1. G-2 FEC is not in complete accord with the strength estimates deduced by G-2 USAFIK and makes the following comments with reference to basic communication and inclosure #1, thereto:

a. It is believed that the strength estimate of School Troops (3,550) in GHQ is high. GHQ total was formerly carried at 2,245 as opposed to the new estimate of 5,540. It is not felt that such an upward revision is justified on the basis of "two or more reports" (see par 1 b, basic).

b. FEC accepts tentatively the existence of the 3rd Division.

c. The Manchurian Division has not been firmly established as a part of the Korean Peoples Army. Its strength, if carried, should be done with extreme reservation.

d. FEC tentatively accepts the New Independent Mixed Brigade, the Tank Regiment and the Air Training Unit at the indicated strengths.

e. FEC does not accept the unexplained deletion of the 5,000 man concentration previously carried at Hoeryang nor the unexplained deletion of the unidentified Artillery Brigade (2,150) on the Hodo Peninsula. USAFIK has dropped these concentrations without comment and has not attempted to show any strength redistribution. Pending clarification, FEC will continue to carry these units.

2. FEC currently estimates the strength of the North Korean Peoples Army at 60/64,000 including troops referred to in 1 (e) above.

SUMMARY:

1. Following publications prepared by G-2, GHQ, FEC contain all the information that is known at this time concerning Signal Units of the Outer Mongolian Army:

(a) Intell Summary 1756, 21 March 1947: A Division consists of three Cav. Regts., one Arty Bn. (1 - 105mm Co., 1 - 75 mm How Co., 1 - 4.5 AT Co.), one Motor Bn. (3 Co's.), one QM Trk Bn., one Signal Co., one CW Co., one Eng Co., and one Field Hospital.

(b) Intell Summary 1938, 24 Oct 1947: The Divisional set-up of the 31st Mixed Corps at Dzamun Ude is: three Inf Regts., one Arty Rgt., one Tnk Bn., one Cav Bn., and one Signal Bn.

(c) Intell Summary 1951, 8 Nov 1947: Telephone Service to Ulan Bator from Saphaheitzufu has been offered since 1 May 1947 and the city is connected to Chita and Khabarovsk by radiophone. (F-3).

(d) Intell Summary 2000, 9 Jan 1948: Telephone and telegraph lines strung along the Ulan Bator-Kyakhto Highway. No electric wires observed.

(e) Intell Summary 2225, 3 Oct 1948: A phone line extends from the Brigade Hqs at Chitai to Peitaochiao. All communication with the Peitashan Hqs is by radio. There is a radio station at Liukoshu and another at Peitashan Rgt Hqs.

(f) Intell Summary 2304, 30 Dec 1948: There are radio stations in all the aimaks of Outer Mongolia, with a large central station in Ulan Bator. All Soviet Army Hqs and Detachments in Outer Mongolia have their own radio stations. The broadcasts from the main station in Ulan Bator is heard in Peiping. Thus far little or nothing of significance has been heard. The broadcasts consist mostly of Soviet propaganda. Most of it is directed against the U.S., and material of interest only in Mongolia.

(g) Intell Summary 2141 & 2341, 25 June 1948 & 5 Feb 1949: Mongolian Forces, both the RA and Border units have signal units.
