

How to Improve Germination of Fine Seeds Especially During Hot Weather Season

Mix "Sorbex". (The Finest Peat Organic) with soil in seed flats and pots. Soil for Seed Flats. 

What Causes Damping-Off? Few growers realize that such diseases as "Damping-Off" and rots of seedlings are caused by living germs. Disease producing germs live normally in the soil and on seeds. The only successful way of preventing these diseases is to sterilize the soil and disinfect the seed.

(Excerpt from Florists' Review, issue of January 24, 1935)

Formaldehyde for Damping-Off. "Dr. C. E. F. Guterman, of the department of plant pathology (Cornell University) told of recent developments in the control of damping-off of seedlings. The use of formaldehyde for treating soils for seed planting was recommended where it is not possible to use steam as a means of sterilization. It was shown that two scant teaspoons of commercial (forty per cent) formaldehyde mixed with about ten teaspoons of water make sufficient solution to treat one average-size flat of soil. The soil is spread out on the bench and sprinkled with the formaldehyde solution. It is then thoroughly mixed and placed in the flat. After the soil has stood twenty-four hours, the seeds may be planted. One pint of formaldehyde is ample to treat fifty flats of soil.

"Marigold Sunset Giants" is a Novelty from California; it is said to have the largest known flowers in the "Marigold" group, averaging 5 inches and some flowers attaining a size of $7\frac{1}{2}$ inches across; they are produced in great profusion; instead of the usual "Marigold" odor these flowers have a definitely sweet fragrance. They are loosely formed, very full centered, with broad, heavy petals gracefully overlapping to make a flower of great depth and even larger than Dahlia Flowered Zinnias. "Sunset Giants" is a mixture ranging from deep orange through golden orange, deep golden yellow, light yellow, lemon yellow, and a delightful new shade of primrose. The strain comes from 60 to 65 per cent double. The plants are normally $3\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 ft. high, but under favorable conditions have been known to grow as much as 7 ft. high. 



Asters Like "Running Start"

Florists should have greater success with asters if they give them a "running start" on the season. In other words, asters need a longer season than the majority of the popular flowers of this area, and it has been found beneficial to plant them inside sometime after mid-March.

The young plants should be transplanted when they have grown large enough to be easily handled and when the ground and climate have become warm. Treated in this manner they should bloom comparatively early.

If you have grown annual candytuft before and found it a poor seller, it is more likely that you had too much of the white variety. Try in its place a few of the colored varieties, such as Pink, Rose, Carmine, Lavender and Crimson and be convinced that this annual is of much use in the florist's establishment in the spring. It will take about five months to bring them into flower indoors. Plans may be made accordingly, taking into consideration the period cut flowers will be of most use to the individual florist. A good time for one planting is soon after the winter holidays as space becomes available. Some growers sow the seed singly, planting out later at the distance of a foot apart.



LIEB'S MARIGOLD

By FRITZ BAHR. Prominent Grower and Horticultural Writer (Excerpt from The Florists' Exchange)

The better you become acquainted with this Winter-flowering Marigold, which is really indispensable to the retail grower, the better you will appreciate its value as a cutflower during the Winter and Spring months. With 2¼ in. or 2½ in. stock planted during September or October on benches about 10 in. apart in a 50-deg, house, you will start to cut during December and continue well into May. There isn't a retail grower who can't realize 50c per doz, for the flowers during the Winter months, and many are sold at 75c or \$1 per doz; even at the lower price, this Marigold will pay for itself as well as almost anything you can carry in a 50-deg, house. The plants will simply insist on flowering and should be at their best during January and February, when other flowers are not too plentiful, and at the same time you probably have to call every day for inexpensive flowers suitable for the table. They are good for a week after being cut if given any care.

All this need not make us think less of Calendulas or anything else we grow on for cutting, but I don't know of anything that persists in flowering as this Marigold does. By disbudding one can obtain long stem, large flowers, but every little side shoot will produce a blossom, and those too short-stemmed will come in handy for funeral work. Of course not all your customers would care for them, but the writer has seen some most attractive wreaths made up with them. The cuttings root freely almost any time of year; those rooted during Fall and the plants grown on in 2½s will be in full bloom by Christmas, fine for made-up dishes and pans.



An early-flowered batch of the showy Tuberous-Rooted Begonias will always be appreciated. And as the tubers are offered either in separate colors or in mixture at reasonable rates, there is no reason why every country florist doing a retail business should not handle a few of them. Both double and single-flowered types may be had. The tubers when received may either be potted at once in a mixture of loam, extremely old manure and sand or placed in peat moss on a bench and lightly sprayed until the top growth and roots start. Usually 4-inch pots will answer well for the tubers, although if larger plants are desired, they can later be given a shift.

These Begonias will grow better if kept fairly warm at this season. 55 degrees at night not being too much. Avoid wetting the foliage as much as possible, and later in the season, as the sun grows in power, some shading during the hottest part of the day will prove beneficial. Not only are the large-flowered Begonias useful as potted plants, but later they are excellent to plant in window or porch boxes where there is considerable shade, as well as for bedding out in positions that are so shady other bedding plants will flower little if at all.





Temperature for Forcing Gladiolus

The best temperature is carnation house temperature (50 to 52 degrees Fahrenheit). Cooler temperatures to start with are satis factory, as the gladiolus starts slowly and will not take kindly to any increase in heat before the bud shows, except the natural increase in heat which the sun gives during bright winter days and in spring.

FORCING GLADIOLUS

The care of the gladiolus after they are started is very simple. Clean culture and careful attention to watering, and caution in not trying to hurry with additional heat is about all that need be mentioned. Exact timing of gladiolus is not practical, but they have a special merit as a cash crop for planting any time between January 15th and March 30th. Gladiolus planted in March will come into bloom in a less number of days than those planted in January. Late January planted bulbs, on an average, will require about 115 to 120 days to come into bloom. Late February plantings will require about 90 to 100 days. Often the same variety of bulbs planted January 15th to February 15th will come into bloom about the same time. The percentage of blindness is greatly increased in the early plantings. For this reason, it is unwise to plant before January 15th. The use of electric light mornings and evenings will not cost more than additional heat and will hasten flowers and help prevent blindness.

Do not rely on one variety as it has been proved that with the gladiolus the very one that does the best one year may prove disappointing another, so it is best to have several varieties. It is also wise to treat the bulbs before planting with corrosive sublimate. The standard formula is 1 ounce to 8 gallons of water. Wooden or earthenware containers only can be used. Bulbs should be left in solution 2 to 3 hours and dried off somewhat before planting.
