Dos and Don'ts (Pavlos)

- Involve community early
- Prepare meetings well, anticipating level of participant knowledge
- Make sure newbies are sufficiently oriented
- Make clear how Wikimedia projects work

- Create high expectations
- Disregard differing time frames (institutions have deadlines by which they want to see outcomes)

Dos and Don'ts (Frans)

Increase outreach to large GLAMs in developing countries to find partners

 Then focus on project in one country, learn, promote, scale

- Enter into a big project without
 - knowing your partner well
 - Having established relationship of trust

Dos and Don'ts (Marta)

- To assure that volunteers complete the expected work, allow for more rounds and cycles of work
- Learn more about volunteer motivation

 Design a project where volunteer motivation isn't the central design feature and driver
