import requirements will follow such action. However, the specific risks involved could be measured through coordinated action by ESS and NRS to arrive at an intelligent solution to this very real problem.

3. Although the benefits of a controlled program may not immediately outweigh its disadvantages, the apparent long-term danger to Japan's economic life in this area imposes a responsibility upon SCAP to prevent the deterioration of the nation's lumber resources. The fact that depletion occurred during the period of the occupation might result in future criticism.

4. It is suggested that NRS be requested to join with ESS in crystalizing the problem area and formulate a positive solution at the earliest date.

5. In view of the apparent seriousness of the situation in privately owned forests it is believed the DC/S SCAP might be interested in meeting with Messrs. Kircher and Dexter as recommended by NRS in C/N 1.

1. Mr Albert K. Dexter and Mr Joseph C. Kircher, Visiting Expert Consultants, Natural Resources Section, have investigated the management of the privately owned coniferous forests of Japan. The significance of their assignment lay in the fact that even though Japan has extensive forest areas, the area devoted to the growth and production of sawtimber is extremely limited. The world shortage of wood products of strategic value makes it imperative that Japan manage the residual timber stands in a manner to avoid deterioration of the national economy. Messrs Dexter and Kircher are scheduled to leave Tokyo on or about the night of 20 December after spending 81 days in Japan. Inclosures one and two are the biographical sketches and inclosure 3 is a copy of their report.

2. Messrs Dexter and Kircher concluded that the forests of Japan must be managed immediately for sustained yield. They are confident that better forest practices can be applied to the residual timber stands to maintain a full vegetative cover in order to control soil erosion and to lessen floods and the resultant damage to agricultural lands. Improved practices will increase the productivity of forest stands to the greater profit of the private owner.

3. Messrs Dexter and Kircher further advise that the Japanese must develop a system of forest management that will meet the characteristic needs of the nation. Japan's unaltered application of the German forest management system developed for an area not comparable to Japan has greatly contributed to the current deplorable condition of the private forests.

4. Immediate action to apply basic principles of good land use management to private forest property must be taken if Japan's forest resources is to contribute its proportionate share to the economic recovery of the nation. For this reason, Natural Resources Section believes that the Deputy Chief of Staff, SCAP, would be interested in the opportunity to discuss the full implication of the basic principles of forest management with Messrs Kircher and Dexter.

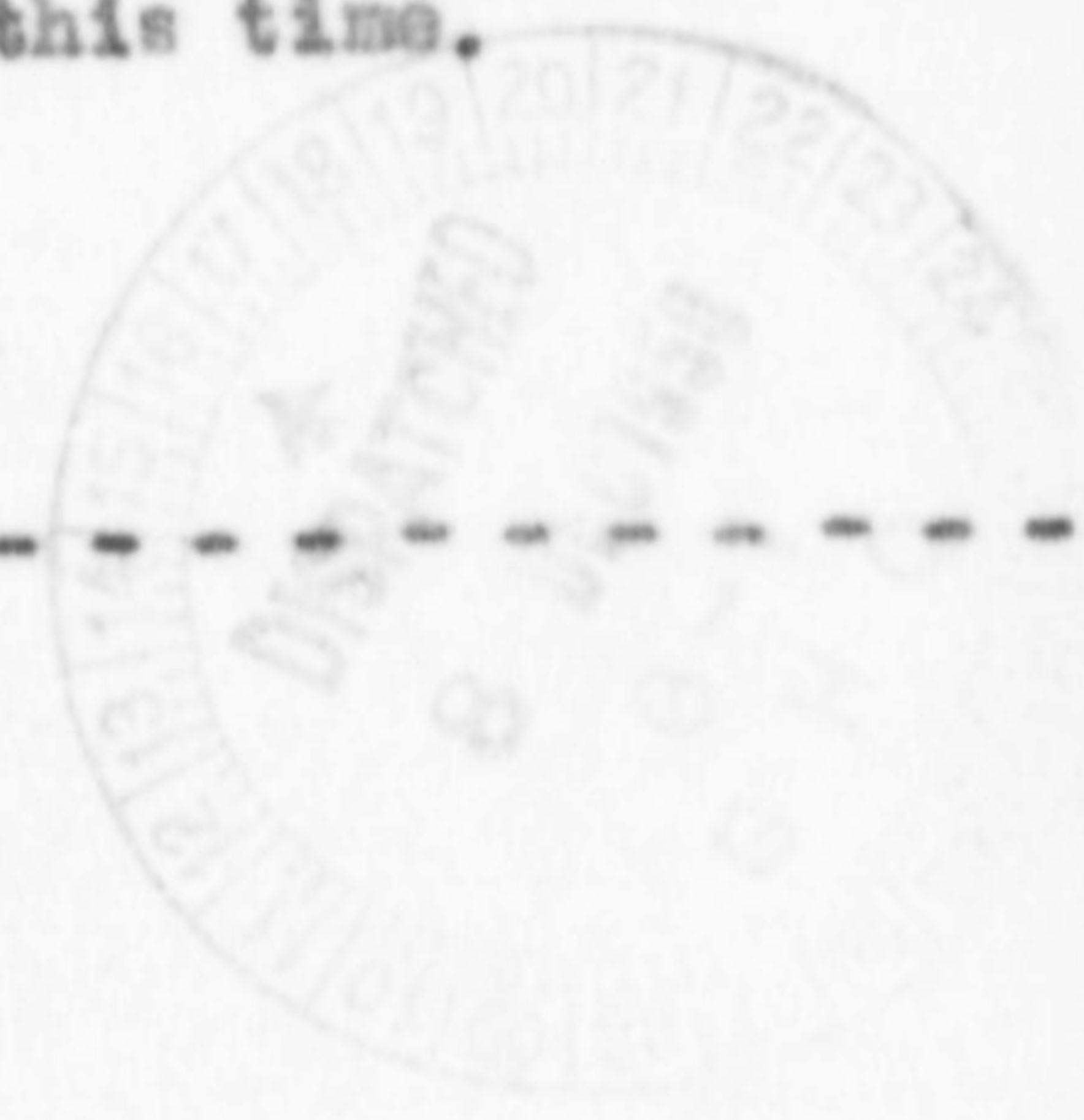

The period of orientation is considerable. The amount of usable product from the average visiting expert cannot be too great. There is some question under these circumstances whether or not the brief tours of duty of many visiting experts are worthwhile in view of budget curtailment. Generally speaking, the visiting expert program is considered to deserve critical review, especially where curtailment of funds will permit expenditures only for immediately attainable objectives.

1. Inclosed report entitled "Report on the Fisheries Research Program of Japan as of November 1950" records the observations of Dr Willis H. Rich, Visiting Expert, Natural Resources Section.
 2. The study shows how the recent improvements in the Japanese fisheries research program apply to the task of maintaining the fisheries at the highest level of production.
 3. The author finds:
 - a. The new research program of the Fisheries Agency, Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry, as developed under the advice and guidance of the Natural Resources Section, is a notable advance.
 - b. Emphasis has been placed on the kind of biological studies that are essential if the fisheries are to be operated so that overfishing will be prevented and the maximum yield sustained. This was almost entirely lacking in prewar fishery research in Japan.
 - c. The establishment of eight (8) regional fisheries research laboratories replacing the single central fisheries experimental station of the Japanese Government is highly recommended as a move that will increase both the quality and the quantity of the Japanese work in fisheries research.
 - d. To realize fully the advantages of the new organization and program, it is highly important that an adequate statistical system be established.
 - e. Library facilities at most of the laboratories are entirely inadequate, especially with regard to modern work in the field of fisheries research.
 - f. There is a serious lack of properly trained fisheries research men.
 4. Special studies by the author were made of the research of herring and salmon fisheries of Hokkaido and of the programs for the study of the fisheries of the East China Sea and the Inland Sea.
 5. The author has made specific recommendations for better coordination and more constructive accomplishments in fisheries research and for application

of these results in the proper conservation and management of the important aquatic resources of Japan.

1. The revision of the present pension system required under the National Public Service Law, has now progressed sufficiently far to require the services of an expert actuary to determine, among other things, the proper contribution required to support a sound pension program for the Japanese National Government.

2. The level and competence of actuarial work in Japan does not make it possible for this work to be conducted by the Japanese themselves.

3. It is necessary to recruit from the United States as a consultant, for a short period of time, an actuary of recognized competence and stature. He must be an authority in his field of actuarial science and in the subject matter field involved.

4. It is understood that Mr. Robert J. Meyers, Chief Actuary, Federal Security Agency, Washington, D. C., can be made available by that agency, on a two month reimbursable assignment. His grade is GS-15.

5. Since legislation to implement the revision of the pension system must be submitted to the regular session of the Diet, it is urgent that the services of Mr. Meyers be obtained as soon as possible.

6. It is requested that negotiations be immediately undertaken with the Federal Security Agency to procure the services of Mr. Meyers on a reimbursable loan basis. It is hoped that he can complete his tour of duty in this theater prior to the middle of December 1950.
