LARSH, Investigator FROM: Burned Documents SUBJECT: Mr. HAYASHI of the Archives Section of the Foreign Office who prepared the volume which lists all documents which were burned either by accident or deliberately explains the notations, "obscure," "unknown," and "existent" as follows: The "obscure" and "unknown" refer to numbers of copies which were once held by the ministry. The different words come about as a translation matter. The original uses the kanji characters for "fumei" which may be read as either "unknown" or "obscure". Mr. HAYASHI assumes me it should be unknown in any case where it is used in his compilation. As our translation was done by various translators, it is quite understandable that this could occur. The word "existent" will be found applied only to main headings or major sub-headings and means that that particular heading is partly available but that the documents listed beneath it are burned. The only other instance where "unknown" will be found is where it applies to the title of a file. The file number may be at the left of the page but the title may be unknown. This arises because the master files were destroyed and in repairing the damage done by fire raids in some cases only numbers of files were legible and their contents were destroyed. RICHARD H.
