He was assigned to be the doctor in charge of POW Camp in Korea from the beginning of the establishment of such camp there until the end of the war.

The facts concerning which this witness can give testimony are that he was the camp doctor during the entire period of the existence of POW Camp in Korea and that he is able to testify as to the actual health condition of POW's in Korea.

The relevancy of this testimony lies in that the defendant Itagaki was the Commander-in-Chief of the Korean Army from March 1941 to April 1945, and that he is charged for "some responsibility" for the mistreatment of POW's.
