1. (C) CIRCUNSTANCES OF CENTACT:

a. Parties Involved; Source 8559 and AH-D. Lessman (CH:Leiter)

b. Purposes Routine contact to determine developments in joint OCA Hamburg/513th operation.

o. Exact time, date and place: On 26 Sept 67, telephonic contact with SUBJECT revealed that He had made some progress in contacting potential interviewes, and that He would be available for discussion of same at the AH's convenience. In view of a requirement for Him to travel to Benn, CPR for a discussion of His book 'China Today' with the Ministry of the Interior during the week of 25 - 30 Sept 67, it was agreed that the AH would travel to Hamburg, and would contact Him telephonically on the morning of 1 October 67 to arrange a time and site for an operational meeting. As per agreements, at 0940 hours, 1 Oct 67, AH called from the Hamptbahnhef, Hamburg, and completed arrangements with SUBJECT for a meeting to be held at OCT 1-CMF, BR 048 66 at 1700 hours the same day. SUBJECT arrived at the CMF at 1705 hours, where operational discussions were continued until His departure at 1840 hours.

- . d. Security measures: No attempt at surveillance was noted by the AH enroute to the CMF, nor during or after the meeting described herein. SUBJECT walked to the meeting site from a U-Bahn.sub-station approximately one block distant. It is unknown if He was surveilled, and He did not mention such to the AH.
  - e. Language used: English and Chinese Mandarin.
- f. AA's: In view of the possibility of an intercept of His outgoing mail, and of the complications that would arise with the British in this respect, SUBJECT was instructed to destroy the AA previously given to Him, and to make no attempt to contact AH through mail channels. SUBJECT was not informed of the actual reason for not using the AA, but was advised that AH's friend, who formerly resided at that address, had returned to the U.S ..
- g. USI telephone numbers: SUBJECT was provided the following telsphone numbers to be used in the event He should desire to contact AH at any time
- (1) Frankfurt civilian-553798: To be used on week days from 0800-1700 hours. This telephone located in the operations office, OCT 1.
- (2) Frankfurt civilian-525523: To be used on weekends and after 1700 hours on weekdays. This telephone located at one of the OCT #1 CMFs DOWNGRADED AT 12 YEAR INTERVALS;

h. Discrepancies or incidents: None.

i. Close of Meeting and New Meeting Arrangements: The meeting described herein was terminated at 1840 hours when SUBJECT departed the CMF enroute to His home. SUBJECT advised that failure of the concerned Insurance Company to forward necessary approval for His wife's medical treatments in Frank-furt and that pending receipt of this approval, He and His wife will travel to the island of Helgoland for a two week period so as to enable her to gain the medicinal benefits of the warm see baths for which that island is noted. SUBJECT further advised that He was scheduled to depart Hamburg on 2 October, and would return on 16 October 67. In view of above, SUBJECT was informed that AH will contact Him telephonically after His return to Hamburg, and will make arrangements for the next meeting time and site.

#### 2. (C) OPERATIONAL MATTERS:

- a. SUBJECT was very apologetic for His lack of production since last meeting, and averred that the requirements of His position at Ostasiantischer Verein, and finalizing and delivery of His latest book on China to the Ministry of the Interior in Bomm, has monopolised all of His time, to include all weekends. SUBJECT stated that whereas His normal activities have made it very difficult for Him to devote as much time to operational matters as He would desire, In spite of His abnormal heavy workload He has given considerable thought to the operation, and has accomplished the following:
- (1) Contact with SEEBODA and commencement of SEEBODA's participation as Legman/Interviewer. SUBJECT states that He has provided SEEBODA with the names of several prospective Interviewees in the Hamburg area, and that He was to meet with SEEBODA immediately following the meeting with AH so as to provide him with operational guidance and questions to be used in contacts with the Interviewees.
- (2) Telephonic contact with WIESSNER, Offried Peter, to complete arrangements for an interview to be conducted by SUBJECT o/a 15 November 67. NOTE: WIESSNER's name is reflected on 513th list of potential Interviewes, and is further identified as X-41367. SUBJECT advised that His conversation with WIESSNER disclosed that he recently returned from a four months stay in the area of LANCHOU (3602E/10341B), Capital of Kansu province, where he was employed as a technical representative for an undentified West German firm involved in the installation of compressors and refrigeration equipulpment to cool hot gases in an oil refinery. SUBJECT opined that the oil refinery in mention probably processes crude oil from Sinkiang province. SUBJECT stated that in addition to appearing somewhat flattered at the interest exhibited in him, WIESSNER assured SUBJECT that he would be very happy to meet with Him for a discussion of his stay in China at SUBJECT's convenience. The meeting has been tentatively set for o/a 15 November 67, with the understanding that SUBJECT will make

SUBJECT further stated that BARTKE informed Him that he is currently negotiating with the Volkswagen Foundation for a scholarship grant, and that if successful in his efforts, he will travel to the U.S. to attend a course of advance study in Sinology at the University of Michigan.

which was then being founded (September 1968) by Marcus SCHOLZ, a respected film director and friend of CAHELM. This self-styled institution of the "Extra-parliamentary Opposition" (APO) which literally overnight became the Mecca for all local radical groups, was to serve as Subject's forum and observation post. Subject joined the Club as a charter member and through his efforts of the past six months is accepted today as a comrade in arms.

- 4. Today he is quite active in the Club, spending two or three nights a week there in addition to assisting occasionally with special ad hoc projects, such as serving on a committee or ferrying protestors to Berlin. He has managed to remain close to the RCH leadership while at the same time scrupulously avoiding an alignment with one or another faction. For example, when SCHOLZ was ousted in last November's RCH elections (as reported in EGG-1362), Subject's position was not threatened, despite the fact that his relationship with SCHOLZ was common knowledge. CAHELM today enjoys an excellent working relationship with the present RCH Executive Committee.
- 5. TARGETING: Specifically, Subject has been charged with the following assignments:
  - A. Get himself established and accepted in the New Left movement.
  - B. Review his previous contacts for possible exploitation in this new context.
  - C. Spot and assess present and potential leaders.
  - D. Report developments of positive intelligence value.

In addition to these "New Left" assignments, Subject has remained active in the FJPLEAD area, particularly in the framework of his monthly discussion group. He is called upon from time to time by Station FJPLEAD officers to provide assessments on individuals and to perform occasional debriefings of WSBIGG travellers. While not normally worthy of further dissemination, his reporting of local APO planning (demonstrations, etc.) is of considerable value to the Base.

- 6. It should be noted that Subject has performed the above assignments while maintaining full-time overt employment at I-dentity. This has shown itself to be an unsatisfactory arrangement in that, according to Subject, 24 hours a day have not been adequate to fulfill both his overt and his covert roles. Recognizing this condition, and in the belief that a worthwhile operational potential exists here, we have modified Subject's WOFIRM employment conditions as noted in Paragraph 10 below.
- 7. We feel in the first case that Subject has fulfilled his primary objective in getting established and accepted quite successfully. He is today a recognized member of the Hamburg APO. Of Subject's several long-term contacts also active in the APO, the following are examples of those playing leading roles at various levels:
  - A. Ernst AUST, recent founder of the Mao-oriented Communist Party of Germany/Marxist-Leninist (KPD/ML)

- 8. Among the younger radicals, Subject has been concerned with singling out those who appear to possess significant leadership potential. Hamburg has yet to produce a leader of the caliber of a Cohn-Bendit, but several "second echelon" individuals seem to be emerging. Note: We are planning an approach to one of Subject's leads for assessment in the near future. (See EGGA-4357).

Additionally, Subject was able to provide information concerning APO activities during and related to the Presidential visit and the 5 March Bundesversammlung (EGG-1384, 22 February 1969, and EGG-1386, 27 February 1969).

- 10. FUTURE PLANS: On 1 April 1969, Subject will enter upon a one-year period of leave from his overt employer. At that time the conditions of his employment with us will revert to those which obtained in the period 1 November 1966 to July 1968. (See EGGA-3825, 2 December 1966 and EGGA-4237, 1 August 1968). An amended Memorandum of Oral Agreement will be forwarded separately.
- 11. With greater time at Subject's disposal, our prime objective in the coming year will be to project him onto the federal level of APO activities. To this end, we envisage his becoming more active in the RCH, participating to a greater degree on the various committees, and working closer with the local APO leadership. Working from his Hamburg platform, and given his talents for parlaying contacts, we are optimistic about his being able to break into national level APO circles.

12. An analysis of the APO in Germany today, at the local or the national level, can only lead to the conclusion that this target is an amorphous one. This fact dictates that our targeting of Subject take a pragmatic approach. Within the APO, and especially in this election year, factions are splitting and coalitions are forming with remarkable rapidity. The single thread of continuity in all this seems to be the leaders themselves; the position of the faces may change but the faces themselves remain the same. Whether the APO, or its leaders, can show themselves to be an effective political force in this election year - or afterwards - is yet to be decided. However, the attempt to insert a source with Subject's credentials into this phenomenon is felt to be a worth while exercise.

- 13. SECURITY: Subject is routinely met 2 3 times per month. The meeting locale, originally Subject's apartment, has been shifted to various Hamburg restaurants, pending the acquisition of an adequate safe-house facility. From time to time brush contacts take place at pre-arranged locations, With the singular exception noted below, no adverse security developments have appeared during the period.
- 14. In social contact over the Christmas holidays, one of the Hamburg MAD (Militaerischer Abschirmdienst) officers had mentioned that a case had turned up in which a questionable, if not undesirable, person had received a visa to the United States. He offered to provide us details when MAD's report was completed. He finally visited us in early February and gave us a copy of MAD's investigation into a request for draft deferment submitted by the older of Subject's two sons. MAD discovered that the son had spent some time in the DDR and the Soviet Union prior to visiting the U. S. in 1967. (See EGGA-3955, 26 May 1967) Based on this fact, together with Subject's known involvement in leftist groups, MAD wished to call to our attention to what appeared to them as laxity in U. S. visa screening. (Note: The visa MAD was questioning was issued in 1967 to permit the son to attend a ten-month course at his father's pre-war Alma Mater, the Kent School.)
- 15. We thanked the MAD representative for his information explaining that, by their very nature and because of the volume, visitor visa applicants received a more or less cursory check, more stringent checks being made on immigrant visa applicants. This apparently satisfied his curiosity and the incident appears closed. We have considered the incident from various angles and have concluded that it was most probably precisely what was claimed, an effort on the part of MAD to be helpful.



- CAHELM described Identity 1 as a well-educated woman (fluent German and English) with whom he could discuss various topics in a straight-forward fashion, including sex. As a matter of fact, Identity 1 confided that she had always wanted to see "a real Western sex movie", but this desire was not fulfilled because the other two Soviets in her group had different interests. According to CAHELM, Identity 1 was very much impressed by what she saw and heard of the German living standard, by what she saw and heard of the German living standard, and honest and frank enough to admit that it was much higher than that of the Soviets. She also confided that she had joined the "Soviet Committee for Protection of Peace" in order to be able to travel and to maintain contact with the "outside world". It was her first visit to Germany, although she has seen the Scandinavian countries on a previous occasion. 


A West German businessman with regular direct access to businessmen engaged in trade with China. He obtained the informanessmen engaged in trade with China. He obtained the information in this report from Captain Hirschhausen of the <u>Rickmers</u> ship line, who made the trip described below. It is believed to be an accurate account of Captain Hirschhausen's statements.

- 1. Captain Hirschhausen scopped at the ports of Shanghai, Singkiang, and Dairen between the end of July and mid September 1968. (Source Comment: The Rickmers line is the only line which regularly Sails the Europe-China route. The line has six ships, each of which should, for financial reasons, make the run at least three times a year. Each ship travel make the run at least three times a year. Each ship travels the route only twice annually, however, which is one of the reasons for the financial difficulties in which the line presently finds itself. The head of the firm, Claus Rickmer, has a good reputation with the Chinese, but tariff and trade negotiations are difficult, and other problems have negotiations are difficult, and otherproblems have been en-countered, such as arrests of the seamen, confiscation, and The Chinese have unnecessary delays in loading and unloading. also been unwilling to assume any responsibility for diffi-culties caused by unrest which was a part of the Cultural Revolution.)
- Hirschhausen arrived in Singkiang Harbor on 25 August, but had to anchor outside the harbor for almost thirty days and then was anchored inside the harbor for another two weeks because the ship could not be serviced because of transportation difficulties and lack of workmen. Every morning a delegation of Chinese boarded the ship and held political discussions for two to three hours on the teachings of Mao. Shrill female voices broadcasted Mao propaganda in all languages over loudspeakers in the harbor for many hours. This

route is unattractive for seamen. They must be back on board ship by midnight, and any rough handling of a Chinese by seamen or non-observance of Chinese propaganda results in immediate arrest. Free movement is possible within the city, but not outside it.

- 3. The Chinese use any pretext to make difficulties, but once a confession is signed and Mao praised, everything is forgotten and the problems are solved. Even if the charges are absurd, it is easier to do what the Chinese require, so that business can in some way be carried on. Hirschhausen said that he is regarded as a good Communist in the harbors and that as a result his treatment is better if difficulties arise. His predecessor, however, who has since retired because he could no longer stand arrests and harrassments, had a more difficult time because he would not acknowledge Mao in order to be left in peace.
- 4. Hirschhausen believes that of all the ships engaged in China trade, between sixty and seventy percent are Greek. They also sail on China's rivers.
- 5. While his ship was docked at Dairen in late August and early September 1968, Hirschhausen saw about twenty-five persons of various ages who had been hanged in the vicinity of the harbor. They had been publicly denounced and maltreated before their hanging. When he asked what their crime had been, he was told that they had once collaborated with the Japanese, that they had been Japanese agents and had been hiding out ever since until they were discovered during the Cultural Revolution. When it was pointed out to them that some of the people would have been children during World War II, the Chinese made no reply. Hirschhausen said that he had found ships' controls greatly increased over what they had been earlier, particularly in Dairen. He said that while he had seen a few individual Red Guards in Dairen, there were not many and the wall posters were down.
- 6. According to Captain Hirschhausen, propaganda about Mao seems to have increased, both toward visitors and toward the Chinese. It is principally directed at the workers in the factories. A noticeable conflict seems to have arisen between the younger workers and the older generation. The visitor to China also gets the impression that propaganda attacks on the Soviet Union have become sharper and more frequent and that the "enemy no." one" for China is not the United States but the Soviet Union. Daily political education courses lasting from two to three hours are given to the ships' crews; even the captain has to participate. Politics and propaganda take precedence with the Chinese over the country's economic interests.

7. Ship construction is being intensified in China, and more are being built, especially motor boats. Ships over 15,000 tons are not built on Chinese docks, but one 15,000 ton ship is now being built as a one-of-a-kind model. The purchase of foreign-built ships is also increasing in order to build up the Chinese trade fleet and make China more independent. The ship "Etha Rickmers" was sold to China two years ago at a favorable price and sails from Hong Kong under the name of "Friendship" in Chinese ciphers. "Etha Rickmers" was used by the Chinese as a model for other ships. All the insignias of former owners have been removed, and it has been made to look like a Chinese-built ship. Hirschhausen said he had seen the "Etha Rickmers" in Singapore. Chinese ships or ships under Chince charter receive strict instructions from the Chinese to load goods in German harbors which were originally contracted for the Rickmers line. The line is powerless to do anything about this if it wants to continue trading with China. Claus Rickmers acknowledges this treatment, which the Chinese call "Positive political-ideological support of the new China", and he thinks he serves his line better if he were to argue about the contracts. The name of Rickmers is still in good standing in China, and Rickmers hopes that patience and cooperation with the Chinese will pay off.

CAHELM's net income has dropped only DM 200 (ca. US\$54) monthly since taking the leave of absence. Covering this small amount of difference has not been a problem.

We agree that for the long-run some overt employment should be developed and have been working with CAHELM on this matter for some time. It is hoped that he will be in such a position, compatible with his operational duties, by early 1970, certainly by the time his one year leave of absence expires on 1 April.

- 3. We note also that the objectives of this operation are regularly reviewed. In 1968 an attempt was made to expand CAHELM's activity beyond the KOBIRD area, which had been his field for several years. At that time he was directed to renew and expand his contacts in local leftist circles and to get himself accepted in the New Left movement. With Headquarters concurrence, as expressed in Reference B, approximately one year was spent in this activity, and it is felt that the degree of success achieved was most satisfactory.
- 4. However, in line with the recently enunciated downgrading of the New Left target, the objectives of this operation are being realigned. We are currently exploring his leftist connections (both those developed over the past year as well as his long-standing contacts) in a REDTOP context. The objective will be to exploit these contacts as a means of developing CAHELM into an access agent, vis-a-vis either the REDTOP PCS target or visiting MHHARSHERS. Definite leads in both of these cases have already been discovered. We are also attempting to arrange CAHELM's future overt employment situation (described in Paragraph 2 above) not merely as a cover mechanism but as a means in itself of bringing him into contact with the REDTOP target.
- 5. This does not mean, however, that CAHELM is breaking his ties to KOBIRD or New Left contacts. In fact, he continues as an asset of KOBIRD operational potential and will remain so. His New Left contacts will also be maintained, albeit on a less intense basis, while his main effort is concentrated on the REDTOP target. Periodic reporting from the field will keep Headquarters informed of progress in this operation.

SHUTOV, who is going to send money with ZVONKIN, wants KUKIN to purchase a Dual stereo set for him and have NOSTRAK/Hamburg (MORFLOT Agent) ship it to him aboard the Soviet vessel MS "ANGARSK".

### 5 January 1970:

A conversation between KOLTYPIN (SOVFRAKHT/Hamburg) and Anatoliy PRIBYLOY (SOVFRAKHT/Paris) reveals that SOVFRAKHT/Hamburg has failed to pay taxes (Lohnsteuer) for their two local employees (Harriet DETSCH, secretary, and Irma NEUBERT, cleaning woman) over the past ten years. The local German Finanzamt is now requesting approximately DM 100,000.— in back payment. KOLTYPIN has reported this "surprise" to Moscow, and has turned the matter over to the lawyers of the Soviet Trade Mission (STM), Cologne.

### 6 January 1970:

A conversation between KOLTYPIN and SOVFRAKHT/Moscow reveals that plans are under way to assign a t h i r d male representative (fmu LNU) to SOVFRAKHT/Hamburg who is going to have his desk in the office of NOSTRAK

Baubehoerde in Hamburg has turned down plans to build an attachment (extra apartment) to the SOVFRAKHT/Hamburg building, and KOLTYPIN has requested DM 10,000.— in order to find an apartment for the newcomer elsewhere. Moscow has already approved DM 12,000.— for the purchase of an automobile for this individual.

### 6 January 1970:

Vladislav Aleksandrovich MIKHEYEV (STM/Cologne) informs KOLTYPIN that a crew member of the MS "BALAKLAVA" - Sergeiy Dimitrievich SHURYGIN - is hospitalized in the Wilhelmsburger Kramkenhaus (Hamburg 93) with a leg injury, and asks that the sailor be visited and taken back aboard his vessel which is due to return to Hamburg on or about 7 January 1970.

### 6 January 1970:

ECLTYPIN informs PRIBYLOV (SOVFRAKHT/Paris) that the President of SOVFRAKHT/Moscow, A. A. SAVELYEV, is going to retire on 10 January 1970. According to ECLTYPIN's opinion, Nikolaiy Ivanovich SUYEV (First Vice President) is going to succeed SAVELYEV.

### 6 January 1970:

KOLTYPIN informs Yevgeniy Kalinkovich KORNEYCHUK (SOVFRAKHT/ Rotterdam) that a "Canadian Shipping Conference" is going to take place in Hamburg on 18-19 February 1970. (No other details.)

### 7 January 1970:

KOLTYPIN learns from Sergeiy KAUSOV (SOVFRAKHT/Paris) that Lev MALININ - a recently arrived SOVFRAKHT employee - is going to be used mainly as a "liaison man" between SOVFRAKHT/Paris and the Commercial Section of the Soviet Embassy/Paris.

### 7 January 1970:

A conversation between Harriet DETSCH (secretary, SOVFRAEHT/ Hamburg) and her husband reveals that they are planning to take a cruise aboard the Soviet vessel MS "TARAS SHEVCHEMEO" in March 1970. The cruise, which will take them to North Africa, is being organized by NECKERMANN/Frankfurt/M. (Field Comment: We are instructing CAHELM to find out more about this and, if possible, may send him on the cruise as a means of consolidating his developing relationship to the DETSCH's.)



b. Acting on instructions to intensify his cultivation of Identities 1 and 2, Subject has developed his relationship with these individuals from that of a casual social acquaintance to a more friendly level. Identities apparently enjoy Subject's company and have displayed in their conversations with him an increasing trust. This has been evidenced recently by their willingness to discuss with Subject not only abstract political themes but also matters transpiring in Identity 1's employer firm, the actual target of our exercise. This is, we note, despite an otherwise keen security sense on the part of Identities. We are still searching for some significant susceptibility on the part of Identity 1 which would indicate possible recruitability. In the meanwhile and until this is determined we feel the cultivation exercise is worth while in that Identity 1 has shown a talkative nature vis-a-vis Subject and appears to possess promise as a valuable elicitation source.

c. Unfortunately, the certainty with which we viewed Subject's entry into the leadership of Identity 3 did not prove warranted. The position noted in Paragraph C2 of EGGA-4733 for which he was being considered went to another individual. Subject's activity within the organization will continue at about the same level as previously.

#### 4. Security:

There have been no untoward security developments during the reporting period.

#### 5. Administrative:

Subject will be on vacation and out of the Hamburg area during the period 10 July to 5 August 1970.

#### 6. Financial:

Subject is paid a salary of DMW 800 per month, in addition to which he is reimbursed for directed operational expenses.

#### 7. Comments:

- a. We are most satisfied with the performance of this energetic and resourceful agent. His development of Identities 1 and 2 has been commendable and shows encouraging promise. We would also cite his excellent performance in reporting and analyzing the Fifth Stockholm Vietnam Conference.
- b. With the likelihood of a Soviet Consulate-General coming to Hamburg in the near future, we have been exploring Subject's contacts and access with the objective of preparing him for an access agent role against this most interesting future target. The potential offered by his relationship to Identities 1 and 2 is clear. Augmenting this and in an attempt to make Subject more attractive to potential Soviet target individuals, he was recently instructed to explore the possibility of securing employment with a local governmental agency. If such proves feasible it would also improve Subject's cover situation, although we might add that his current cover has stood him in good stead to date.
- c. In addition to his Soviet-oriented activities, which are his primary assignment, Subject also performs ad hoc

WS and HKM receive Hans Waldemar SETBODE, of Hamburg, at NCNA. STEDODE has taken advantage of passing through Bonn on the way to taking a "Kur" to call at NCNA. He also intends to visit a step-sister residing in Wiosbaden, call on another friend of long-standing in Cologne, and perhaps visit Herman SCHWANN, one of the original founders of the Doutsch-China Gesellschaft (DCG). SEEBODE tells WS that while he was not sure that WS would have time to see him, he hoped for the best when he telephoned to WS the previous day for this appointment. In reply, WS states that his predecessor, HSIANG, had left him a list of names and, since SFEBODE's name is on this list, the appointment was given to him.

SEEBODE tells WS that he visited NCNA three years ago and points out the chair in which he had sat on that occasion. He adds that HS and MA visited him in Hamburg and had asked his opinion about the China Bulletin which at that time DETTMANN had just begun to publish. In answer to WS question, SEEBODE states that he has known DETTMANN for ten years, that DETTMANN had come to Hamburg as a student and tried to contact the DCG at that time. SEEBODE adds that at present, the Gesellschaft sees or hears little about DETTMANN.

Biographical data on SEEBOIE: He and his two sons, aged 18 and 21, have lived alone together for the past five years. His wife ran off to the DDR with another man. SEEBODE's mother-in-law also lives in the DDR. The younger son still attends school; the older son is doing practical work in a factory. Both sons are strongly for the youth movement and have attended a meeting at which Dieter SCHUETT showed a film about the 9th Party Congress. Presently SCHUETT has organized and is carrying out a "China week" in Namburg. SCHUETT is not a member of the DCG, is a very young person and therefore able to attract young people. The members of the DCG are, in STEBODE's words, older people. In reply to WS's question, SEFBODE states that he gave up his job with the bank and now works at the Amt fuer Wirtschaft. He describes his position there as one of a municipal official but that he took this job because he wanted to do both outdoor and indoor work. He adds that part of his job is the EWG but that he also does advertising work. In his own words, it is not the best job one could have but because he is 19 years old, couldn't afford too much time looking around.

SEEBODE states that he could not tolerate remaining at his job for the Deutsche Bank.

SEEBODE compliments HKM on his good German, asks him if he has been to Germany before. HKM replies that he learned his German in Peking.

SEEBOLE gives WS an invitation to the next meeting of "Die Runde" in Hamburg. He says that hope exists that someday WS will attend. SNEWDOW asks WS whether he has received the previous "Runde" invitation which he mailed to NCNA several weeks ago. WS dodges, states that he doesn't know whother it had arrived because he was in Paris at that time. SEEBODE enumerates the people who do attend "Die Runde" meetings: Mr. and Mrs. Ernst AUST have attended two or three meetings; Frau RUECE (phon), who was in China from 1933 to 1947 and who speaks excellent Chinese; Mrs. LIN, a German blonde married to a Chinese; Mr. MU, a regular participant, has a business in Hamburg; Anna WANG (MERTENS); Inge JAHNKE come to three consecutive meetings and showed her slides after returning from China. WS makes no comment when any of these names are mentioned. He does ask what the total membership is! SEEBODE answers that "Die Runde" has a total membership of 70 to 80, that approximately 20 to 22 people attend the meetings, which are usually held every last Friday of the month. He adds that the 20 to 22 who attend are not usually the same ones and that sometimes sons and daughters of the original members come, as do students occasionally. The next meeting will include a film made by a Japanese cameraman and will be shown by Karsten. DETIMANN. DETIMANN and Gerd FLATOW have already shown this film in Ducsseldorf.


SEEDODE tells WS that "Die Runde" was established 20 years ago by Dr. Herbert MUELLER, now deceased. SEEDODE is continuing with MUELLER's work. He tells WS that a similar type of association exists in Bonn, that it is run by Dr. BUENCER, and holds its meetings during the first week of every month. WS tells SEEBODE that he has not yet contacted Dr. BUENCER. SEEDODE again expresses his hope that someday WS will attend a "Die Runde" meeting. WS replies that he's very busy now, doesn't know German yet and blames his old age for his slowness in learning the language. Later, WS intends to contact all the people whose names are on the list HS made up for WS.

After the first 45 minutes of SEEBODE's visit, during which WS carries his share of the conversation, WS resorts to using HKM as an interpreter and the conversation dwindles to a one-sided one of SEEBODE talking, HKM interpreting. WS makes no comments at all, even though SEEBODE brings up the CDU, the Moscow Treaty, politics in general. WS merely laughs when SEEBODE offers to answer any question WS may have. At one point, SEEBODE states that he is going to stop talking since he is the only one carrying on the conversation. WS again just laughs.

SEEBODE leaves, extending an invitation to WS and HKM to visit him at any time in Hamburg.





- 1. Twenty Chinese Communist seamen were active participants in a 1 May 1971 demonstration in Hamburg organized by the Communist Party of Germany/Marxist-Leninists (Kommunistische Partei peutschlands/Marxisten-Leninisten-KPD/ML). (Field Comment: The KPD/ML is a radical pro-Chinese splinter group founded on 31 December 1968 by Ernst A u s t, a former functionary of the now illegal German Communist Party Kommunistische Partei Deutschlands-KPD). Some 700-1000 demonstrators gathered for a rally, with Aust as the main speaker, followed by a parade through the city. Aust brought the Chinese to the rally from Hamburg harbor. The seamen, dressed in identical blue/gray uniforms, sang "The East is Red" in Chinese and headed the march, rhythmically waving red "Mao Books" and joining in repeated choruses of "Mao Tse-Tung." The affair appeared to be well-organized and disciplined. (Source Comment: The demonstration was surprisingly large since the KPD/ML in Hamburg has only about 100 members.)
- 2. The demonstration began at 10:00 A.M. and lasted approximately 3 hours. Later in the afternoon a convoy of 13 cars, led by a truck with KPD/ML banners, traveled to the berth in Hamburg harbor of the MS "Sapphire," of Somali registry. Thirty Chinese crew members formed in ranks in front of the ship and joined the 80 other participants in singing the "International." The ceremony was over in ten minutes. 



SCHWANN is a former FDP member, he has long since broken with the party and believes it is a propitious time to use the question of China policy as ammunition against his former FDP colleagues. Subject commented on SCHWANN's election as follows: "The DCG will probably receive a new impecus with SCHWANN at its head. The latter has many advantages over his precessors: vitality, contacts with industry, parliamentary expecience, access to all parties in Bonn, an open door to and respect from both the Soviets and Chinese, financial and political independence, ...etc."

- 3. For the past several years the DCG has been an ineffective and moribund organization. Recent arrangements for a DCG-sponsored tour of mainland China (reported in Reference) have, however, resulted in approximately 300 new applications for membership. Dear Friends,

This letter is a call for a strong participation in the World Assembly in Paris, February 11-13, 1972.

The moment has come to organise a new world conference in precest against the US war in Indochine, for peace and independence of the Indochinese peoples.

Mr. Nixon still tries to give the impression that he wants peace, that he wants to end this war, which the American people opposes so long. But all his actions aim at the prolongation of the war. In order to be reelected he must seem to want peace, but in reality he hopes to be reelected on a programme of vague promises so that, during his second term he can continue the wer. Nixon-Thieu means a long war and endless sufferings for the peoples of Indochina.

In open definice of the Christmas message of Peace on Parth president Nixon has started a new campaign of terror bombing against the Democratic Republic of Vietnam, killing and maining innocent people in a desperate effort to subjugate the Vietnamese people. Mr Nixon starts again where president Johnson stopped in October 1968, being compelled to recognize that the bombing had not achieved its aim to crush the merale of the North Vietnamese people but that it had on the contrary reinforced it. Nixon believes that he will succeed where he Johnson failed. But he is wrong. These methods do not work.

But they are a challenge to us to intensify our support for the Indochinese peoples and our apposition to Nixon's criminal war in Indochina.

Our reply must be to make the World Assembly in Paris a mighty demonstration of the peoples of the world against these cold-blooded war crimes, crimes against homenity and acts of terror, commutted by the present DS administration against innocent peoples who do not want anything but live to peace and build up a prosperous, peaceful and happy society on the rains that a ruthless aggressor made at the efforts of the past.

that is thy it was decided to convene a World Assembly in Paris to reveal the truth, agree on a world action programme of the movement of solidarity with the induchinese peoples and to ensure stronger and more efficient support to the first.

The assembly will be organised jointly by the inecutive Committee of the Stockholm Conference on Victor and a large number of Frinch organisations working tegether to end the war.

Many organizations of the brockholm tonference on Vietnam as well as many French organisations have felt the need for a meeting to give new impetus to the protess against Mr. Nixon's hypocritical policy. But at the same time if did not seem possible to guarantee the success of a seventh conference in Stockholm. That is why Paris was chosen as the venue of the Assembly.

The Executive Committee therefore invited the French organisations to a meeting in Paris on October 30. This meeting unanimously decided to convene a conference in Paris in February 1972. It was agreed that the conference would be organised jointly by the Executive Committee and the French organisations. A group of ten (five representatives of each the Executive Committee and the French organisations) was appointed for the preparatory work.

This group met on November list and decided:

- 1. The Palais des Congrès in Versailles will be rented for February 11-43, 1972. The hall holds 900 seats plus 500 in the gallery, which may be used for listeners and observers.
- 2. The name of the conference shall be "Morld Assembly in Paris" with the sub-title "For peace and independence of the Indochinese peoples".
- The participation fee shalt be USF 20 (or 100 French francs) as previously.
- 4. In enlarged preparatory meeting shall be held in Paris on January 9, 1972, From this date on, the office of the Assembly shall be established in Paris. The brench representatives promised to find a suitable office.
- 5. A number of reports an different appeals of the war in Indochina shall be worked out by experts. I sub-committee of three (Peggy Duff, Jim Polest and Charles Fourdian) will deal with the question of the reports.

approximately how many persons will participate from you. We ask those of you who need French visus to apply immediately at the French Enhances or Consulate in your town. We urge you to start the compaign immediately for a large participation in the World Assembly in Paris, which should become the biggest world manifestation so far for this purpose.

This conference early 1972 will carry great significance. We shall have to agree about the general outlines of our campaign in 1972, which will be a crucial year. Nixon continues the escalation of the war in the technological field though withdrawing a substantial part of the US forces. Our reply must be an escalation of our efforts and support to the DRV, PRG, FUNK and the Lao Patriotic Pront. Our solidarity must express itself in action and we must do much more than so far, broaden the basis of the movement and strengthen contacts with our US friends to support them.

All forces of good will in the world must work together to stop the war, end the sufferings of the peoples of Indochina and restore peace - true peace with independence and no foreign interference - to start reconstruction.

This requires still greater efforts. We must show that we live up to our responsibilities, our words and our noble aims.

Hoping for your active participation in this undertaking and in the World Assembly in Paris, we send you all our good wishes.

Who Are the Organisers of the World Assembly in Parisi

The Stockholm Conference on Vietnam is the only existing international liaison committee for co-ordination of action and protest against the war in Indochina, for information on the different aspects of the war and its background and for support of the Indochinese peoples in their struggle for freedom, independence and peace. The basic principle of this co-operation - and the explanation of its success - is that organisations and people should come together - without consideration of differences on other subjects, such as political ideology, religion, social or economic status, nationality, race, etc. - to help stopping this genocidal US war against the peoples of Indochina. The aim is that all foreign forces shall leave Indochina, so that the peoples of Vietna Laos and Cambodia can settle their own problems without foreign interference.

The origin of the Stockholm Conference on Vietnam is an invitation from the Swedish Peace and Arbitration Society to a number of international peace organisations to participate in informal talks in Stockholm to discuss what could be done to co-ordinate international protest action against the war in Vietnam. These talks took place in October 1966 with the participation of the Christian Peace Conference, the International Confederation for Disarmament and Peace, International Peace Bureau, Momen's International League for Peace and Freedom, the Morld Peace Council and 'ar Lesisters International. As the outcome of these talks the first Stockholm Conference on Vietnam was held in Stockholm on July 6 - 9, 1967, with about 450 participants from 60 countries, in cluding representatives of the Democratic Lepublic of Vietnam and the 'National Liberation Front of South Vietnam.

> This experience was considered so successful that it was decided to build up a permanent machinery of liaison (International Liaison Committee). Since then five more Stockholm Conferences have been held at crucial moments of the war, and the Morld Assembly in Paris now being prepared can be regarded as the 7th Stockholm Conference on Vietnam.

The Stockholm Conference on Victnam also has taken the initiative to the International Commission of Enquiry into US Crimes in Indochina which, so far, has had two sessions, one in Stockholm in October 1970 and one in Oslo in June 1971. Finally, as a result of another initiative from the Stockholm Conference, and International Trade Union Conference on Indochina is being prepared.

The Stockholm Conference has always worked in close co-operation with the true representatives of the Victnamese people - the Democratic Republic of Vietnam and the NLF-PRG - and more recently also with the Lao Patriotic Front and as far as Cambodia is concerned with the FUNK and the Loyal Government of National Union headed by Samdech Norodom Sihanouk.

The Stockholm Conference on Victnam has now permanent contacts in nearly a hundred countries - political organisations, women's, students' and youth organisations, trude unions, religious organisations, peace organizations, etc. and, of consec.



1. THE "PARIS WORLD ASSEMBLY FOR THE PEACE AND INDEPENDENCE
OF INDOCHINESE PEOPLES", SUCCESSOR TO EARLIER STOCKHOLM VIETNAM
CONFERENCES, WAS HELD IN VERSAILLES 11-13 FEBRUARY. PARTICIPATING
WERE SOME 850 DELEGATES TOGETHER WITH 250 GUESTS AND OTHER
PARTICIPANTS FROM 80 COUNTRIES. MORE FACADE THAN SUBSTANCE,
THE CONFERENCE WAS MAINLY A PLATFORM FOR AMPLIFYING WELL KNOWN
POSITIONS. THE RESULTS AND RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED WERE PREDICTABLE

- 2. ONE OF THE MAIN THEMES OF THE CONFERENCE WAS A VEHEMENT REJECTION OF THE EIGHT POINT PROPOSAL ADVANCED BY PRESIDENT NIXON IN HIS 25 JANUARY SPEECH. LED BY HOANG QUOC VIET, THE 18 MEMBER DRV/PRG DELEGATION REPEATED, BOTH IN OPEN SPEECHES AND DURING EXTENDED INFORMAL DISCUSSIONS, THAT THE SEVEN POINT HANOI PROGRAM REMAINS THE ONLY BASIS FOR NEGOTIATIONS. POSITION STATEMENTS OF THE DRV/PRG DELEGATION EMPHASIZED THE FOLLOWING POINTS:
- A. FIRST PRIORITY REMAINS THE COMPLETE WITHDRAWAL OF ALL U.S. FORCES. WHEN A FIRM DATE IS NAMED, ALL U.S. PRISONERS OF WAR WILL BE RELEASED.
  - B. VIETNAMIZATION MUST BE HALTED.
  - C. THE AIR WAR MUST BE HALTED.

THE DRV/PRG GROUP CAMPAIGNED ENERGETICALLY BEHIND THE SCENES
AS WELL AS OPENLY TO SECURE AGREEMENT THAT ALL FUTURE WORLD
WIDE ACTIONS AND DEMONSTRATIONS HAVE AS THEIR SLOGAN: "A FIXED
DATE FOR THE UNCONDITIONAL WITHDRAWAL OF ALL U.S. FORCES FROM
VIETNAM." A PARTICULAR SORE POINT APPEARED TO BE THE AIR WAR
AGAINST NVN WHICH DRV/PRG DELEGATES DESCRIBED PRIVATELY AS

A RESOLUTION "UNANIMOUSLY ADOPTED" BY THE CONFERENCE (BUT ACTUALLY DRAFTED AND PRINTED PRIOR TO THE CONFERENCE) SINGLED OUT FOR SPECIAL CONDEMNATION AMBASSADOR PORTER'S STATEMENTS BREAKING OFF THE PARIS TALKS.

names of sponsoring organizations are included in the list of participants (Attachment B). Romesh C h a n d r a, (Secretary-General of the WPC), Bertil S v a h n s t r o e m (President of the Executive Committee of the Stockholm Vietnam Conference), and Andre S o u q u i e r e (representing the 48 French organizations) appeared to be the prime motivators of the conference.

- 3. In the plenary hall as well as in the Commission rooms, equipment had been installed to provide simultaneous translations into English, French, Russian, Spanish and German languages. However, the available rooms were not adequate for the number of participants and consequently informal discussion groups collected in the halls, stairs and at entrances. The planning and organization seemed to be concentrated solely in the conference proceedings themselves and not in preparing for the needs of the participants. Restaurants in the area were soon out of food and refreshments as was the one snack bar in the building. Participants often had to go without meals to insure being present for the proceedings. Many participants felt lost, neglected and superfluous. Most had at best no possibility of affecting the outcome or specific resolutions, only the chance to play the role of the attentive audience and many expressed disappointment at this situation.
- 4. <u>COMMISSIONS</u> The conference was organized into four commissions:
  - a. The First or Political Commission.
     b. The Second or Action Commission.
  - b. The Second or Action Commission.c. The Third or Commission on New Aspects of the War.
  - d. The Fourth or Economic Commission.

The draft resolutions of the commissions, which in fact became the final resolutions, are forwarded as Attachment C. Only in Commissions I and IV did the chairmanship remain constant; namely Romesh Chandra in the former and Prof. Guenther Drefahl of East Germany in the latter. In Commission II the chair alternated between French and Italian delegates while in Commission III the French and Australians dominated. No attempts to seize chairmanship of any commission were noted; each approved chairman had four deputies at his side at all times to forestall any such attempt.

- 5. DISSIDENT OPINION AND COMMISSION DECISIONS Trotskyites and other potential opposition groups were not observed either in the plenum or in the commissions. Strict control procedures at the entrances seemed successful in preventing any significant extremist presence. Occasional individual attempts to bring forth deviant ideas in the plenum were frustrated by polite parliamentary means and soon died. The same party-line predominance prevailed during discussions in the separate commissions. There were in fact no unanimously adopted resolutions in any commission. Because of the very pressing time situation, which conference organizers probably intended as such, draft resolutions printed in advance served as the basis for the final reports of the commissions which were usually passed with only very minor changes. (See Attachment C.) Conflicting or varying ideas were parried with the comment, that matter is being discussed in another with the comment, "that matter is being discussed in another commission," or "one cannot include every item in a resolution," another wording of this point is already part of the reso-on," etc. Because of the limited time allowed each speaker lution, as well as the presence of an overwhelming majority of partyliners, it was only occasionally necessary for the conference leadership to resort to calling for a vote by acclamation. This technique effectively stifled the opposition.
- 6. FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS Since the Versailles Conference was organized and managed by the WPC--and in part through its

offwheat, the Stockholm Vietnam Committee-travel and financial erroncests were provided by the local MPC-affiliated appropring regardisations in the various countries. Depending on their individual financial situation, official delegates were reimbursed by the spencering organization for travel costs, conference focs, and perhaps hatel expenses. Once in Paria, however, heads of delegations often found themselves obliged to assist members who run out of funds. For example, Alica B o b r y o h e v a of the Seviet delegation was assigned to manage her delegation's finances as was one Pau R o z a s, whose organization was given as "Cooo" (no further information). Singled out for special financial support were youthful participants and those from youth groups. In the west German case, several bus loads of youths were brought to Versallies free of charge to participate in the demonstration scheduled for 1) Pebruary, simply to lend a "youthful image" to the proceedings.

- 7. THATE WITH COMPETENCE ON VIETNAK C-5 learned from one Duman W I e r s &, s Creek participant, that s World Free Trade Union (WFTW) Conference is on the agenda. It is hoped to convene much s conference in Vienna in October 1972, provided a Europeanievel trade union conference can be held prior to this date. If this is not possible, the European trade union conference will be held in Vienna in October and the WFTU Conference sometime theoreafter.
- 8. PYTHE PLACE So concerts plans for a second World Accessity this year were noted, although Svanstroes in his closing essent indicated the Evecutive Committee of the Stockholm Vietnam Conference would convene in a few weeks to discuss future plans. - 7. COMPRESCY DOCUMENTS C-5 commented that it was more difficult to obtain complete documents in Versaillee than at earlier Stockholm conferences. We have included all documents C-5 was sole to procure as Attachment D which we are forwarding to Chief/EDR. Where he was able to obtain deplicates, these are being forwarded to Chief/CA Staff. Attachment E, forwarded to Chief/CA Staff, contains samples of preparants material distributed at Versailies. C-5 reported his activities at the conference were made more difficult because he was manualle to obtain a list of participants (Attachment E) will three hours before the conference closed. The original list, prepared prior to the conference, was not distributed to cause it contained the sames of cortain participants—prinarily Greeks, Spaniards, Perturesce and Turks—whose presence if known could same then difficulty in their homelands. ll. Re Reference D, C-5 did not observe any attempts at disruptive action by radical groups. He noted no situation arose which would have required the approximately fifty guards present (forces d'ordre?) to control order. Apparently the radicals never gained entry, something probably due to the strict control maintained at all entrances. Nor did the question of granting entry to these groups materialize in the conference itself. C-5 noted no open dissension on this matter within the gatherings and discussions he observed. The more militant groups were forced to limit their actions to premises outside the conference, where they distributed leaflets attacking the conference and attempted to organize a counter-demonstration opposed to the "official" demonstration held on 13 February. Approximately 3,000 members of the New Left sustered for this purpose, but a heavy rain helped to thwart any serious confrontation. C-5 could not confirm whether conference organizers and French security forces were cooperating to insure a peaceful conference. One police troop truck was stationed in front of the conference building, but no situation developed which would have required the police to intervene. Careful and detailed prior planning by conference organizers and the heavy "party-line" emphasis apparent throughout insured a relatively undisturbed conference, according to C-5.





#### CONCLUSIONS

Subject is a Source of CAZAMIA and has been in their employ as claimed in varying roles and in varying degrees since at least 1958. There is no evidence that he has fabricated reports for either CAZAMIA or EKHERALD, although there are indications that he seems susceptible to side-reporting to an organization such as \_\_\_\_\_\_ There is no concrete evidence to support an assumption that he is under the witting control of a hostile service. No significant RKHERALD/LNBUZZ interests have been affected by Subject's dual role, although some threat still exists to an active case handled by \_\_\_\_\_\_ Base.

#### HARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF THE OPERATION

- 2. That he was a source of CAZAMIA came to light on 4 December 1972 when during a routine lunch I handed COB, I several photographs of Subject, Subject's son, an as yet unidentified individual, and his present SKHERALD case officer. The photos were taken in November by a CAZAMIA surveillance team immediately after Subject and his 6KHICRALD case officer held a meeting in downtown Hamburg. #### OPERATIONAL TRADECRAFT SUMMARY

#### THE RECORD

- 3. Succinctly, Subject's bona fides have never been fully established. Routine traces were conducted in 1958, although Hamburg Base records lack the full results of the vetting. CENTREG and RDC traces were requested in January 1973. Subject was given an SGSWIRL in 1965 chiefly to determine if he had severed contact with CAZAMIA, and while officially he was given a clean bill of health. Base files indicate that he had some unspecified problem which, in retrospect, should have been resolved immediately or by a subsequent SGSWIRL.
- 4. The initial fissure in the case was his CAZAMIA contact, but it appears that BKHERALD took this into consideration at least at the outset. When asked later about the relationship, Subject stated that the contact had been severed, which might have been the truth at the time of the SCSMIRL. Had more contact reports have been written and critical CI reviews conducted by successive handling officers, steps might have been taken to resolve the question of his loyalty. Pro-forma reviews might have enabled

his handlers to have "known" Subject also in the truest sense. The details of his relationship with the local HIAG has not been resolved. Finally, there is no evidence that he was put through a series of operational tests designed specifically to check his reporting, his loyalty or his trustworthiness.

#### THE AGENT

5. Subject appears to be an energetic individual, armed with a good intellect, an inquiring mind, a methodical approach to assignments and a good memory for facts and details. He appears to be able to think logically, clearly and in practical terms. In certain things he is impulsive and in his overall makeup, there are indications of compulsiveness. His apparent need, not to sneak of his ability, to work with two clandestine services for over a decade does not mirror a completely emotionally stable individual in clinical terms. The man seems to have a conscience, as reflected in his concept for his family, but his sense of ethics appear fuzzy. It would seem that common sense would dictate over a neriod it could be unethical to sell the same product to two organizations, even when the ethics of clandestine services may be arcane. It appears that his real motivation is a need for affiliation, a power motive and need for recognition. recognition.

G. It appears that Subject has more loyalty to BXHERALD than to CAZAMIA. We provided him with a steady income when he was unemployed and even now, CAZAMIA seems niggardly when it comes to agent salaries. It would seem too that our officers are less bureaucratic, more imaginative than are those in CAZAMIA and, more important, they represent the most nowerful country in the world. It could be heady wine. Subject is a "natural" clandestine agent, obviously enjoying the game of working with at clandestine agent, obviously enjoying the game of working with at least two services without their knowledge. It seems that Subject slid into the relationship with BKNERALD and while he may have had some initial reservations about playing a double-role, it soon became apparent that he could handle it with a minimum of trouble and

he simply continued it. Horeover, there was no conflict of interest in what he was asked to do. He just omnitted certain details. Thus, his actions could be fully rationalized. From the pragmatic side, working with CAZAMIA could also provide cover for his GKHERALD work should he be compromised in the process; were an operation to blow, his status could be checked through CAZAMIA. It was an insurance policy. Presumably his reasons are for working with CAZAMIA patriotism as well as the need for recognition and cash.

7. Viewing it in a sinister vain, Subject could be providing identical information to HIAG contacts involved with a civen the probable enjoyment he receives from having two listeners, axiomatically he would receive greater pleasure by having a third. Obviously, if he could handle two services, he could handle a third customer. Subject has no specific party leanings; rather, he identifies with what he terms the "radical center", which is an amalgum of social reform and conservative thought with political overtones. The record suggests that Subject's prime loyalty is to himself and to his own political orientation and its adherents. His distinction to expatiate on his Waffen SS davs and his HIAG ties, suggests that if he has strong affiliation needs, it could well be that he is reporting also to HIAG. The concealment of his CAZAMIA work suggests by extension that he is hiding possible HIAC work. Base has evidence that a reporting source of a comprised of HIAG members exists in Hamburg. Would the information he has been supplying both CAZAMIA and BKHERALD be of interest to the substance, but also the operational information he has assembled over the years, on at least his CAZAMIA case officers. His inappropriate inquisitiveness about BKHERALD personnel tends to substantiate the conclusion that he is keeping book on us as well.

#### THE OPERATION

8. There is no evidence that the mechanics of his handling by DKNERALD officers was insecure; as a support asset, his handling

#### DISPOSAL PLAN

17. Subject must be terminated and the target date set for this july 1973. This will be a phased termination, using so departure as the first step and so the second. The reason to be given Subject is the reduction of funds and personnel. He has been through BALPA and OPRED with us and is aware of such periodic reviews and cutbacks and it should come as no shock. The termination presented in the nature of a "temporary" suspension of the operation part of the script will be to obtain his committment to accept contact again if needed in the future.

A bonus naid as faith money should assuage some of the pain involved. As CAZAMIA intends to continue the contact as a political source, Subject will continue receiving extra cash and an outlet for his affiliation - power association need. No SGSMIRL is contemplated, lest he conclude that he is being terminated for security reasons. There are strong arguments for an SGSWIRL to resolve outstanding questions, but on balance, no SGSWIRL should be given prior to his termination to preserve the

at least on the surface, advising them of our plans and keeping them abreast of the requirements being levied over the next few months. While one of the main reasons for this is to preserve our liaison equities: however we have no intention of providing them with the contents of our files. We intend to inveigh upon them to resist the temptation to "punish" him, for such action would serve no useful end and could engender bitterness at both services. We should take our lumps, since it was CAZAMIA and BKHERALD who allowed Subject to take the lattitude he took.

1. In line with Reference operational planning, CASUSTAIN/5 was terminated on 28 June 1973.

- 2. To avoid arousing his suspicion that we were aware of his relationship with CAZAMIA, he was told that this action resulted from instructions from our Headquarters to put all our clandestine contacts "on ice". He was told that beginning with the new fiscal year (1 July 1973) we were enjoined until further notice from conducting operational activity. Moreover, the case officer himself was being recalled. We cited fiscal and organizational problems, while expressing the hope that this would be only a temporary situation. CASUSTAIN/5 seemed surprised and quite disappointed. After the initial surprise and over the course of the meeting, he expressed some skepticism as to the real reason for such drastic measures. (Perhaps he suspected his duplicity may have caught up with him.)
- 3. As a sign that this might indeed be a temporary measure, and to make our separation as palatable as possible, CASUSTAIN/5 was paid a bonus of two months salary. We assured him we would contact him as soon as the current restrictions were lifted, but left it clearly on a "don't call us, we'll call you" basis. Despite the unpleasant circumstances, the parting was amicable and friendly.
- 4. CASUSTAIN/5 may indeed suspect that his past has caught up with him. We doubt, however, that his disappointment will provoke any reaction on his part, CASUSTAIN to UECEIAED
