3. **Nakuru-Laikipia.** Nakuru & Laikipia Co. i.e. Upper Central RV
4. **Narok/Kajiado.** Narok & Kajiado Counties. i.e. South rift maasailand
5. **Tursam-Pokot.** Turkana, Samburu & West Pokot Counties
6. **Kalenjin Rift-Valley.** Nandi, Uasin-Gishu, Elgeyo-Marakwet, Baringo, Kericho & Bomet & Trans-Nzoia Counties (Notice special inclusion of Trans-Nzoia in the category)
7. **Kakamega Region** - Kakamega & Vihiga Co
8. **Bungoma Region.** Bungoma & Busia Counties
9. **Gusii Nyanza.** Kisii & Nyamira counties
10. **Luo Nyanza** - Kisumu, Siaya, Homa-Bay & Migori Co
11. Region classified as province means exactly that  
 NB Grouping is based on relative voting homogeneity.  
 Does NOT however imply exclusive habitation of an ethnic group in a given region. Don't Ngunyi this!

## EXPLANATIONS

- 1 Analysis based on precedents, coalitions' make-up, the campaigns, common grass-root gauge and opinion polls.
- 2 I have deduced Voter turn-out % for each region and probable vote preference
- 3 NB: 2010 referendum stands as the most recent and credible electoral data. (available on public domain)
- 4 A BOTTOM-TOP forensic number crunch forecasting Mean National Voter Turn-Out of 71%. (A modest increase from 2010 records.)
- 5 The above translates nonetheless to the highest Voter participation in Kenyan history.
- 6 80% Peak turn-out predicted in Central province & Luo Nyanza Home affiliation factor of leading contenders.
- 7 Second highest turn-out in Kalenjin region and Central Rift Valley; 75%.
- 8 Turn-out in Meru/Embu, Nairobi & Maa Counties will closely match the national Average: 70%.
- 9 Western province, Gusii Nyanza and Ukambani vote modestly at 65% below the Mean National Turn-out.
- 10 TURSAM-POKOT & Coast Province projected to vote 60%..
- 11 Lowest turn-out 55% in North-Eastern province & adjacent Upper Eastern
- 12 Insecurity, MRC & other arid hardships could further dent Voter-turn out In Tursam-Pokot, Coast & Northern frontiers.

## ASSUMPTIONS

- 1 Amani Coalition fails to lure the Western vote; CORD heavily carries the province.
- 2 Kalenjins region post luke-worm support for Uhuru; vote failing to match the 2007 . Arap Mibei wave. There are credible reasons for this scenario <http://www.the-star.co.ke/news/article-107784/tyranny-numbers-just-hoax>
- 3 Raila receives "significant minority" backing from the afore-mentioned. Ditto other Jubilee strongholds
- 3 NATIONAL RESOLVE burries the ethnic "tyranny of numbers" in the rest of the country.
- 4 No recurrence of 2007 Nithi/Juja figure cooking (dodgy tallying)
- 5 Raila defeats Uhuru 50%-45%, over 500,000 vote margin.
