SUMMARY OF RELEVANT POINTS

OIKAWA, in response to a question by Diet Member KUBOI denies British charges that Japan outfitted or supplied various German raiders operating in the Pacific, and affirms that Germany denies that the raiders were flying the Japanese flag.

Secondly OIKAWA assures that House that measures have been taken to "bring the Japanese Navy up to the limits of autonomous safety against the expansion of the U.S. Navy" OIKAWA also agreed that Japan as "defender of Greater East Asia" should have greater armaments than in the past.

MINUTES OF THE 76TH IMPERIAL DIET LOWER HOUSE BUDGET COMMITTEE (EXCERPT) (JANUARY 26, 1941)

Minister of State OIKAWA: -

Referring to Mr. KUBOI's present interrogation in regard to the hostile action taken by GERMAN commerce raiders against BRITAIN near AUSTRALIA, which has appeared in the newspapers, I believe this to be a fact. However, the report that the said ships were fitted out in JAPAN SE ports -- as is believed among a certain section of people in BRITAIN -- is totally untrue. Furthermore, there is also no truth whatsoever in the report that JAPAN is replenishing these raiders by means of JAPANESE ships. These reports are wholly groundless. Although the BRITISH claim also that the said commerce raiders were flying the JAPANESE flag and that they bore JAPANESE markings, according to the GERMAN Government's reply to the EMPIRE's /T.N. JAPAN's/protest, the GERMAN Government too has denied the affair. This represents practically the actual facts about the matter.

I believe that, in his present interrogation, Mr. KUBOI's questions are

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Firstly, as regards what preparations the NAVY possesses against this critical situation, and

Secondly, at this juncture when the U. S. Havy is believed to be engaged in its gigantic expansion, have any preparations been made to expand the JAPANESE Navy?

As regards the first question as to what preparations the NAVY has for coping with the situation, my reply to this is that the NAVY has given this matter its careful consideration and has made thorough preparations for dealing with the worst possible situation. As for details thereof I of course do not think that there is any need of mentioning same.

As for the second question as to what expansion program the JAPANESE Navy possesses against the expansion of the U.S. Navy, care has been taken to show some consideration in the budget draft already submitted this year as wellas the budget draft that will be submitted hereafter to bring the JAPANESE Navy up to the limits of autonomous safety against the expansion of the U.S. Navy. Please rest your mind at east on that point. That is all I say as my reply.

I shall give a summarized reply to the three points contained in Mr. KUBOI's present interrogation. It is true that, as Mr. Kuboi has just argued, although I cannot give accurate figures in regard to the ratio between the warship construction expenditure of the U. S. and that of JAPAN, it is true that same has in general become several times more. Consequently, if I should perchance be able to receive the gigantic expansion expenditure of the U. S., it is certain that we would be able to equip ourselves with greater armaments than what the U. S. is about to furnish herself with. Although such is the case, what is known as armaments is, as you are aware, not only a question of quantity. The question of quality also comes into consideration. If devices characteristic of the JAPANESE Navy should be applied and characteristic new arms of service should be set up, it cannot necessarily be said that we must spend the same amount of money as the U. S. in order to also oppose the U. S. fleet built at a gigantic cost. As for JAPAN, she has a certain confidence of success on that point. Although I cannot give a detailed reply as to how many warships and how many planes, my idea is to establish reliable armaments considered as necessary by the JAPANESE Navy for making us confident of success against practically any kind of emergency, regarding a part of which I have, as already mentioned a little while ago, been favoured with your kind approval and intend to also receive your approval hereafter as well as they steadily come to appear in future budgets. As for the remark as to whether there should not be some difference between the armaments of JAPAN as in the past and that of JAPAN in charge of defending the GREATER EAST ASIA CO-PROSPERITY SPHERE, I am also in full accord. I hope that these points will be carefully interwoven with our present armaments program, which please note.
