Gentlemen: On Saturday March 4th, 1950
a few minutes before noon C.S.T. a cluster
of objects (4 or 5) were seen to hang in the
sky over this small city population 2500.
A few minutes after being cited two of these
objects moved off slowly in a south -
easterly direction from Cross Plains. As
they moved slowly thru the air one
was seen to do a "bowel roll"
while the other followed travel in
regular fashion. These objects were
white to silvery in color and probably
were flat and elliptical in shape.
No noise or exhaust gas or flame was
cited here from the objects.
Any other information that could be
given to science would be glad to furnish
These objects are locally believed to be
"flying saucers".
