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> A Short Narrative of an Extraordinary Delivery, \&c.


Hatever may be the Fate of this Account, I think my felf indifpenfably obliged to relate the Facts that I flaw, and tranfacted my felf, as alpo the Reafons which firth induced me to enquire into the Truth of fuch an Extraordinary Event; but I here declare that I take on me no other Part of this Narration, than that in which I was actually concerned.

As Mr. Howard himfelf intends fhortly to publifh the whole Account, and prove every Circumftance of

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it, by fuch Evidences as will put this Matter out of all poffibility of Doubt, I mut refer to him for feveral Particulars here omitted.

And as it will be impoffible to judge impartially of this Fact, till the Evidences abovemention'd are produced, it cannot be doubted but all foch PerIons as are not governed by Prejudice, or fame worfe Motive, will fufpend thicir Judgment till there Facts come to their Knowledge by a more certain way, than by flying Reports and Conpictures.

The frt Intelligence I received of this Matter, was on the 5 th Infant, when I flaw a very particular ${ }^{2}$ Account of a Woman living at Godliman lately delivered of five Rabbets by Mr. Goon Howard, Surgeon at Guilford in Sur-

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rey, a Man of known Probity, Character, and Capacity in his Profeffion, who has practis'd Midwifery for above thefe thirty Years.

This Account was again confirmed by two ${ }^{b}$ Letters from the faid Mr . Howard, the firf dated Nov. the 6th, 4 a Clock in the Afternoon; the Subftance of which is, That from the 4 th Inftant to the 6th he had deliver'd the Woman of three more Rabbets; that the laft of them had leap'd in her Belly, for the fpace of eighteen Hours, before it dy'd, and that the Moment it was taken away, another was perceiv'd to ftruggle for Birth.

The fecond is dated Nor. the ninth, and is here tranfcribedverbatim, viz.

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INCE I wrote to you, I have taken or deliver'd the poor Wo${ }^{\text {b }}$ The Letters were directed to Mr. Davenant.

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man of three more Rabbets, all three half grown, one of them a dunn Rabbet; the laft leap dewenty three Hours in the Uterus before it dy'd. As foon as the eleventh Rabbet was taken away, up leap'd the twelfth Rabbet, which is now leaping. If you have any curious Perfon that is pleafed to come Poft, may fee another leap in her Uterus, and fhall take it from her if he pleafes; which will be a great Satisfaction to the Curious: If fhe had been with Child, The has but ten Days more to go, fo I do not know how many Rabbets may be behind; I have brought the Woman to Guilford for better Convenience.

Thee Letters, with others to Perfons of Diftinction in Town, which all agreed with the above-mentioned; were fufficient to make me defirous of being convinced perfonally of a Fact of which there was no Inftance in Na ture. Accordingly on the 1 g th Inftant, I attended the Honourable Mr. Molyneux, Secretary to his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, who was inclin'd to enquire into the Truth of this extraordinary Cafe , and defir'd me to go with him to Guilford: We arrived there at about half an hour after two in the Afternoon. We rent to Mr . Howard, who came to us immediately, and told us that the Woman was actually in Labour of the fifteenth Rabbet. We had not been at his Houfe long, before the Nurfe who attends the Woman came to call Mr. Howard to her, the being then in one of her labour Pains.

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She was lodged over againft Mr. Howard's Houfe, we found her drefs'd in her Stays, fitting on the Bed-fide with feveral Women near her. I immediately examined her, and not finding the Parts prepared for her Labour, I waited for the coming on of frefh Pains, which hapned in three or four minutes, at which time I deliver'd her of the entire Trunk, ftrip'd of its Skin, of a Rabbet of about four Months growth, in which the Heart and Lungs were contained with the Diaphagm entre. I inftantly cut off a piece of them, and tried them in Water; they feemed but juft fecifically lighterthan it, and Mr. Molyneux pref. fing them to the Bottom they rofe again very nlowly; the Heart was very large, and its Foramen Ovale entirely open; the Lungs were remarkably fmall, and of a much darker Colour
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than commonly the Lungs are of fuch Rabbets, who have breathed for fome time. No Perfon butmy felf touch'd her, from the frift time that I had eexamined her, to the time of her being deliver'd by me: Her Pains were pretty fmart, and lafted for fome Minites; they went off thie Moment the was deliverd, and fhe feem'd chearful and eafy; walked by herfelf from the Bed-s fide to the Fire, and lat on a Chair, where I examined her; and found, that in the Courfe of the Fallopian Tubes, there were fome Inequalities, but more fenfibly on the right fide of her Belly; which made me conjecture that the Rabbers were bred in thofe Tubes, and only came into the Uterus, when they gave her thofe Agitations, which, according to the account of Mr . Howard, and of feveral other Perfons, B were
were fenfibly felt many Hours before their Exclufion.

As there was no Blood nor Water that iffued from the Vagina, after I had delivered her, I again examined that Part, and found it not in the leaft inflamed or lacerated.

Upon examining her Breafts, I found Milk in one of them, but only a litthe yellowifh Serum in the other.

Her Pule was regular, but formewhat low; her Tongue florid; and upon asking for her Water, thole about her anfwered, the made very little, and that they had not faved any.

She informed us, that in the Interval of her Labour-Pains the was toferably eafy, and had no inclination for any fort of Food but Beef.

About two Hours after we had left her, they came again to call Mr . Howard,

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Howard, fhe being at that Time in violent Labour-Pains ; but he and my felf were gone to fee the Mayor, who was then ill. The Nurfe that attended her had delivered her, before our return, of the lower Part of a Male Rabbet, which we found totally with the Trunk, which I had before extracted: This was alfo ftrip'd of its Skin, and compleatly perfect in all its Parts, but more manifeftly fo in thofe of Generation.

In the Rectum of this Animal, which remain'd affix'd to the Body, we found five or fix Pellets, much of the fame Colour and Confiftence as the common Dung of a Rabbet, little Bodies, like dried Fragments, being matted together with a mucous Matter. The like was obferved in fome other Parts of thofe Rabbets, which had come away before. In the other Bowels there was

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a dinty colour'd Mucus, of the Nature of that which is conftantly found in the Bowels of all foctus Animals, and which in thofe that void their Excrements in Pellets, is commonly hard and dry; but the Matter in the Guts of the firft Animal was of an entire different Kind, Colour and Subfance from any of the reft, this be ing like little Filaments of an Animal Subftance. In the Middle of the Gut Ilium of this Creature, I found a very flender, brittle, white Body, of the Length of half an Inch, which in Shape was like a very fmall Fifh-bones.

- Between fix and feven the fame Evening we again vifited her; we had not been there long, before the fell into violent Labour-Pains, infomuch that four or five Perfons cou'd hardly confine her to an Arm-Chair : As foon as the Violence of the firft

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Pain was fomewhat abated, I examint ed her as before, and found the $V a$ gina perfectly clear; and the Orifice of the Uterus fo far clofed, ass not to admit of the little Finger. I conftantly ftood before her, nor did any Perfon whatfoever touch her, during that Time. After three or four very Atrong Pains, that lafted feveral Minutes, I delivered her of the Skin of the abovefaid Rabbet, rolled and fqueezed up like a Ball, without the leaft Moifture or Blood about it; upon which fhe recover'd of her Pain.

From that Time I did not fit from before her, nor did I withdraw my Hand, but to deliver the Skin to a ftander by.

About ten Minutes after, as near as I can judge, fhe again fell into La-bour-Pains, though more fudden and fhort than the former; at which time

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I again deliver'd her of the Head of the Rabbet, with the Furr on, part of one of the Ears being torn off, alfo without any Blood or Moifture: And as to thefe two Deliveries, and particularly as to the Circumftances of the latter, Mr. Molynieux having drawn up an Account of this whole Affair, for his own private Satisfaction; immediately upon our return to London; I beg leave to refer, for the Conviction he had of the Truth thereof, to that Account, which I have his leave to fay, he will communicate to any Gentleman that is defirous to perufe it.

After this fhe foon grew eafy, and Mr. Howard gave her a fleeping Draught. About ten in the Evening we faw the Woman for the laft Time, fhe being then in Bed: Having felt her Belly, I found it foft, except thofe Lumps, which fill were in the fame place asbeforementioned. Be-

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Between the Times of vificing the Woman, we examined the feveral Rabbets, which were all kept feparate in diftinct Pots, with Spirits of Wine, in the Order that they were brought away.

The firf Animal did not appear to be a perfect Rabbet, in all its Parts, three of the Feet being like the Paws of a Cat, the Stomach and Inteftines like thofe Parts in the fame Animal, as alfo the Shape and Figure of the Thorax; the Lungs and Heart of which were entirely out of their natural Situation, and fqueezed out between the upper Ribbs and Vertebre of the Neck, to which Parts they ftrongly grew and adhered. The Lungs of this Creature, had they been placed in their natural Cavity, would not have filled above a fixth Part of it: The Bones of this Creature being al-

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To differcit in Subftance and Structure, from thofe of common Rabbets, the Head and one Paw only excepted.

All the other thirteen Animals were, in every Particular, like well formed, common, natural Rabbets, from the Size of two Months Growth to four. They were all broken in Pieces, and much in the fame Manner. I fhall deferibe thefe pieces in the Order that Mr. Howard told us they had commonly been broughir away. Firft the four Paws with the Furr on; then the Liver and Inteftines; the Trunk and Shoulders in another Part: In three or four Animals the Loyns feparated from the Os Sacrum ; and in the reft, the Ifchium and Thighs in one piece, with the Loyns ; the Head with its Furr, and laftly the Skin.

When all thefe feveral Parts were put together in their proper Order, they manifefly

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manifeftly made up, and appeared to belong to the above-mentionied Amimall: But the $V i /$ gera were wanting in four or five of them. One remark able Circumftance is, that mot of there Animals were Females, as far as I could judge.

The Heart and Liver of thole which we examined, appeared much larger than ufual, when compared with the Lungs and Intefries which belonged to them; which on the contray were extremely fall. The Vaccum and Colon, which are remarkably large in Rabbets, appeared not to exceed in bignefs the other Inteftines, and the Spiral Structure of the Coccum was not yet unfolded; the Stomach was in like manner much contracted, and its Pilorus very freight and narrow. I could not difcover, in any of the Livers that I examin'd, the Ductus Venofus,

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nor the implantation of the Umbelical Vein in that Organ.

I open'd three or four of the Hearts, and found in every one of them the Foramen Ovale, and the Ductus Arteriof fis fully open, the two Trunks of the Defcendant Cava united at the right Auricle of the Heart, agreeable to that Suructure which is peculiar to natural Rabbets, and fome few other Animals.
The Fleft of thefe Creatures, particularly of that which I extracted, had the fmell of Rabbets juft killed: and the Subftance of their Bones were, in all refpects, like the Bones of Foctus Rabbets; in feveral of them the Epiphyyes were feparated from the Bones themfelves.

All the Heads which I examin'd had their compleat number of Teeth, four Cutters before, and ten Grinders
on each fide, but they appeared not in the leaft worn nor ftained, as the Teech of other Rabbets are by Maftication.

The Nails of the Paws were moft of them exceedingly fharp.

The Skins were all produced, being drefs'd in Allum; they were of feveral Colours, as to their Furf, which was confiderably long, and in one particia larly (which was the fifth Rabbet,) that part which cover'd the Head was curled.

The Rabbet which I extracted weigh'd one and twenty ounces Averdupoize, making an allowance for one of the Paws not yet come away, and part of the Vifcera that were loft.

From all thefe Confiderations I was fully convinced, that at the fame time that the external Appearance of thefe Animals was exactly like fuch Creatures, as muft inevitably undergo the ChanC 2
ges that happen to adult Animals, by Food and Air, they carry'd within them the ftrongeft Marks of Foctus's, even by fuch parts as cannot exift in an Adult, and without which a Focius eannot poffibly be fuppofed to live. This, I think, proves in the frongeft Terms poffible that thefe Animals were of a particular kind, and not bred in a natural Way; nor will there be any doubt remaining (even with the leaft knowing in thefe matters) when thofe parts which are fublervient to the Circulation of the Blood, and Nourifhment between an adult Creature and its Foetus are brought away; which I am fully fatisfied muft fhortly happen, or, if retained, be the Caufe of this Woman's Death.

All thefe Facts were verify'd before his Majefty, on Saturday Nor. the 26 th, by the Anatomical Demonftration of
the
the frt, the third; fifth, and ninth of thee Animals, which were compared with the parts of two natural Rabbets, the one of the Age of four Months; and the other of five Days, Dr. Stegertbal and Dr. Teffer being prefent.

I hall with all convenient feed publifh the Anatomy of the fe Praternatural Rabbets, with their Figures taken from the Life, and compared with the Parts of Rabbets of the fame growth, that the differences before mention'd may be fully underitood.

In the mean while, I foal relate what appeared in the Diffection of two Rabbets, which I performed in the Presence of Mr. Molyneux, the very Day that we returned from Guilford; the one was of four Months growth, and much of the Size of that which I had taken from the Woman, the other was barely fifteen Days old. The Lungs

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Lungs of the larger wore, as nearly as I can judge, twenty times bigger in Capacity than thole of the proternaturall one, and the Lungs of the faller were at leaft eight times the bigness of the fore -mentioned; both thee were exceedingly different, in Colour and Confiftence, from thole of the proternatural Rabbet.

The Foramen Ovate of the faller Rabbet was more than two thirds open, and that in the larger was fo far clofed, as but jut to admit a very foal Probe.

As to the Stomach and Inteftines, the difference was fo notoriounly great from thole we had examined, that even in the fucking Rabbet, the Stomach and. Cocum were at leaf three times larger than thole parts in the preternatural ones.

I hall give no other Account of the Woman,

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Woman, than what I think pertinent to this Subject: By the feveral Queftios which I put to her, I was informed, that the was born and bred at Godlyman; She feem'd to be of a healthy ftrong Conftitution, of a fall frize, and fair Complexion; of a very flue id and fuller Temper: She can neithen write nor read: She has been marreed about fix Years to one Fofbua Toff, Junior, a poor Journey-man Clothier at Godlyman, by whom the has had three Children. The account fie furcher gave of herfelf, was, that on the ${ }_{2}{ }^{3} \mathrm{~d}$ of April lat, as the was weeding in a Field, the flaw a Rabbet Spring up near her, after which the ran, with another Woman that was at work jul by her; this feet her a longing for Rubbets, being then, as the thought, five Weeks gone with Child; the other Woman perceiving the was uneafy, chare-

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ed her with longing for the Rabbet they could not catch, but the deny'd it: foo after another Rabbet fprung up near the fame place, which the endeavour'd likewife to catch. The fame Night the dreamt that the was in a Field with thole two Rabbets in her Lap, and waked with a fick Fit, which lated till Morning; from that time, for above three Months, fie had a conftant and ftrong defire to eat Rabbets, but being very poor and indigent could not procure any. I About Seventeen Weeks after her longing, the was taken with a Flooding and violent Coolick Pains, which made her to mifcarry of a Subflance that fie fid was like 2 large lump of Flefly. Three Weeks after this, the was again taken with a Flooding, and voided another Subfrance like the former, but not fo large. Notwithftanding thefeA accidents, the
did not perceive her felf to grow lefs, but continued with the Symptoms of a breeding Woman; infomuch that in the beginning of September, as fhe was working in the Hop-Ground, the Milk flow'd profufely from her Breafts; and as fhe had Children before, fhe thought the felt very differently from what fhe uled to do. That on the ${ }^{2} 7$ th of September laft fhe was taken very ill in the Night, and fent for her Mother in Law, who is a Midwife, and a neighbouring Woman, at which time fhe voided fomewhat, which fhe took to be the Lights and Guts of a Pig, which her Husband carried to Mr. Howard, who fome Days afterwards came to her and deliver'd her of fome parts of the Animal firft mention'd. After a Fortnight fhe was Churched, and thought all was over

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with her. She told me that her Husband had not cohabited with her, from the time of her firt Mifcarriage; and that afrer the firf Rabbet was brought away, fhe had one regular Menftrual Evacuation.

The Account Mr. Howard gave was, in every material Circumftance, the fame with the Woman's Rclation; he faid the Guts and Liver (as he thought) of a Rabbet were brought to him, but he never knew or heard of the Woman or her Friends till then, and that at firft he took this to be intended as an Impoficion upon him : but was at laft with much Perfuafion prevaild on to go to affift her at Godlyman; that he did accordingly deliver her of part of the firft Rabbet; that he attended her at Godlyman, till the was delivered of the ninth; Rabbet

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but that it being very inconvenient to attend her there, which made him neglect all his other Bufinels, he had brought her to Guilford for better Conveniency.

Mr. Howard further related, that when the was delivered of one Rabbet, another was immediately felt in her Belly, fruggling with fuch Vio lence, that the Motion thereof cou'd be fenfibly felt and feen: That this Motion has fometimes been fo Atrong, as to move the Bed-Clothes, and that it has lafted for twenty and above thirry Hours together. This particular Fact was unanimoufly agreed on, and attefted by moft of the People at Guilford, who have had the Curiofity to go to fee her, and was confirmed to Mr. Molyneux and my felf by above ten different Perfons, who all
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feemed

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feemed to be indifferent in this Matter.

Mr. Howard further told me, that, during this Motion, the was always free from Pain, and chearful; but that immediately upon the ceafing of it, the grew flick, and foo began to perceive her Labour-Pains drawing near; that upon her frt Pains, the Bones of the Animal were fenfibly heard to flap, and break by the violent convulfiveMotions of the Uterus: This lat Circumfance was likewife related by the fame Perfons that attefted the former. He further added, that the had four breakings of Waters in the coming of the Rabbets, although in no great Quantity.

On Wechejclay the 23 d Infant, I fret out again for Guilford, with Mr. D' Artery, being refolved to bring the 2

Woman to Town, if there was any further profpect of more Rabbets. We arrived there at one in the Afternoon, and we found Mr. Howard ftanding at his Door, who told us, that the had been delivered of two more Rabbets fince I had feed her, and that he hoped all was over, being he did not perceive in the Uterus any Motion as ufual. I vifited her feveral times that Day, and proceeded in every refeet as before; her Pains, which, when I faw her the firft Time, were mixed with intervals of Quiet and Reft, now were conftant and fixed on the right Side of her Belly; her Pule was more irregular; the defrribed her Pain as if very coarfe brown Paper was tearing from within her. Toward eight a Clock that Evening the voided a Piece of one of the Membranes of a Placenta, rolled
rolled up like Parchment; when it was extended, it meafured about fix Inches over. The next Morning, as I was packing up forme of the Ribbets to bring to Town with me, Mr. Howard was fent for over, and Mr. D'Anteny, Dr. Hampe, and my self attended him. We found her in exquifite Torture, and after leven or eight Minutes, the was again disburthen'd of a Membrane, in Structure, Shape and Size exactly like the former. This was the frt part that I fao come from her with fome effusion of Blood. She did not lem in the leaft reliev'd after this Operation, her Pule continu'd irregular, her Tongue white; and her Urine deeply ftained with a Miticus: and livid Blood.

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Mr. Ablers having been at Guileford, by his Majesty's Order, (as Mr. Howard told us) to enquire into the Truth of this Fact, was fully convinced of it, as he himfelf declared, having affifted the greateft part of Sunday the roth inftant, at the Delivery of Come of the 16 th Rabbet, which he brought to Town with him. But as on this Occafion his Behaviour has been reprefented here different from what it was at Guilford, I cannot beter vindicate that Gentleman's Character, than by fubjoyning the following Affidavits, which were taken in the prefence of $\mathrm{Mr}: D^{\prime} A n-$ teny, and Doctor Hamper. And that the Truth, fo far as it relates
this Point, may be known, think he is ftrictly obliged, in Juftice

Juftice to the Publick, forthwith to give an Account of what he faw and tranfacted there ; as I here have done.
