1. A greatly expanded program of field trips and surveillance work has been instituted by this team. It is expected that at least 50% of the time of Military Government personnel will be spent in the field. In order to accomplish maximum results, arrangements must be made for personnel to spend daylight hours on field work and travel by rail or vehicle at other times.

2. Distances involved often take up the bulk of the day traveling, leaving little time to engage in field activities. As much as six hours can be consumed in travel alone to visit remote areas. This is considered a great waste of time and effort that could be expended more judiciously. The logical solution is an increased number of emergency billet hotels which will obviate the necessity for return to headquarters or making prior arrangements with tactical units who do not have facilities for billeting drivers and interpreters. A two or three day trip can be planned, and maximum effectiveness obtained from the time available, if sleeping accommodations are generally within a 30 minute ride from the site of the field work.

3. Field trip kits are being prepared which include utensils for meals, food and water. Future plans call for including bedding where needed as a trailer unit with the $\frac{1}{2}$ ton truck. This will make the Military Government personnel self-sufficient except for shelter and heating facilities for cooking or warming food.

4. At present, this team has but 4 hotels authorized in Fukuoka Ken. It is proposed to increase this to eleven, located so that a maximum of 30 minutes driving will be required to reach shelter from the bulk of the territory in the Ken. It is understood that, in the past, a policy of reduction of these facilities to four of which in one or two hours driving distance was in effect. It is submitted that this is not presently consonant with the maximum field work on the problems now confronting. Facilities can be provided to permit maximum time of travel, a more comprehensive coverage can

1. Approved.
2. The Kusakabe Hotel which now houses the members of the Moji and Wakamatsu Port Quarantine Team of the Fukuoka Military Government Team, as well as a few members of the Eighth Army Procurement Section, is absolutely necessary. Total number of persons permanently quartered at this hotel at present is one officer six enlisted men.
3. It is expected in the near future that an additional Port Quarantine Team be stationed here with three additional officers.
4. The present conditions of messing arrangements for the personnel is not very satisfactory in that they are required to be at the mess to which they are now assigned at stated hours which do not conform with the duty hours of the men, and in a great many cases they have been unable to obtain meals because of late arrival from the port. In such cases they have had to purchase such food as available at the local Post Exchange. With the rehabilitation of the messhall, the port personnel will be fed at all times.
5. This hotel is also used to house transients who arrive at Kokura for military government activities in Kokura, Yobata, Tobata and Moji, which has a large concentration of industry and is located too far from the Fukuoka Team Headquarters for messing and housing facilities for such visitors.
6. The request contained in the basic letter does not seem excessive and is absolutely necessary for the well being of the personnel assigned to these quarters and it is therefore strongly recommended that the rehabilitation be approved.

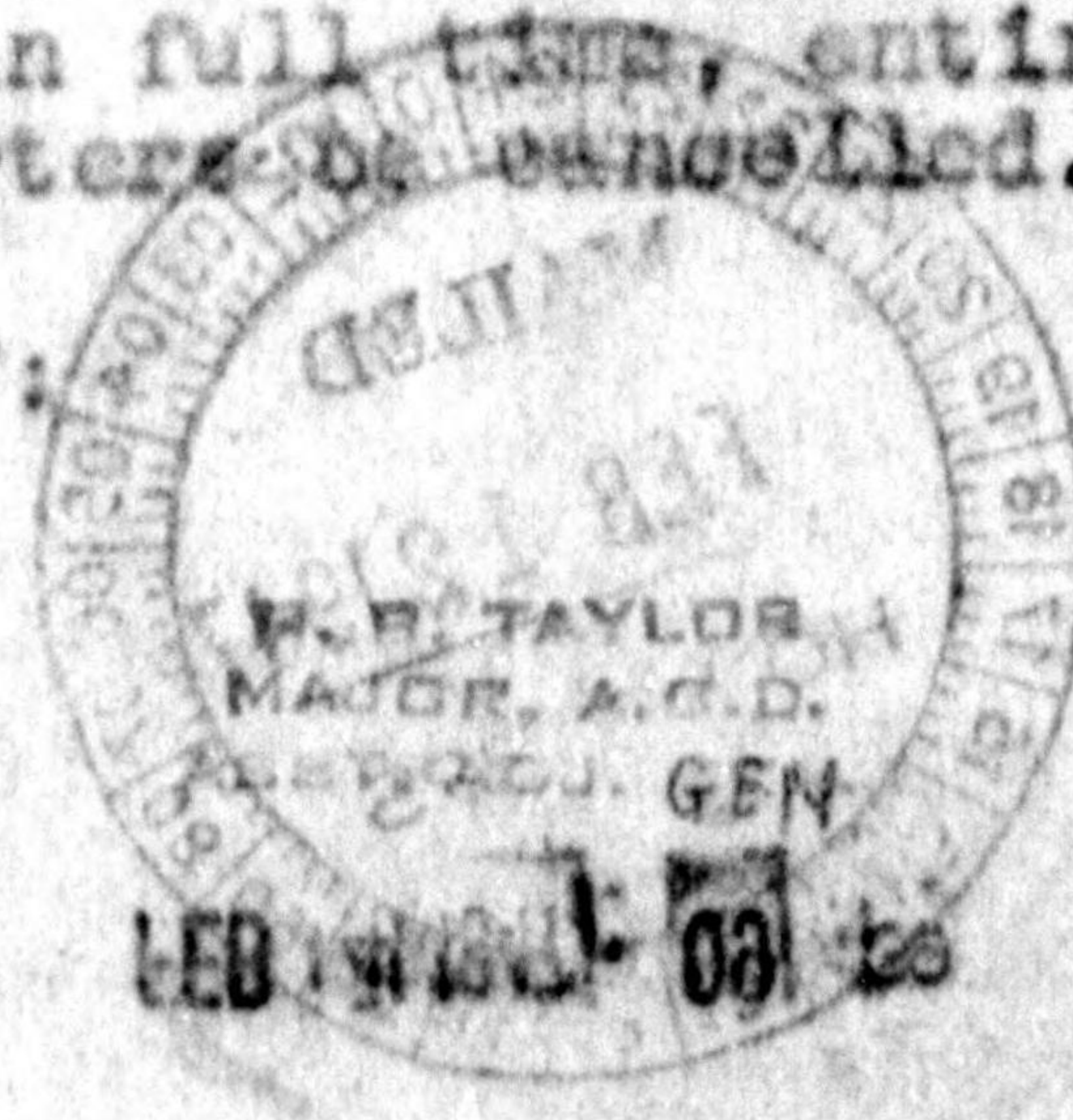

Eighth Army has issued, to Military Government Teams, indefinite quantity procurement demands for transient hotel accommodations in each prefecture in your command to provide for the procuring of accommodations in both "Off Limits" and "On Limits" hotels, the procedure in both cases being the same. The use of "Off Limits" hotels has been included in the procurement demands in anticipation of a directive thereon to be issued in the near future. The use of "Off Limits" hotels will be limited to personnel with competent orders pursuant to such directive.

3. These Procurement Demands will enable transient members of the Occupation Forces to obtain hotel accommodations in areas in which Occupation Forces accommodations are not available. It is felt that the following advantages will accrue:

- a. Establish a definite procedure for procuring transient lodging.
- b. Increase the amount of time spent on the job by transient personnel.
- c. Decrease non-productive vehicle mileage.
- d. Make it more practical to visit areas which heretofore have been difficult to visit due to distance and lack of lodging.

4. It is desired that any outstanding Procurement Demands for transient hotel accommodations (other than full time, entire occupancy as billets) issued by your headquarters be cancelled.

1. Forwarded as enclosures hereto are expanded reports on "On Limits" hotels from Oita, Kumamoto, and Fukuoka Kens.

2. Considerable difficulty has been experienced by this command in meeting requirements for reports on "On Limits" hotels to be submitted under Circular 287, Headquarters Eighth Army, dated 15 October 1946, and as requested by various telephone calls and TWX messages from I Corps and Kinki Military Government Region. This difficulty has been largely due to confusion as to just what use higher headquarters desires to make of these hotels, and to what extent military government will be responsible for the inspection, sanitation, and supervision of cooking in the hotels and control of Occupation Force visitors to these hotels.

3. The general situation as regards hotels in Kyushu is as follows: Kyushu is a relatively provincial area, and four of its seven prefectures are extremely provincial. Its first class hotels are, for the most part, first class in name only, and only almost uninhabitable shambles pass for second and third class hotels. Many of the best hotels, in the heart of the larger cities, were destroyed by fire and bombing. The remaining genuinely first class hotels, as at Beppu, Kagoshima, Fukuoka, Kokura, Kumamoto, and Mt. Aso, have already been taken over by the Occupation Forces. Those that remain do not meet the standards required to accomodate high ranking officers or civilians, or female dependent personnel on business or recreational trips. At best, they would provide only barely adequate accomodations, (futons for beds, Japanese style bath and latrines), for those who would be willing to put up with considerable discomfort in order to accomplish important business in the area. To put such hotels "on limits" for men and women expecting the comforts and pleasant surroundings associated with recreational travel would undoubtedly bring an unending series of vehement complaints against those having immediate responsibility.

4. In view of the above situation, it is strongly felt that unless there are extremely urgent reasons, no additional hotels in Kyushu should be completely vacated of Japanese guests, thus increasing an already critical shortage of such accomodations.

5. When recommendations for "On Limits" hotels were initially requested from team commanders, Kyushu, these recommendations were made with the needs of their own reparations teams and school inspection teams in view. These teams often comprise enlisted men and Neisei who expect to, and are willing to, put up with the limitations of provincial hotels in order to accomplish the business required by field trips. These recommendations called for the use of only one or two rooms in the hotels. But these hotels do not meet the standards that would be expected by most recreational visitors from Honshu and are not recommended for such use, nor are they recommended for the use of personnel accustomed to good accommodations.

6. The question arises whether recommendations of "On Limits" hotels will eventually involve military government in additional duties in connection therewith, which will involve additional duties for its already heavily burdened personnel and which will seriously prejudice the efficient conduct of more pertinent duties. At the present time, facilities already exist for taking care of a large number of official visitors to Kyushu, and these provide a far higher standard of accommodations than can possibly be obtained in additional "On Limits" hotels.

7. It is strongly recommended that the purposes and responsibilities involved in setting up "On Limits" hotels in Kyushu be clarified and that a stencilled form calling for all information required as a basis for such recommendations be forwarded to this headquarters for submission to teams. Only in this way can an indeterminate series of "expanded" reports be avoided.

a. Baths in the Senshin-Kaku and Nabeya Ryokan hotels are hot sulphur water baths continuously running and those of the Wataya Ryokan and Kikuya Ryokan are heated baths of reservoir water. In each hotel private baths can be set aside for occupation force use. In these hotels the baths are cleaned each and every week, since patrols have been using these same baths continually since the occupation began.

b. None of these hotels have beds of the type used by

our forces, but are of the Japanese variety known as the "futon".

c. Rooms can be set aside for exclusive use of allied personnel.

d. None of these hotels have wire screening against insects but do have individual nets for sleeping purposes.

e. The work of spreading insecticides is done under the supervision of Military Government each month with the use of the Japanese Health Department plus additional insect control by the hotels.

f. Hotels are accessible by motor and rail except the Kikuya Ryokan in Amakusa Gun which is accessible by water and road.

g. The hotels requested as "On Limits" Hotels are not suitable according to American standards for female personnel, but are to be used for people on patrols and inspection trips into different parts of Kumanoto Ken. All these hotels have been in use from time to time by occupation personnel, and are found to be clean and well kept.

1. Submitted herewith is supplementary report for "On Limits" Hotels in Kumamoto Ken as per verbal instructions of Mr. Mossman.

2. It is also requested that one additional hotel be listed to letter Serial No. 544, dated 27 Dec 46, subject "On Limits" Hotels as per basic letter HQ I Corps, AG 630-B, 16 Dec 46, and in accordance with par 5 Section 1 Circular 287, Eighth Army dtd 15 Oct 46.

3. The following hotel is submitted for addition to previous list;

LOCATION:	Hondo Machi, Amakusa Gun

BEDS:	None - (futons)
WATER:	Water Supply
TOILET:	Japanese style

INSECT CONTROL:	Wire screen -- none In summer use of insecticide twice a month.

4. The following additional information is submitted on all hotels requested to be put "On Limits".

a. Baths in the Senshin-Kaku and Nabeya Ryokan hotels are hot sulphur water baths continuously running and those of the Wataya Ryokan and Kikuya Ryokan are heated baths of reservoir water. In each hotel private baths can be set aside for occupation force use. In these hotels the baths are cleaned each and every week, since patrols have been using these same baths continually since the occupation began.

b. None of these hotels have beds of the type used by

our forces, but are of the Japanese variety known as the "futon".

c. Rooms can be set aside for exclusive use of allied personnel.

d. None of those hotels have wire screening against insects but do have individual nets for sleeping purposes.

e. The work of spreading insecticides is done under the supervision of Military Government each month with the use of the Japanese Health Department plus additional insect control by the hotels.

f. Hotels are accessible by motor and rail except the Kikuya Ryokan in Amakusa Gun which is accessible by water and road.

g. The hotels requested as "On Limits" Hotels are not suitable according to American standards for female personnel, but are to be used for people on patrols and inspection trips into different parts of Kumamoto Ken. All these hotels have been in use from time to time by occupation personnel, and are found to be clean and well kept.

1. In order to provide authorized billets for the ever increasing number of sightseers, inspection teams and investigating parties now traveling over Japan it is desired to establish "On Limits" Hotels under the provisions of Circular 287, Eighth Army, 15 October 1946 at key points within the Corps Zone of Responsibility. Such Hotels should be established at points which by their nature are tourist centers or are conveniently located to accommodate transient motor travelers proceeding from one inspection area to another and forced to remain in the field over night. It must be borne in mind that accommodations must be provided both male and female guests.

2. You are directed to survey your area of responsibility and make recommendation not later than 31 December 1946 to this headquarters of the number of "On Limits" Hotels that should be established in your area to provide accommodations at points not adequately serviced by official billets or to augment such billets when they are inadequate for transient requirements. This report will give the information required in paragraph 5, Section I, Circular 287, Hq Eighth Army, cs. In addition to the above information a schedule of rates will be included.

3. After the original establishment of this chain of hotels it is contemplated requiring the Japanese authorities to place signs on all other hotels "Off Limits to Occupation Personnel". Thereafter hotels will pass from one category to the other upon recommendation of the Area Commander approved by this headquarters.
