In the interest of maintaining maximum control over the number of personnel having access to recovered prisoners of war for the purpose of interrogation in compliance with current security policy, it is considered advisable to limit the issuance of Identification Cards for Interrogation to the extent necessary to perform those interrogations dictated by the current recovery rate.

2. JA present requirements for authorization to access to recovered prisoners of war for the purpose of interrogation are limited to that necessary to issue JA clearance for individuals recovered subsequent to an exchange of prisoners of war resulting from a Korean truce. It is further recognized

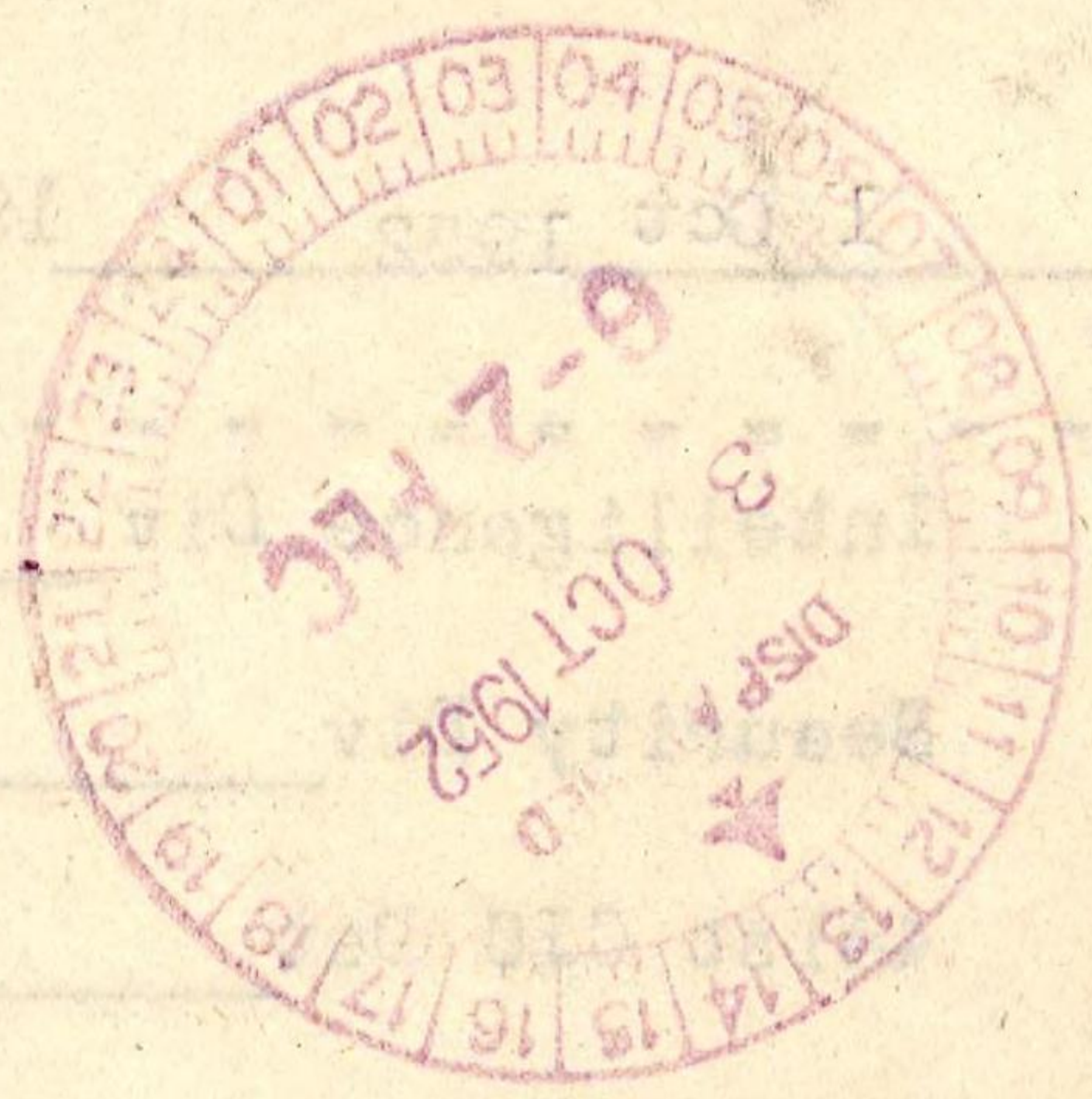

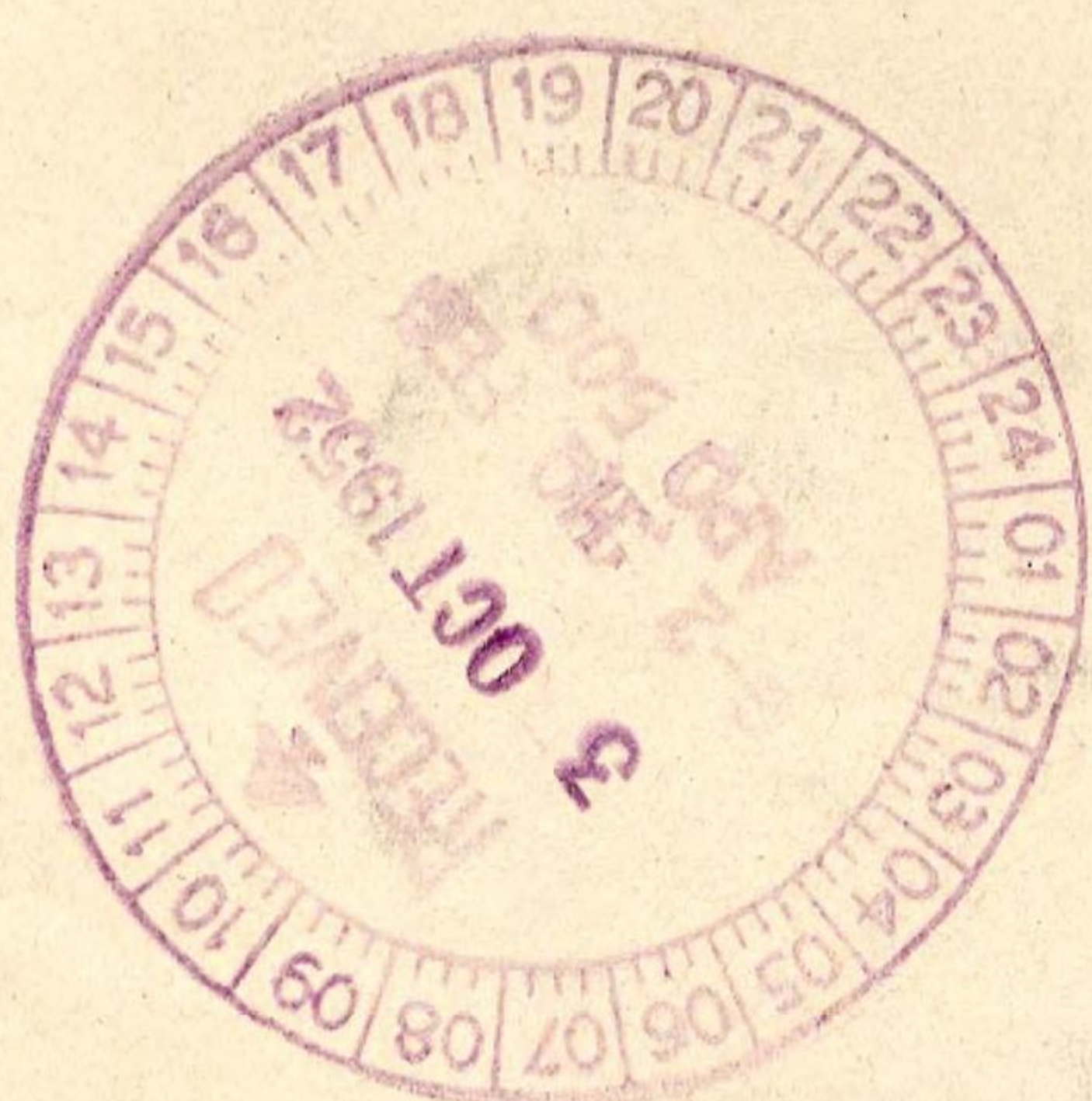

1. Due to recent changes in personnel, it has been necessary to change the signature line and color of the cards authorizing access to United States Recovered Prisoners of War for the purpose of conducting interrogations under Operations Plna 8-51.

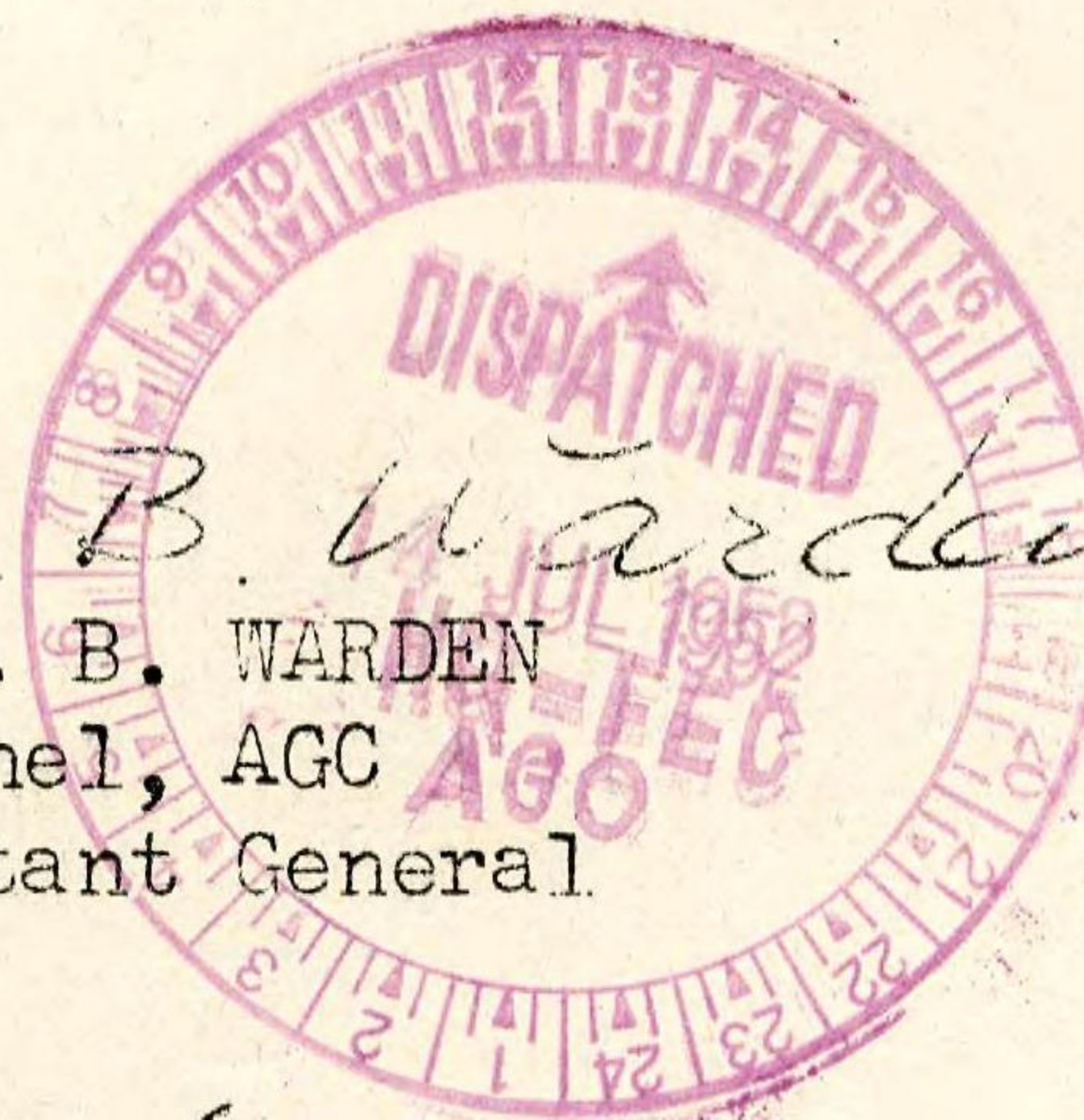
1. DD Form 528, Armed Forces of the United States Geneva Conventions Identification Card, dated 1 July 1951, contains a block titled "Branch of Service."

2. Members of several branches of the service, such as Military Police Corps, General Staff Corps, Chemical Corps, and Judge Advocate General Corps, because of the nature of their duties, are likely to be subjected, upon capture by certain belligerents, to undue hardship and unreasonable interrogation. It is recognized that such personnel can usually be identified by their branch insignia. However, branch insignia can frequently be discarded if capture is imminent. Nothing in the Geneva Conventions of 1949 requires that identification cards indicate branch of service or that the individual be required to state his branch of service upon capture. Furthermore, DD Form 2A, the identification card issued to Army personnel, does not indicate branch of service.

3. It is recommended that DD Form 528 be revised by deleting the block titled "Branch of Service", and that pending such revision, instructions be issued to leave this block blank on cards issued to individuals.

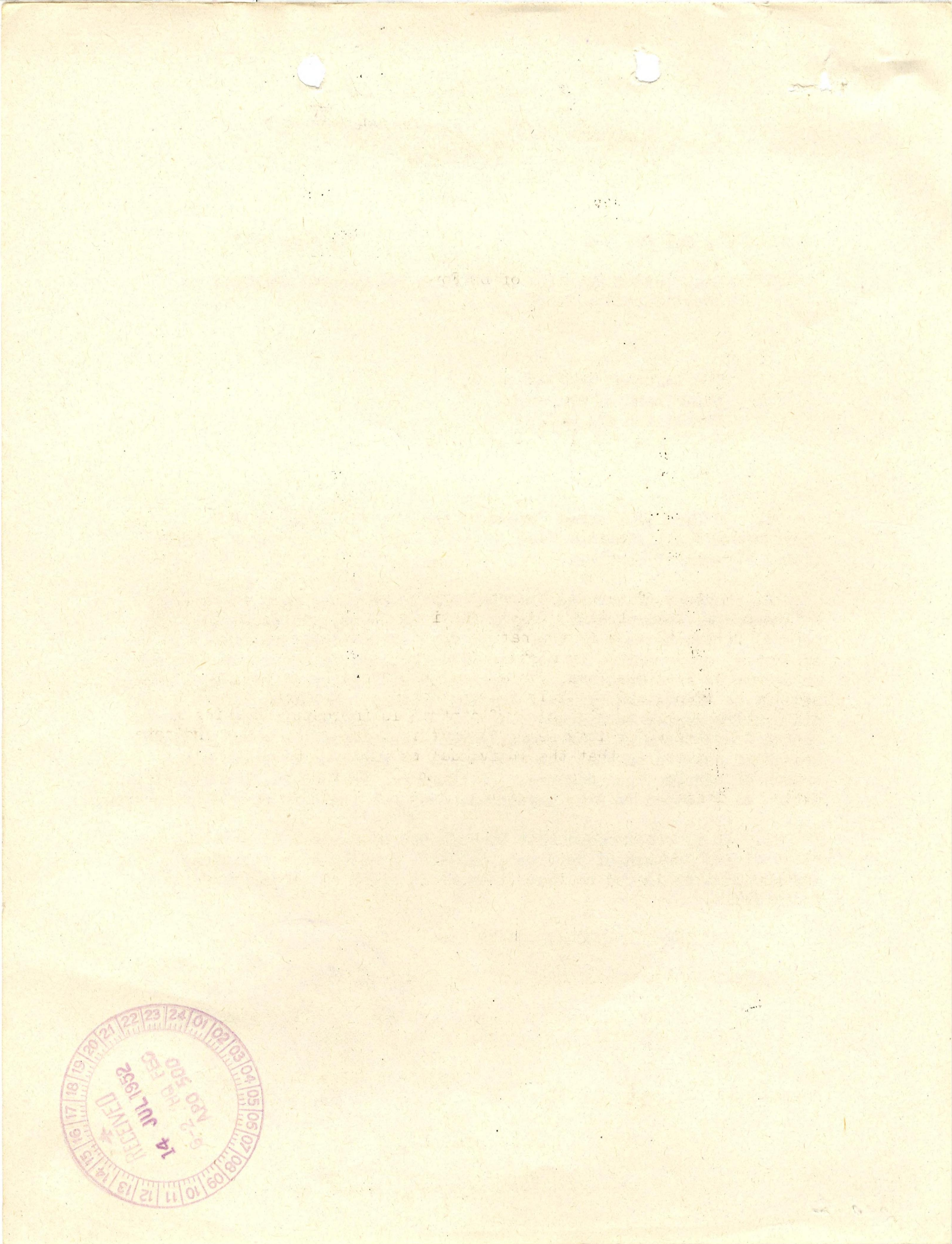

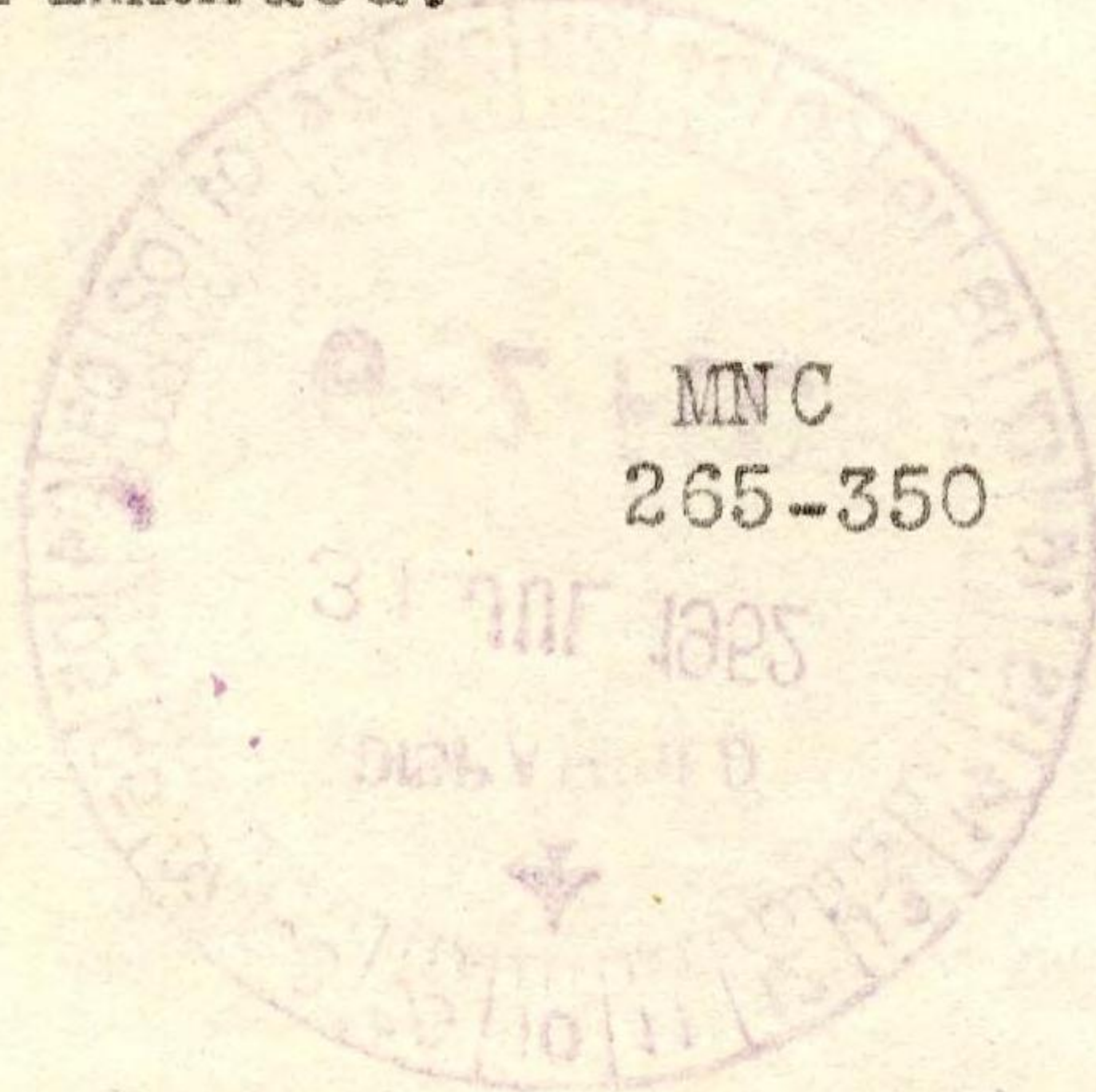

As soon as possible, new laminated passes with photographs should be issued all indigenous personnel whose duties require admittance to Building 1-A, including vehicle drivers employed by Staff Sections within the building. These passes to be of a distinctive color and bear the notation "Building 1-A." Upon issuance of these new passes, the pink Japanese employee's card would no longer be sufficient to gain entrance to Building 1-A. Entrances to be normally utilized by different categories of indigenous employees should be as prescribed by their supervisor in accordance with propriety and the location of their respective duties.

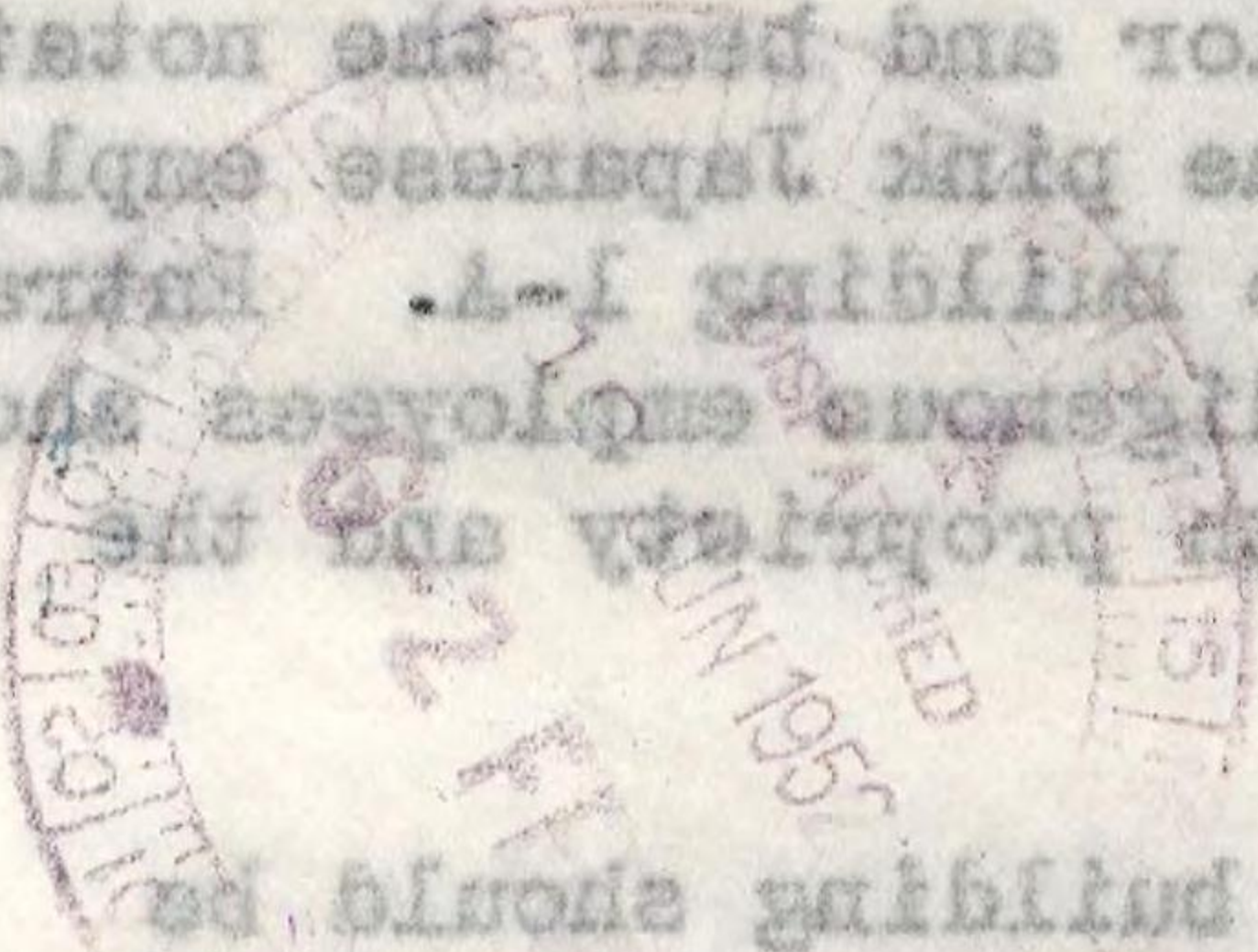

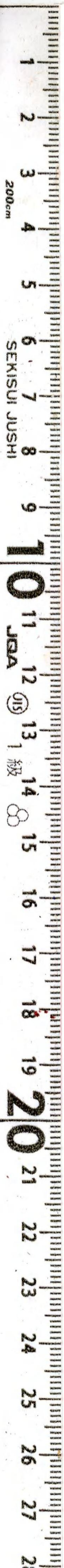

(3) Persons should no longer be admitted to Building 1-A solely on the basis of the green card with large "D" superimposed which is now held by personnel of various foreign missions in Japan and previously honored as a pass for entry into the Dai Ichi Building. (Concurrence by Mr. W. H. Sullivan of U. S. Embassy) Likewise the identification card issued by PIO, this headquarters, to accredited correspondents should not be honored for admittance to Building 1-A. (Concurrence by Capt W. H. Jones of PIO) Personnel desiring to obtain admittance on the basis of these cards should hereafter be referred to the receptionist for processing as outlined in Annex A.

(4) All United States Military personnel have been issued identification card DD Form 2A, 1 Jan 50, which would be honored for admittance to Building 1-A during any periods when the individual is authorized to wear civilian clothes, or when security considerations make it desirable to effect a more thorough check than that afforded by the uniform alone.

f. Exceptions to the above procedures to be made:

(1) In the cases of United States Ambassador Murphy, Emperor Hirohito and Japanese Prime Minister Yoshida, Honor Guards should familiarize themselves with likenesses of these individuals in order that they may be admitted on sight recognition.

(2) In the cases of a limited number of individuals to whom a special type identification card has been or will be issued by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G2, FEC. These cards, an example of which is attached as Annex B, hereto, should be accepted as passes admitting the bearer to Building 1-A.

2. To further insure the security of Building 1-A, Pershing Heights, G2 recommends that receptionists employed at the Reception Desk be United States citizens who are fluent in both English and Japanese languages.

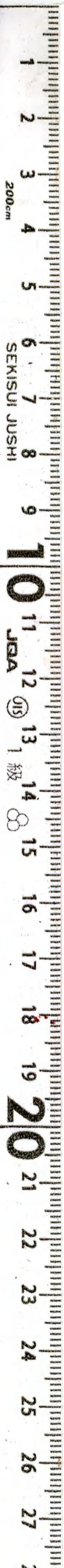

TEMPORARY PASSES

Visitors to Building 1-A who do not possess identification cards honored as passes to that building will be processed as follows:

1. Honor Guards will permit such persons to enter only through the main entrance and will direct them to the receptionist.
2. The Visitor will furnish the receptionist his name and the name of the person he desires to visit.
3. The Receptionist will then telephone the administrative officer of the section concerned and inquire if the visit is desired. If an affirmative answer is received, the receptionist will request a guide from the section and will complete a temporary pass (see paragraph 5) to reflect the pass number, the visitor's name (Romaji and Kanji; if applicable), the section to be visited, the individual within the section who is to be contacted and the date. The visitor will then be directed to a seat in the reception area to await the arrival of a guide from the section concerned. Upon arrival of the guide, the receptionist will enter the current hour on the pass and give same to the guide. The guide will escort the visitor into the presence of the person to be visited to whom the pass will be delivered. Upon completion of the visit, the person visited will sign the pass and enter thereon the time of completion of the visit. The visitor will then be escorted back to the receptionist desk by a representative of the section visited and the temporary pass returned to the receptionist.
4. Visitors whose presence is not desired by the administrative officer of the section concerned will be escorted from the building.
