

I will be glad to quote special prices for large quantities of any plants.

I have added a new greenhouse, 16x170 feet long, again this year for starting early plants.

RE-ROOTED PLANTS

I set from 15.000 to 50,000 each of celery, tomato, cabbage, egg and pepper plants each year.

I set no other plants but potted and re-rooted ones, and though I set through the

dryest and hottest weather, I seldom lose any plants.

After I plow down a good clover or other sod in the Spring, harrow the ground several times until it is time to set the plants, drill in from 1,500 to 2,000 pounds of high grade fertilizer per acre, and harrow four or five times until the entire seed bed is as mellow as it can be made. I cannot afford to set any but the best plants, so that I may have a full stand.

After setting the plants I cultivate six or eight times, hoe two or three times and

spray if necessary, and the expense is too great to use any but the best plants.

I have harvested 26 tons of cabbage per acre and sold \$233.80 worth of tomatoes from 1,000 plants. I have sold \$645 worth of celery from three-fourths of an acre.

USE THESE METHODS TO GET LARGEST CROPS

1. Use a good strong soil.

2. Plow down a good heavy sod, or use plenty of well-rotted manure.

Use plenty of high-grade fertilizer to feed the crop.

Prepare the seed bed perfectly by plowing well and harrowing until very fine.
 Use plants from a good strain of seed.

6. Use re-rooted plants to get a perfect stand of strong plants.

7. Hoe and cultivate to keep the soil in fine condition.

Use all these means and harvest a big crop.

Always set good, strong Potted or Re-rooted Plants to make the biggest profits.
