What is it?


- 9-week professional development program for secondary school teachers
- Teachers learn how to use Wikipedia critically and strengthen their media and information literacy skills





What does it include?

- 3 content modules: using Wikipedia to access, evaluate and create information, plus sample lesson plans for Wikipedia-centered activities.
- 5 training sessions.
- 1 online discussion space.





What is the impact?

- Pilot experience: 7000+ teachers
 reached, 500+ participated in program,
 100+ certificates of completion.
- Resources localized in 4 languages.
- 81% of participants feel confident in applying their new knowledge and skills about Wikipedia in the next school year.
- Strategy to scale: Training of Trainers



Module 1: Learn

Participants are able to express the value of the Reading Wikipedia in the Classroom curriculum to a variety of audiences, and they are able to identify areas for localization that ensure the program is in line with pertinent educational policies, practices, and the lived realities of teachers and students.



Module 2: Teach

Participants are able to design and facilitate an engaging program, whether online, offline, or blended, that is focused on the learner's context.




Module 3: Plan

Participants are able to create an implementation plan that includes needs assessment, outreach and partnership, budget, and monitoring & evaluation strategies.



- Synchronous and asynchronous activities
- Fully online on WikiLearn (Open edX)
- Practical assignments, localizable assets that add to a final product
- Active feedback loops and optional weekly office hours



Interested in implementing a localized version of the Reading Wikipedia in the Classroom program in your country.

- Interested in Wikimedia Education work, and desire to build capacity around the development of educational materials, building partnerships in the school system, and teacher training.
- Able to commit **6 dedicated hours per week** for the full duration of the ToT program (8 weeks) to synchronous and asynchronous activities.
- Connected to an organization or institution that works in the local education sector (government, teacher network, non-profit, etc.)



- 1. Check the **information available** in our space on <u>Meta-Wiki</u>. Make sure you are ready to commit to the full program and the CoC.
- To make a strong application think about your motivation to apply for the ToT, the importance of this program for teachers in your country, your previous experiences as a trainer, and how you can make the Reading Wikipedia program sustainable.
- 3. Complete the application form available on Meta-Wiki **before February 20**!
- 4. All applications will be reviewed by a panel and 25 applicants will be invited to join the second cohort of the ToT and start on March 7.


