At 10:25 a.m. you and Mrs. Nixon will be escorted from your office to the edge of the terrace outside your office. Four ruffles and flourishes will be played. As "Hail to the Chief" is played, you will be escorted to the vicinity of the platform on the South Lawn. A few moments later, the car carrying President and Mrs. Lleras and Ambassador and Mrs. Mosbacher will pull up to the Diplomatic Entrance of the Residence. The Chief of Protocol will present President and Mrs. Lleras to you and Mrs. Nixon, and then to Secretary and Mrs. Rogers and Admiral and Mrs. Moorer.

There will be photo coverage of your greeting your honored guests

Following the photographs, you will escort President Lleras, with him on your right, onto the Platform facing toward the Washington Monument. Mrs. Nixon and Mrs. Lleras will be escorted to a positive on the lawn to the right of the platform.

At 7:50 p.m. you and The First Lady will be escorted from the Family Quarters of the Residence to the North Portico Entrance. His Excellency President Lleras and Mrs. Lleras will arrive by car accompanied by Ambassador and Mrs. Mosbacher.

NOTE

There will be photo coverage of your greeting President and Mrs. Lleras.

You and your guests will then be escorted to the Yellow Oval Room. Vice President and Mrs. Agnew, Foreign Minister and Mrs. Lopez, Ambassador and Mrs. Pastrana, Secretary of State and Mrs. Rogers, Assistant Secretary of State and Mrs. Charles Meyer, Ambassador and Mrs. Jack Vaughn, and Governor Nelson Rockefeller will be present.

The dress is black tie and long dresses for the ladies.

At approximately 8:08 p.m. everyone, with the exception of yourself, Mrs. Nixon, and President and Mrs. Lleras will be escorted downstairs. The Color Guard will then enter the Yellow Oval Room and request permission to remove the colors.

Preceded by the Color Guard, you will descend the staircase at approximately 8:10. President Lleras will be to your right. Mrs. Lleras to your left, and Mrs. Nixon to her left going downstairs. At the foot of the staircase, the Color Guard will halt and move to either side. You will pause here for official photographs.

SCENARIO FOR STATE DINNER FOR PRESIDENT LLERAS

The Color Guard will form up again and you will move to the red carpet in the Grand Hall facing the East Room. Ruffles and flourishes and "Hail to the Chief" will be played as you enter the East Room through the center door. You will then form a receiving line with your back to the west wall with President Lleras to your right, Mrs. Nixon to his right, and Mrs. Lleras to her right. The Chief of Protocol will present your guests.

NOTE:

There is no press coverage of the receiving line.

When the receiving line is disbanded at approximately 8:55 p.m. you will be escorted to the head of the E-shaped table in the State Dining Room. Your guests will have preceded you and will be standing at their places.

Music during dinner will be provided by the Strolling Strings.

As the dinner draws to a close, you will exchange toasts with President Lleras.

NOTE:

- 1) A suggested toast has been prepared for your use and is attached.
- 2) The White House Communications Agency will record the toasts. These are being recorded for the Presidential Archives. There will be no press coverage of the dinner.
- 3) A list of the invited dinner guests is attached.

After dinner, coffee, liquers, and cigars will be served in the Green, Red, and Blue Rooms. You and Mrs. Nixon and your honored guests will be escorted to the Blue Room. After about five minutes, you and The First Lady and President and Mrs. Lleras will be escorted from the Blue Room to a point in the Grand Hall just outside the East Room where you will form a receiving line with President Lleras to your right, Mrs. Nixon to his right, and Mrs. Lleras to her right. A Social Aide will present your after-dinner guests to you.

At approximately 10:20 p.m. you will be escorted to the East Room where Mrs. Nixon and President and Mrs. Lleras will be seated in the front row. You will introduce the entertainment and then will be seated with your guests. A single stand-up microphone will be provided for you. SCENARIO FOR STATE DINNER FOR PRESIDENT LLERAS

The entertainment will be provided by Whittemore and Lowe, duo-pianists, who will play for approximately 30 minutes. (Background note is attached)

At the conclusion of the entertainment, you will go forward to congratulate the artists and to be photographed by the White House photographer.

You and Mrs. Nixon and Ambassador and Mrs. Mosbacher will then escort President and Mrs. Lleras from the East Room to the car at the North Portico and wish them good night. After their departure, you and Mrs. Nixon will be escorted to the Family Quarters.

There will be dancing in the Grand Hall and champagne for your guests.

ARTHUR WHITTEMORE & JACK LOWE

The team of Whittemore and Lowe has achieved the pinnacle of prestige and popularity in the field of music. The number of great symphony orchestras with which they have played as soloists is one excellent indicator of the high esteem in which they are held. A single stand-up microphone with lectern will be provided for your use in the middle of the North Wall. As the Attorney General reads the name of each of the recipients and gives a description of each act of bravery or service, you will be handed the appropriate medal by Mr. Hoover. Two brothers, Ronald C. and Randy D. Lee of Stanley, Wisconsin (Bravery Medals) for their rescue of their family from their burning home in sub-zero weather (the mother subsequently died of shock).

Gail Ann Budlow of West Allis, Wisconsin (Service Award) for volunteer work.

Janette Ann Litten of Alhambra, California (Service Award) for volunteer work.

After eachaward, it is recommended that you invite the respective families and appropriate Members of Congress to join you and the winners for a brief picture-taking opportunity.



The wedding ceremony will begin at 4:00 p.m. and will conclude at approximately 4:30. The Vice President and Mrs. Agnew and the De Havens will follow the wedding party out of the church and you and the First Family will follow them in turn.

There will be brief photo coverage on the church steps and then you and your family will depart the church by motorcade for the Towson Air Defense Reservation.

VISIT TO THE SUPREME COURT

MONDAY, JUNE 23, 1969

THE PRESIDENT:

At 9:40 a.m., you and Mrs. Nixon will depart from the Diplomatic Entrance of the White House by motorcade.

NOTE: The dress for you is morning coat, shirt with turn-down collar and a four in hand tie.

You and Mrs. Nixon will be met by Mr. Perry Lippitt, Marshal of the Supreme Court, who will escort you to your places inside. You will be seated at the table facing the bench immediately to the right of the lectern. The Attorney General will be immediately to your right. The First Lady will be seated in the VIP Section to the right of the table.

The Court will enter the Courtroom at 10:00 a.m. and the proceedings will then follow the ordinary pattern on an opinion day, except that there will be no admissions to the Bar.

Immediately upon the statement by The Chief Justice that the orders will not be announced orally, you will arise and move to your left in front of the lectern. You will address The Chief Justice and be recognized. You will then deliver brief remarks to which The Chief Justice will respond. You will remain standing during The Chief Justice's response.

At 7:45 p.m. you and the First Lady will be escorted from the Family Quarters of the Residence to the North Portico Entrance to greet your honored guests. Colonel and Mrs. (Faye) Thomas P. Stafford USAF, Commander and Mrs. (Barbara) John W. Young USN, and Commander and Mrs. (Barbara) Eugene A. Cernan USN will arrive by car. You and your guests will then be escorted to the Red Room where you will be joined by the Vice President and Mrs. Agnew and Mr. and Mrs. David Eisenhower.

NOTE: There will be a photo opportunity of you greeting your guests as they arrive.

Your other dinner guests, numbering about 25, will have been served drinks in the Blue Room. A guest list is attached. The dress is black tie with long dresses for the ladies.

The Vice President and Mrs. Agnew and Mr. and Mrs. David Eisenhower will enter the Blue Room first, and then at about 8:10 p.m. you and Mrs. Nixon, followed by the Staffords, the Youngs, and the Cernans, will be announced and will enter the Blue Room where you will form a receiving line before the pre-positioned Colors at the South End of the room. You and Mrs. Nixon will be closest to the Green Room, with the Staffords, the Youngs, and the Cernans to your left. Your guests will be presented to you by a Social Aide. After they have passed through the receiving line, they will move to the Red Room and on to their places in the State Dining Room.

When you have greeted the last of your guests, you and Mrs. Nixon and your honored guests will be escorted out of the Blue Room, into the Grand Hall, and to your places at the head of the horseshoe-shaped table in the State Dining Room.

Page Two Dinner for the Astronauts Monday, June 30, 1969

As the dinner draws to a close, you will make brief remarks which will be recorded by the White House Communications Agency for inclusion in the Presidential Archives.

NOTE: Suggested remarks are attached. There will be no press coverage, but a transcript of your remarks will be released to the press.

Following the conclusion of your remarks, the Astronauts will present you and the Vice President with lunar globes and the Presidential and Vice Presidential flags which they carried with them on their mission.

After dinner, coffee, liquers, and cigars will be served in the Blue Room. At approximately 10:10 p.m. you and your guests will be escorted to the East Room. You will then introduce the entertainment which is music by pianist Henry Mancini.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE:

Henry Mancini was born in Cleveland and studied at the Juilliard Institute of Music. After playing with the Tex Beneke Orchestra for two years, he joined the composing staff at Universal Pictures in Hollywood. He has done the scores for many motion pictures including The Glenn Miller Story, The Benny Goodman Story, The Days of Wine and Roses, and Breakfast at Tiffany's, and has won three Academy Awards and eleven Grammy Awards.

SPECIAL NOTE: One of the numbers that Mr. Mancini will play is the love theme from <u>Romeo and Juliet</u>. As of this date, it is the best-selling record in the United States and has just passed the million mark in sales.

At the conclusion of the entertainment, you will go forward and congratulate Mr. Mancini. A White House photographer will be available for pictures. You and Mrs. Nixon will then escort your honored guests to the North Portico and wish them good night. After their departure, you and Mrs. Nixon will be escorted to the Family Quarters.
