The Department is informed that the military authorities in Japan have granted permission for Mrs. Adrienne Franziska Wada, a Austrian national, and her son, Syoti, residing at Wassenbruchstrasse 87, The Hague, Holland, to enter Japan provided their transportation is arranged at no expense to the United States. The purpose of Mrs. Wada's trip is to join her husband in Japan.

No adverse information concerning these persons has been determined from the Department's files and unless such information is available to the Embassy, the case may be handled without further reference to the Department. The Austrian Legation at The Hague should be given the information contained in the first paragraph above. In this connection refer to FSS 667 and 668 of January 17, 1947. In accordance with paragraph 9a of Circular No. 8 issued August 30, 1946 by SCAP at Tokyo, inform the Austrian Legation that it should give to Mrs. Wada and her son, in addition to their passports, a statement in English indicating that they have been cleared by SCAP for entry into Japan and containing the same information as required under paragraph 7b of Circular No. 8. Aforementioned statement will serve in lieu of military permit.

Mrs. Wada's statement that she has been cleared for entry into Japan may be given her by the Austrian Legation at The Hague which is the proper procedure in such cases. The existence of this legation was confirmed by a telephone call by Mr. O'Brien to the Austrian Legation at Washington.



Other evidence may be required by the Secretary of State concerning the facts in the applicant's case before a conclusion is reached on the application.

The receipt of the application will be acknowledged, and the applicant will be notified later concerning the decision reached upon the application. If the permit to depart is granted it will be forwarded to the appropriate authorities at the port through which the applicant intends to depart from the United States, and the application number will appear on a notification card which will be sent to the applicant. By calling upon the port authorities prior to or at the time of departure and presenting the notification card and identifying himself as the person to whom permission to depart has been granted by the Secretary of State, the applicant may be permitted to depart from the United States **through the port specified.**

EXTENSION OF AID TO MISSIONARIES

1. The purpose of this directive is to restate the present SCAP policy in regard to the extension of aid by military personnel to missionaries in Japan.

2. General.

a. Missionaries will be cleared by SCAP for entry into Japan if written assurances are received from any missionary (representative or operating) resident in Japan for one (1) year since V-J Day, that said missionary will not become a public charge or a charge upon the Occupation Forces and will not engage in commercial or other unauthorized activity. The assurances must be endorsed by the respective representative missionaries.

b. Organizations which carried on missionary activities in Japan prior to the war, but which have no missionaries in Japan to give assurances, may send a representative who will be temporarily supported from United States Army sources on a revenue basis until such time as they can become self-sufficient. This temporary support will not extend beyond sixty (60) days after time of arrival of representative missionary in Japan, except by specific authority of SCAP. Credentials of representative missionaries will be carefully examined by Eighth Army service and supply agencies before any services or supplies are provided. Representative missionaries will be urged and encouraged to become self-sufficient as quickly as possible. Representative missionaries are permitted use of United States Army postal facilities for the duration of their stay in Japan. Until these representatives have resided for one (1) year in Japan, they are not competent to give or endorse the assurances prescribed in paragraph 2a above.

c. In order to clear operating missionaries for entry into Japan, they must give assurances to SCAP that:

(1) Adequate shelter, not under requisition by Occupation Forces, is available for the individual for whom clearance is desired.

(2) The individual

(2) The individual either has had prior service as a missionary in Japan or, lacking such prior service, possesses a working knowledge of spoken Japanese or is to fill a position of a technical nature not requiring such knowledge. In the event that the missionary has not had prior service in Japan, he or she must be associated directly with a person who has had one (1) year of missionary service in Japan. Upon completion of a year of service in Japan, operating missionaries who have entered Japan under the provisions of this paragraph may give assurances cited in Paragraph 2a, above.

d. No discrimination will be made because of sex or nationality, among bona fide missionaries.

e. Dependents of missionaries will be admitted subject to the following conditions:

(1) Children must be at least one (1) year of age.

(2) Assurances must be given SCAP by respective representative missionaries that adequate medical facilities are readily available for children under 18 years of age. Such facilities must be other than those operated by the Occupation Forces.

f. The Occupation Forces specifically assume no obligation for the transportation to Japan, health or welfare of missionaries or their dependents.

g. Travel to Japan will be on a space available revenue basis.

h. Representatives giving or endorsing assurances cited in paragraphs 2a and 2c above, should, at the same time request authorization from SCAP to ship food, clothing or other immediate necessities required, on a space available revenue basis. These shipments should, insofar as practicable, accompany the individuals concerned. Requests will, however, be honored by SCAP from duly designated representatives of various organizations and sects, to authorize the shipment of additional food, clothing and other necessary supplies after the arrival of operating missionaries. Shipments may not include more than one (1) ton of food per individual per annum. If shipment of household goods is desired, application for such shipment should be made to SCAP at the time necessary assurances are given in connection with request for clearance. Such household goods may be shipped on a space available revenue basis. Shipments of petroleum products, automotive maintenance

maintenance supplies, prefabricated housing, motor vehicles and food (which is limited to one ton per annum per individual) may be authorized by SCAP on space available revenue basis, provided mission boards or cooperatives are able to make individual outside arrangements for such shipments and for their storage or transportation after arrival. Individual shipments smaller than bulk, but too large for international mail, will be considered by SCAP on their own merits. All shipments into Japan will be for personal use of missionaries and are subject to SCAP approval.

3. Extension of Aid.

a. Use of United States Army supplies and facilities will be extended to the operating missionaries, with approval of SCAP, only in cases of emergency to prevent extreme hardship and suffering and then only on a revenue basis and only to the same extent and on the same basis as such privileges are available to other individuals of the same nationality. However, minimum assistance to prevent hardship will be provided upon their arrival, on a revenue basis, and transportation, on a revenue basis, will be arranged for operating missionaries from the port of debarkation to the rail station nearest their ultimate destination only.

b. Use of United States Army supplies and facilities will be extended temporarily to the representative missionaries prescribed in paragraph 2b above.

c. Except when authorized in paragraphs 3a and b above, or upon specific direction from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, missionaries and missionary groups will not be permitted to purchase from United States Army commissaries, post exchanges or other installations.

d. Missionaries may possess military payment certificates only when access to United States Army facilities is authorized and then only for the purpose of making authorized purchases.

e. The Religions Division, Civil Information and Education Section, GHQ, SCAP (tel. 26-5600) may be contacted in cases of emergency, where it is necessary to place newly arrived or other missionaries in communication with representatives of their organization. During off duty hours, the Foreign Missions Conference of North America (telephone 45-0438) or the Apostolic Delegation (telephone 33-0959 or 33-0782) may be contacted.

f. Vehicles owned and operated by missionaries or religious organizations will be registered by the Japanese Government as provided for in Circular 2, SCAP,

4. Special visits for short duration, by high officials in the organization or hierarchy of any church, may be authorized by SCAP, upon receipt of assurances from representative missionaries that logistic support will be furnished from mission resources in Japan. This is an exception to the above policy.

5. This policy has been announced to respective representative missionaries and is now in effect.

6. Operational Directive 17, this headquarters, 19 February 1947, subject: "Extension of Aid to Missionaries", is rescinded.

DISCUSSION:

The Department received an application (in duplicate) submitted by the Panamanian Embassy under cover of its note of September 9, 1947 for Mr. Meyer Abadi, a Panamanian national, to secure a military permit to enter Japan. The Department transmitted Mr. Abadi's application to the Civil Affairs Division of the Department of the Army for SCAP's approval or disapproval. CAD in a letter dated October 14, 1947 informed the Department that Mr. Abadi's application was refused by SCAP on the grounds that he did not furnish enough information regarding his purposes in Japan, his method of travel, etc. It is proposed to make SCAP's views known to the Panamanian Embassy by the underlying draft note and to suggest that Mr. Abadi re-submit his application in more detail.

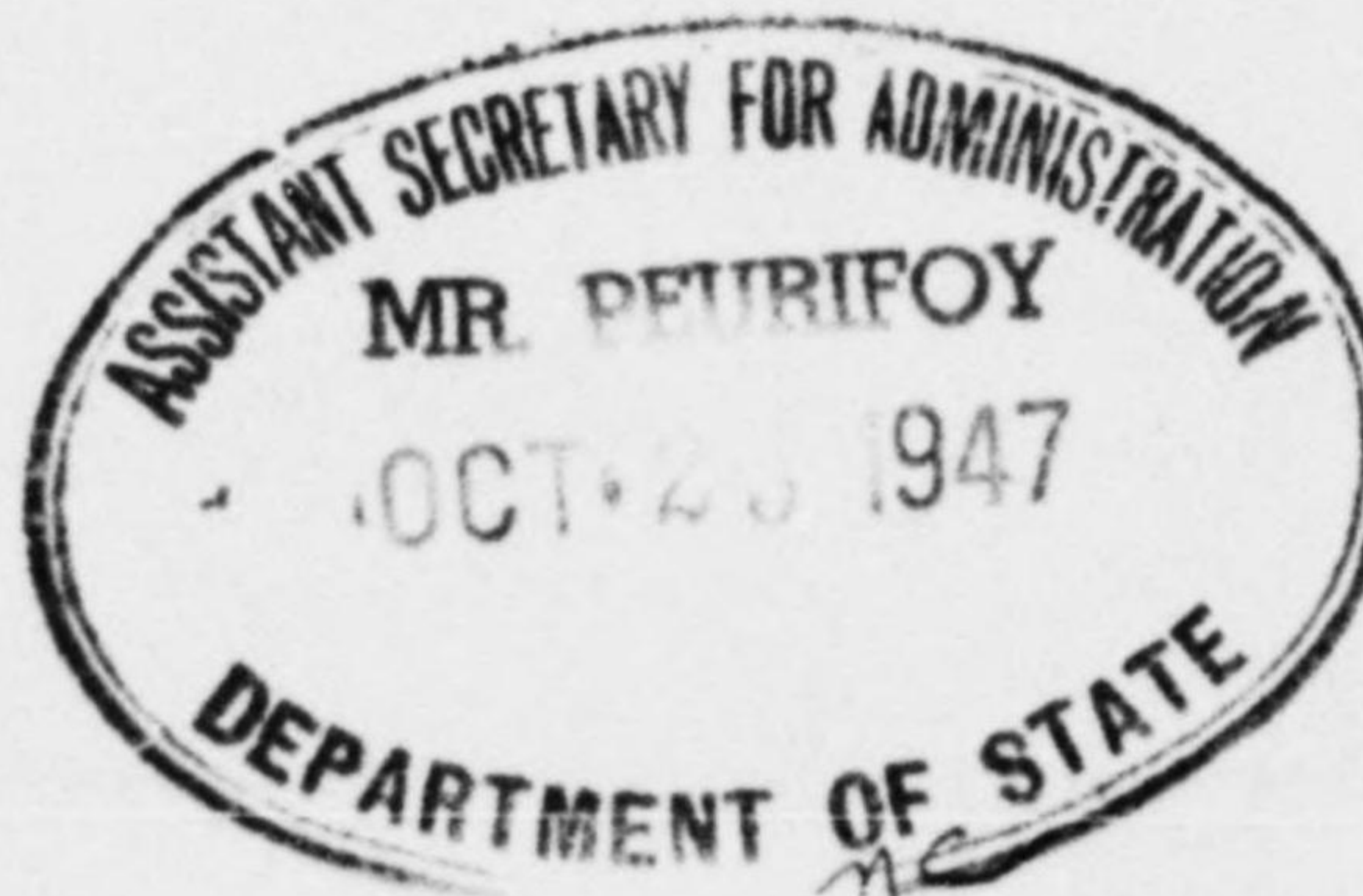

My dear Mr. Katzman:

I refer to your letter of September 29, 1947 addressed to Mr. Haering of the Visa Division of this Department and to previous correspondence regarding your desire to travel to Japan for business reasons.

In this connection there is enclosed a Military Permit which has been received by the Department of State indicating that you have been cleared for entry into Japan between October 15 and October 30, 1947. It will be noted that the permit is valid for 21 days subsequent to the date of your entry into Japan and that you will need two standard passport photographs measuring 1-1/4 by 1-3/4 inches.

The exit permit requirement has been waived in your case and the Central Office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Department of Justice at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania has been informed of this fact. It is understood that the latter office will inform the Immigration and Naturalization Service offices at Seattle, Washington and at Los Angeles and San Francisco, California, respectively, of the waiver.

Unofficial reports have been received by this office that Commercial Air Lines are accepting passengers for intransit travel of Japan without proper documentation (transit Military Permit) for such travel. However, prior to sending instructions to Pan American and Northwest Airlines regarding this matter confirmation is respectfully requested as to whether the following American Consuls have been notified that they are permitted to issue authority for foreign nationals to transit Japan by air without referral to Department of State:

- American Consuls: Manila
- Nanking
- Shanghai
- Peiping
- Hongkong
- Seoul and Vancouver

The Department's views are desired with regards to authorizing the Governors of Hawaii and Guam and Passport Agents, San Francisco and New York to issue authority for such intransit travel to foreign nationals. These officials now have authority to validate American citizens' passports for intransit travel of Japan.

Dear Mr. Chappell:

As the result of queries from your Division this office requested the views of the Commander-in-Chief Far East regarding American Consuls Manila, Nanking, Shanghai, Peiping, Hongkong, Seoul and Vancouver, issuing authorization for foreign nationals to transit Japan.

The Commander-in-Chief Far East concurred in this request provided such clearances be authorized only in cases of individuals traveling via commercial aircraft. Stopover contemplated will not exceed normal refueling stops or stop for emergency weather conditions or mechanical failure. Individuals cleared in this manner must understand that while in Japan they are subject to all rules and regulations promulgated by S.C.A.P. and enforced by agencies which S.C.A.P. designates and that civilian carrier concerned are considered to have general responsibility for their conduct.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE FILES

Mr. Williams called Mrs. Flickinger (Military Permit Section, War Department) to discuss the issuance by certain American consulates of military permits authorizing the transit of Japan by aliens traveling by air.

Mr. Williams referred to the CINCPAC cable (ZX 49231 (MCN 51386) June 4, 1947) which authorized the adoption of such procedure for Americans making short stops in Japan while in an air transit status and which was thought broad enough to cover similar treatment for aliens.

Mr. Williams stated that DS had now obtained a copy of the cable and did not feel, after examining it, that the language was broad enough to justify authorizing American consulates to endorse alien passports for such transit.

After some discussion it was agreed that the Military Permit Section would cable Tokyo for assurance on the point. Mrs. Flickinger promised to let Mr. Williams know as soon as an answer came in.

My dear Colonel Lynch:

I refer to your letter of October 16, 1947 concerning the problem of documentation for commercial air line passengers passing in transit through Japan.

Your letter inquires first, whether a group of American consulates have been notified that they have authority to document foreign nationals for such transit without reference to the Department of State. You are informed that the consulates mentioned were notified of this authority by circular telegram on October 22, 1947.

Your letter requests in the second place an expression of the Department's views with respect to empowering the Governors of Hawaii and Guam, and the Passport Agents of the Department at San Francisco and New York to authorize transits of Japan for foreign nationals travelling by air. You point out that these officials have authority to validate the passports of American citizens for such transit travel of Japan.

While desiring in every way possible to ease the administrative burdens of both your office and the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at Tokyo, the Department considers that it would be unwise to undertake additional responsibility in connection with the issuance of authorizations to foreign nationals for the transit of Japan by air. The reasons underlying this view are set forth below. For the same reasons, it would appear that the Department may have acted too hastily in authorizing the American consulates referred to above to perform such services for aliens. Consequently, the Department may wish after further consideration to rescind the instructions contained in its circular telegram of October 22.

It is logical and proper for the Department to assume the responsibility of validating the passports of American citizens for the transit of Japan because the documentation of American citizens for travel abroad, to the extent that they require documentation issued solely in the name of the Government of the United States, is the sole responsibility of the Department of State operating through its Passport Division.

The same reasoning, however, cannot be applied with respect to persons who are not citizens of the United States. The Department of State is not in a position on its own authority to document such persons for travel in areas not under the direct control of the United States Government. It is not appropriate for the Department to do so because the permission of an alien to travel in an area not under the jurisdiction of the United States is a matter for the decision of his own Government on the one hand, and the authority of the area through which he proposes to travel on the other. Neither is it practical for the Department to do so, in as much as it cannot be expected that the Department will either be in possession of or have access to information regarding the character, activities, or general responsibility of an individual alien, especially if the alien is not a resident of the United States.

In connection with the subject of travel to Japan, it must be remembered that no discretionary duties are imposed upon the Department of State under the procedure outlined in the Supreme Commander's Circular 8 of August 30, 1946 and that the Department has at no time undertaken to authorize the travel of any alien individual to Japan. Under Circular 8 the Department acts merely as an agent for the transmission of information between the Supreme Commander and the representatives of various governments in Washington or individual aliens who are residents of the United States.

Even if the Department of State wished to assume the responsibility for authorizing the travel of aliens in transit through Japan there would be no basis for deciding the eligibility of individual travelers because the Department has been furnished with no set of standards for determining who may and who may not enter Japan in transit.

In view of the foregoing it is thought that your office may wish to inquire of the military authorities in Japan

whether

whether an agreement cannot be reached with the commercial airlines concerned whereby the transit documentation of non-American through passengers may be waived or dispensed with if the airlines are willing to be held responsible for the custody and onward movement of such passengers who may be temporarily landed in Japan while en route between points outside the jurisdiction of the Supreme Commander.

If the military authorities in Japan still consider it desirable that non-American travelers in an air transit status be in possession of some form of endorsement issued on the authority of the Department of State, it will have to be understood that the documentation thus given will be pro forma in the strictest sense and will in no way imply an assumption by the Department or the issuing officer of responsibility for the character, status, bona fides or actions of the non-American individual concerned.

Documentation for intransit travel through Japan of civil Airline passengers is no longer required. It is now the responsibility of civil airline carriers concerned to inform passengers transiting Japan that the passengers are subject to all rules and regulations promulgated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers while in Japan for normal refueling stop or stop for emergency weather conditions or mechanical failure.

The civil airline concerned must also exercise general responsibility for the conduct of its passengers while the passengers are in Japan.

Pan American and Northwest Airlines will be notified of the above.
