This division led by Lieutenant (junior grade) J. B. HANER, could not make an attack on the assigned target at Ishigaki Jima due to cloud cover and poor visibility. They dropped their bombs in level flight from 600' aiming at some industrial buildings at Iriomote, also firing eight rockets.

Patrolling the island area, they next decided to fire rockets and strafe a radio station on Yamao Shima. Several strafing hits and at least one direct rocket hit caused the building to smoke but it did not burn.

Noting an absence of activity in the air at Ishigaki, the division scouted Miyako enroute back to base.

The photo plane was unable to get any coverage.
