Zoological and Acclimatization Society of Pictoria.

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL AS READ AT THE ANNUAL MEETING, FEB. 15th, 1836.

THE Council of the Zoological and Acclimatisation Society has much pleasure in submitting its Twenty-second Annual Report to the Subscribers.

During the past year the Society has made very satisfactory progress, the Gardens having been much improved, and the Zoological collection largely increased. The Director of the Society visited England and the Continent in the early part of the year, and sent and brought out a considerable number of animals and birds, the whole of which were carried free by the Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company. The Company has for years past acted with the greatest generosity and liberality to the Society, and the Council desires again to express its thanks to the Company and its superintendent here, Mr. G. Withers.

To accomodate the new additions, several pretty structures have been erected, and fresh enclosures made. The public has shown its appreciation of the efforts of the Society, 80,428 visitors having paid at the gates during the year, being an increase of nearly 4,000 on last year. The funds of the Society have also been otherwise increased, the Government and Parliament having granted the sum of £2,000, being an increase of £500 on the usual vote, and the Hon. the Chief Secretary was good enough to have the sum of £1,000 placed on the additional estimates as a special vote for building and fencing. This amount has been a great assistance to the Society, as it has provided funds for several necessary works.

A new Reptile house will shortly be erected, and other improvements are in contemplation, which will have the effect of rendering the Gardens even more attractive than at present.

A new feature in the Gardens, which promises to become a great success, and add much to their popularity, is the establishment of the Saturday open-air concerts, which were commenced on the 12th of last December, under the auspices of the Melbourne Coffee Gardens Society. Mr. Siede, the well-known musician, is conductor of the band, which numbers twenty-five of the best instrumentalists in Melbourne. It is intended to continue the concerts during the summer months. A commodious band-stand has been crected, and also a large shelter-shed, where excellent light refreshments can be obtained on concert days. It is intended, before the the next concert season commences, to effect many improvements in that part of the grounds, and no effort will be spared to make these entertainments both attractive and popular.

It has been determined to despatch the Assistant Director, Mr. Dudley Le Souef, to Europe at once for fresh attractions for the Gardens. It has been found from experience that the best and cheapest way to procure animals is to send for them, and the Council fully recognises the great importance of not only keeping up the Zoological collection, but also increasing it as funds permit.

There is little to report as to acclimatisation in the past year. The Pheasants continue to spread at Gembrook, but the Californian Quail, which were some time since very numerous there, have not increased so rapidly as the Council hoped they would. This is very disheartening, but the Council has information that this fine bird is thriving in other parts of this district.

The Starlings, liberated by the Society in the Zoological Gardens two or three years ago, have increased rapidly, and large flocks are now to be seen both there and in the University grounds.

Mr. Archibald Fishin, as agent for Sir Samuel Wilson, kindly presented the Society with 2,000 Brown Trout Fry in November last, from Ercildoune, the greater part of which were successfully placed in suitable waters in Gippsland and in streams near Melbourne.

In the early part of the year, when the Society's Act of Incorporation came into force, it became necessary for the Government to appoint three gentlemen to act as Government Members of the Council, and Mr. John Halfey and the Hon. R. D. Reid, M.L.A., were appointed in place of Dr. Thomas Black and Judge Casey, and Mr. Wm. Robertson was re-appointed. Dr. Black, as is well known, was one of the founders of the Society, and occupied the position of its President for many years, but in January last he determined to resign his seat on the Council, though still taking a deep interest in the welfare of the Society. In the month of April the collector, Mr. Segerberg, resigned and Mr. George Slade was appointed by the Council to succeed him, and so far he has been fairly successful.

The Council desire to thank the Hon. Robert Simpson, the retiring President, for his services during his year of office, and also the retiring Hon. Treasurer, Mr. Purchas. The thanks of the Council are also due to the Hon. Prosector of the Society, Mr. A. H. S. Lucas, and the Hon. Veterinary Surgeon, Mr. W. T. Kendall, who has been most attentive to the health of the various animals in the Gardens. The heaviest losses the Society has sustained through deaths during the year have been the old Lioness, a Hen Ostrich, a Cassowary, an Alpaca, and two large Boa Constrictors. It now devolves on the meeting to elect a President, two Vice-Presidents, and an Hon. Treasurer for the ensuing year, and three Members of the Council, Messrs. Venables, Ryan and Moule, being the three Members who have attended the fewest meetings of the Council, retire, but are eligible for re-election.

The balance-sheet, audited by Messrs. Langton and Holmes, laid before the meeting showed the receipts from all sources to have been $\pounds 5,969$ 12s. 10d., and the expenditure $\pounds 4,484$ 12s. 6d, leaving a credit balance at the Bank of Victoria, on 1st January, 1886, of $\pounds 1,485$ 0s. 4d. This balance includes a sum of $\pounds 1,000$ granted by the Chief Secretary for permanent improvements.

The Office-bearers for the ensuing year were then elected, with the following result :—President : The Hon. C. J. Jenner, M.L.C.; Vice-Presidents : The Hon. P. Simson, F. R. Godfrey, Esq.; Hon. Treasurer : Albert Purchas, Esq.; Members of Council : George Bruce, Esq., F. G. Moule, Esq., Charles Ryan, Esq.

The meeting closed by a unanimous vote of thanks to the Director and the retiring President.

REGULATIONS

MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE

ZOOLOGICAL & ACCLIMATISATION SOCIETY

PURSUANT TO THE ZOOLOGICAL AND ACCLIMATISATION SOCIETY INCORPORATION

Act 1884, Section 8. and approved by the Governor in Council.

1. *Membership.*—A subscriber of One guinea or upwards annually, which shall be payable in the month of January, shall be a member of the society; and contributors, within one year, of Ten guineas or upwards shall be life members of the society; and any person who may render special services to the society shall be eligible for honorary membership, and may be elected as such by the Council, or by any annual general meeting.

2. Election of council.—At the annual meeting to be held in the month of February, 1885, nine members, comprising the whole of the elected members of the council, shall be elected by ballot, and thereafter the president, vice-presidents, and treasurer shall annually retire from office, and also three other members of council (namely those who have attended the fewest meetings of the council since their appointment) shall retire annually, but shall be eligible for re-election, subject to Regulation No. 9.

3. Vacancy in council, how supplied.—In case of a vacancy occurring by the death, resignation, or non-attendance of any member of the council for a period of two months, without leave of the council, the remaining members shall, in due conrse, appoint another member of the society to be a member of the council in the place and stead of the member who shall so resign or absent himself; but such new member shall be nominated at an ordinary meeting of the council prior to the meeting at which he is elected.

4. Council to fill up vacancies.—In case of a vacancy occurring by the death or resignation of the president, vice-presilent, or honorary treasurer, the council may appoint from amongst themselves, or the other members of the society, a person to fill the vacancy so occurring, and the person elected shall hold office only until the next annual meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election for the subsequent year: Provided that such vacancy shall not be filled up unless seven days' notice in writing shall have been sent to each member of the council, stating the vacancies which it is proposed to fill up. 5. Eligibility of members of council.—No person shall be eligible as a member of council unless he be a subscriber to the funds of the society of at least One guinea per annum, and any member of Council whose subscription shall be in arrear for three months after his subscription is payable shall cease to be a member of Council: Provided that this rule shall not apply to persons who may have become life-members of the society, by a payment of Ten guineas, or who may be honorary members of the society, and provided also that a mouth's notice in writing shall be sent to the member so in arrear before his place can be filled up.

6. Meetings of council.—The conneil shall meet at least once a month, three members to form a quorum, and transact the business of the society. And the director shall have power to call a special meeting of the conneil whenever occasion may require.

7. Minutes of proceedings.—Miuntes shall be made in books kept for the purpose of all proceedings at general meetings of the members, and minutes shall also be made of the proceedings of the council at their general and special meetings, and of the names of the members attending the same, and such minutes shall be open to inspection by any member of the society at all reasonable times.

8. Moneys to be paid to treasurer.—All subscriptions and other moneys received on account of the society shall be paid to the treasurer, or some person authorized by him, who shall place the same in a bank, to be named by the council, to the credit of the Society; and no sum shall be paid on account of the society until the same shall have been ordered by the council, and such order be duly entered in the book of the proceedings of the council and all cheques shall be signed by the treasurer as such, and be countersigned by the president or one of the vice-presidents, and by the director.

9. Annual meeting.—An annual meeting of members shall be held in the month of February in each rear, and the council shall report their proceedings during the past year, and shall produce their accounts duly audited for publication; and the meeting shall elect by ballot the office-bearers for the ensuing year, and fill up any vacancy which may exist in the council: Provided that up person shall hold the office of president or vice-president for two years successively.

10. *Medals.*—No medal of the society shall be awarded to any person except by the vote of at least seven members of council, present at a council meeting, and after notice of motion for awarding such medal shall have been given at the next preceeding meeting of the council.

11. *Time of gardens opening and closing.*—The gardens are open from half-past nine a.m. till half-past four p.m. in winter, and six p.m. in summer, except on Sundays when the gates are not opened until half-past one p.m.

12. Dogs not allowed in gardens.—Visitors are not allowed to bring dogs into the gardens. A penalty of Two pounds is imposed for an offence against this regulation, in addition to which the owner of any dog found in the gardens will be held responsible for any damage done by such dog.

13. *Prohibitions.*—Visitors are especially prohibited from teasing or disturbing the animals or birds; also from interrupting the workmen by conversation or otherwise; also from leaving bottles, broken glass, or erockery, paper, or litter of any kind in the gardens; from lighting any fire therein; from posting any bills on the fences, houses, or trees; and from playing cricket, football, or other games within the gardens. A penalty of Ten shillings is imposed for an offence against this regulation.

14. Children, unprotected, not allowed in gardens.—Children under twelve years of age will not be allowed within the gardens unless with a parent or other adult, and if found therein may be expelled therefrom.

15. *Prohibitions.*—Walking across the shrubberies or flower borders, pulling flowers or branches from the plants, shrubs or trees; standing upon or climbing over any of the fences, climbing trees or bird-nesting, entting names or letters or marks of any kind, or writing on any of the seats, or trees or fences, or any building erected for the accommodation of the public are strictly prohibited. A penalty of Ten shillings is imposed for an offence against this regulation.

16. Entrance into enclosures prohibited.—Entrance into those parts of the grounds which are specially enclosed for plantation, or other purposes, is strictly prohibited, under a penalty of Five shillings.

17. Smoking prohibited.—Smoking in the summer time, at such times as may seem necessary to the directors for the safety of the gardens and the property therein, is prohibited, and at such times notices to that effect will be posted at the gates. A penalty of Five shillings is imposed for an offence against this regulation.

18. *Expulsion on misbehavior.*—Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indeceney, or swearing or using bad language, or committing a breach of any of the above regulations may be forthwith removed from the gardens, and any member of the society so misbehaving shall cease to be a member.

19. Charges for admission.—Admission to the gardens is free on Sundays. On Mondays non-subscribers will be admitted on payment of One shilling for each adult and Sixpence for each child under twelve years of age, but the Society shall have power to charge One Shilling for each adult and Sixpence for each child under twelve years of age on any day (Sunday excepted) that an Instrumental Concert may be given in the Gardens. On all other days of the week non-subscribers will be admitted on payment of Sixpence for each adult and Threepence for each child under twelve years of age. State and other schools will be admitted to the gardens on application to the director at half the usual entrance fees. Members of the society admitted free.

20. Repeal of pre-existing rules.—All rules and regulations of the society in force prior to its incorporation and up to the date of these regulations coming into effect are hereby repealed.
