SUBJECT: Release from Requisition of Tokai Sangyo Company Warehouses and Site

- l. The Problem. This is a request by Matsumura Sangyo Inc., thru the JG, for release of their warehouses located at No. 23, Daikoku-cho, Tsurumi-ku, Yokohama-shi, Kanagawa Prefecture.
- 2. References. a. Ltr, JG, MFA to GHQ SCAP, FOM No. 1339 (TSPB No. 29-TMD), dated 3 July 1950, with 1 Inclosure.
- b. Letter, SCAP to 8th Army, AG 602 (3 Jul 50)GD, same subject, 6 Jul 50.
- c. 2d Ind, YC to 8th Army, EDCO 601 (6 Jul 50) same subject, 27 Jul 50.
- d. 3d Ind, 8th Army to SCAP, AGLC 601 (6 Jul 50) same subject, 10 Aug 50.
- 3. Discussion of Facts. Ref 2a states the warehouses are located on a connecting point of land and water transportation most suitable for foreign trade connections of Yokohama Port. Ref 2b requests information for reply to JG. Ref 2c states plans for move were underway but were to ICC due to ROK conflict. Ref 2d requests delay in release because of current situation.
  - 4. Additional Data. None.
- 5. Conclusions. Subject warehouses would have been vacated by YC on or about 1 July 51. Present ROK emergency has indefinitely prolonged plans for vacation in the foreseeable future.
- 6. Recommendation. Instant action, C/N (1), G-4 to G-2 (Japanese Liaison) requests that section inform the JG that the petition for the release of subject warehouses cannot be favorably considered because of a continuing need by the occupation.
  - 7. Action taken is within established policy.
  - 8. G-4 action is complete on J. N. 10100.



- 1. Attention is invited to my 3d indorsement, dated 3 May 1950, subject: "Petition for Release of 27 Warehouses", file EDCO 601, in which comment has been furnished on the same basic petition bearing date of 29 March 1950.
- 2. Rehabilitation work is now underway to provide storage space at Sagami Arsenal for the engineer spare parts which now occupy the warehouses in question. Until recently the specific program for moving stocks indicated that these warehouses would be completely vacated soon after July 1951. However, in the current emergency it is impossible to say how much longer it will take.
- 3. It is recommended that the petitioner be advised that the removal of stocks of the Yokohama Engineer Depot from the warehouses in question has been programmed, but that the time of completion has been prolonged indefinitely by the current situation in Korea. 





- 1. This application relates to the release of twenty-seven (27) buildings situated on a 10.5 acre site in Tsurumi, Kanagawa Prefecture, as more fully described in reference 2 a. below.
  - 2. References are:
- a. Previous application filed 20 May 1949 indorsed by Special Procurement Board under Memorandum dated 30 May 1949, copies of which are attached;
- b. Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 567 (1 Sep 49) CTS, SCAPIN 6009-A, 16 December 1949, subject: Operation of Port Facilities and Terminal Service;
- c. Japanese Legislation enacted pursuant to reference b. above.
- 3. Paragraph 4 of reference 2 b, above provides for the release of port facilities upon the implementation of the SCAPIN.
- 4. The facilities involved in this case, as is indicated by the petition, reference 1 a. above, abut the waterfront at a point where vessels of several thousand tons may dock. Loading and un-loading facilities primarily designed for food products are available and there is capacity of some 30,000 tons storage space. Warehousing facilities are such that an entire cargo can be assigned to one warehouse rather than being broken up into several warehouses, which minimizes the danger of loss or spoilage of cargo.
- 5. The applicant is at present an agent for the Ministry of Education and Ministry of Welfare in importing special food products for school children; but since it lacks appropriate dockside facilities, its fees for handling those food products range between five and ten per-cent, and when the warehouses are released, the company will be able to effect a substantial saving of handling charges, which is of obvious advantage to the Japanese recovery program.

- 6. In March of 1949, the applicant was appointed by the Okinawa Military Government to collect and forward freight to Okinawa. The facilities will also be used in discharging this function.
- 7. The advantages to the economic rehabilitation of Japan in keeping down the cost of imported goods and taking steps to minimize spoilage and loss of imported food is obvious. General MacArthur's Economic Stabilization Directive of December, 1948, requires such measures, and the issuance of SCAPIN 6009-A and its subsequent implementation makes such measures possible.
- 8. Attached are certificates of the Ministry of Education, and the City of Yokohama attesting to the importance of these facilities to the Japanese economy.
- 9. We earnestly request your early approval in the release of these facilities to the applicant.

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

Operation of Port Facilities and Terminal

# 1. References:

a. Japanese Government letter FOM No. 731(LCO), subject, "Operation of Port Facilities and Terminal Services," 1 September 1949.

- b. Japanese Government letter FOM No. 997 (LCO), subject, "Operation of Port Facilities and Terminal Services," 30 September 1949.
- 2. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers approves in principle the following two proposals extracted from the plan submitted on 1 September 1949, by reference la above.
- a. "As a rule, every principal port shall have a Port Management Body." (Paragraph II(1)1.a)
- b. "Port Management Body will be established as stipulated by law." (Paragraph I(1)1.b)
- 3. The proposals quoted in paragraph 2 shall be implemented by the enactment of legislation which will provide for maximum local auto nomy in the management and operation of ports and authorize local public bodies to establish or create any form of port management body most consistent with national and local interests. The legislation should contain specific provisions concerning the establishment, functions, organization and financial structure of a public juridical person, as well as any other form of port management body which may be established by local public bodies. Provisions should also be made for only that minimum supervision and control to be retained by the Japanese Government which is necessary to protect and further national interests when the Japanese Government considers that such national interests may be affected.
- Since such legislation will then govern the establishment of port management bodies, and the operation of port

and terminal facilities will in turn be governed by policies and procedures established by port management bodies in accordance with their articles of incorporation or with applicable by-laws of local public bodies, as prescribed by the law, the approval by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of any plan for the establishment and operation of a port management body at any specific port will not be necessary. Facilities which are now under procurement demand by occupation forces will be released at each port when and where a port management body has been established.

5. The Japanese Government will prepare and submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers by 30 December 1949 a draft of appropriate legislation in consonance with the foregoing and as indicated in paragraph 1(5)1. of the plan referred to in paragraph la above.

Particulars of Subject warehouses:

A. Location:

23 Daikoku-cho, Tsurumi-ku, Yokohama. A rough sketch attached herewith.

B. Size:

- C. Subject warehouses have been requisitioned under P.D.-JPNO-1265 and being used by the 298th Engineer Base Depot. However, it is informed that the said warehouses will be vacated shortly.
- l. The Matsumura Sangyo Inc. has been engaged in the business of warehousing various materials from Japanese Sources alloted to the 8th U.S. Army, under contract with the Special Procurement Board, Yokohama Branch, and also warehousing imported provisions, miscellaneous Japanese goods for export and other important materials for allied and Japanese traders.
- 2. The Matsumura Sangyo Inc. have taken every possible means to build and acquire warehouses in Yokohama, in anticipation of a considerable increase in the amount of goods to be released by SCAP under the Nine Points Economic Rehabilitation Program, and in line with the SCAP program for the promotion of Japanese foreign trade and also in order to prevent loss of important goods by theft, fire or soiling by means of storing in well equipped facilities. In the port area of Yokohama, as you are no doubt aware, no warehouses of any size commensurate with importance of Yokohama are at present available for commercial use.
- 3. In the expectation that the aforementioned warehouses would be released, the Matsumura Sangyo Inc. entered into contracts to warehouse goods for export to the OKINAWA Island as arranged for between the Welfare Department of the Ryukyu Military Government Team and Nippon General Merchandise Co., Ltd., but in view of the uncertainty as to the date of release of the said warehouses for civilian operation, the Matsumura Sangyo Inc. were compelled to take steps to meet this contractual obligation without fail by renting at great financial loss other totally inadequate warehousing facilities in Yokohama which is impossible to operate efficiently.

4. The Matsumura Sangyo Inc. is moreover, in order to fulfill all its present obligation to SCAP and to Japanese and foreign concerns as well as to facilitate the loading and unloading of imports and exports which must pass through Yokohama, retaining in readiness all necessary

labor and facilities required to operate the said warehouses.

5. For all the above reasons the Matsumura Sangyo Inc. could request your favorable consideration of their desire to have the aforementioned warehouses be released to them for normal commercial operation, once they are vacated by the 598th Engineer Base Depot Unit.
