INTRODUCTION

We present the project **FindingGLAMs**. Through this initiative, Wikimedia Sverige, UNESCO and the Wikimedia Foundation aim to bring online as much freely licensed information about the world's cultural heritage institutions as possible.



We are working to collate a truly worldwide database of cultural heritage institutions and their collections on Wikipedia. We will empower cultural organisations to share their knowledge and content with the world through collaboration, training, documentation and case studies. The project will lay the groundwork for long term and sustainable collaboration between cultural organisations and the Wikimedia movement.

The data made available will be structured, queryable and under open licenses to give it the widest possible audience and allow users to explore it in many ways. The data can be used by apps and websites including being integrated with Wikipedia and used by search services including Google, Siri and others.

A worldwide database of GLAM institutions

There is currently no worldwide database of the world's museums, archives and libraries and their collections. We are building one – on Wikidata.



Lots of lists and datasets exists in different countries. We are collecting data about them and their copyright status in order to learn and share what already has been done.

Whenever possible, we import that data to Wikidata!

Crowdsourcing data from GLAM professionals

We are running a crowdsourcing campaign to encourage GLAM professionals around the world to contribute data about their institutions.

With Monumental, a user-friendly remote Wikidata editor, we are making editing Wikidata easy and approachable to newcomers.

We are both filling in gaps in existing data and making Wikidata more accessible to new contributors.



Support for GLAMs to share their content on Wikimedia projects

We are helping GLAMs share their content on Wikimedia projects so that it reaches a worldwide audience and increases the public awareness of the institutions and their collections.


