ECLIPSES—1837.

The only Eclipse visible at Quebec this year, will be that of the moon on the 13th of October, which will be total.

Beginning of Eclipse at 5h. 4m. p. m. The Moon will rise eclipsed at 6h. 26m. Beginning of total obscuration at 6h. 4m.; middle at 6h. 59m.; end of total obscuration at 7h. 36m.; end of eclipse at 8h. 36m. Duration, 3h. 32m. Digits Eclipsed, $18^{\circ}.15'$.

The Eclipse of the Sun on the 4th of May, which will be visible in those parts of the continent situated North and West of Quebec, may be observed in the vicinity of this City under the form of an appulse or simple contact of the discs of the Sun and Moon.

Of the changes of the Moon.

Many persons, understanding that the mean time between one new Moon and another is 29 days, 12 hours, 44 minutes and a fraction, imagine that, to find the full or quarters of the Moon, they have only to add a half or fourth part of that time; and when they do not find the changes marked in the Calender to correspond with this method, they impute it to mistake in the calculation of those changes. It is, therefore, necessary to put them in mind, that the great inequality of the Moon's motions renders the above rule extremely inaccurate, so that nineteen times in twenty, it must fail in giving the true conjunction or change.

West, and distant about one mile; and when the ship bears to the Westward of the Point; the Light House is in one with the outermost Rocks off the Point; and in the day time it forms a bold distinct Mark; and on this line of bearing ships are in the most possible fair way for the general purposes of Navigation, whether bound up or down.

The Mails from Quebec to the several Post Offices on the route to Montreal, to Upper Canada and the United States, are made up and forwarded every day at 6 P.M. in Summer, and 4 P. M. in Winter, Sundays and Fridays excepted.

The Mails from Quebec for the undermentioned Sections of Country, are closed as follows:—

For the Ottawa River, Chambly, St. John, Isle La Noix, and places near Missisquoi Bay, **TUESDAYS & SATURDAYS**—same hours as the Montreal Mail.

For Eastern Townships, **TUESDAYS & SATURDAYS**; same hours as the Montreal Mail.

For Nova-Scotia, New-Brunswick, Baie Chaleur, **TUESDAYS**, at 11 A.M.

Mails for Gaspe are sent only two or three times in the course of the winter by Special Expresses, there being no established line of Post upon that route.

Letters for Europe can, during the season of Navigation, be sent through the Quebec Office, upon paying the Postage to Quebec only. If they are to be sent *via* Halifax, per the Falmouth Packet, the Postage must be paid to Halifax. If *via* New-York, both the Provincial and United States postage must be paid.

Stamstead and Montreal, in Lower-Canada, and St. John, Kingston and Queenston, are in direct communication with the Post Offices in the United States; and Letters for the United States can be sent through either of these Offices, upon payment of the Provincial Postage. The United States' Postage upon such Letters will also be received in Canada, if desired.
