### Indian Delegates At San Francisco "Sail Under False Colours"

Lisbon, April 28 (Domei)-The Indian delegation to the San Conference in San Francisco, according to a dispatch received here

At a press conference Mrs. Pandit declared: "I desire to make it clear that the so-called three Indian representatives attending the San Francisco Conference have not the slightest representative capacity, no sanction of mandate from any responsible groups in India and are merely nominees of the British Government. Anything they say here or any vote they cast has no binding effect or force on the people of India."

Charging the delegates with "sailing under false colours" Mrs. Pandit continued: "India is the pivot of the whole system which always breeds war.

### Lord Wavell To Resign Indian Viceroyalty?

Lisbon, April 28 (Domei)-Speculation is rife among in-formed quarters in London that Lord Wavell, Viceroy of India may threaten to resign over differences with the British Government regarding Britain's policy toward India, according to a London dispatch,

The message said all talks appear to have so far broken down because of the dogged refusal of Churchill and Amery to make any revision in their policy

It was further pointed out that Wavell appears to have run into considerable difficulties as the Indian Viceroy's visit in London has dragged out to a considerable period. Wavell, on his arrival in the British capital, it will be recalled, said his visit was for only a short time.

According to a despatch from London, the London journal "Great Britain and the East." In its editorial yesterday admits that the crisis facing the British Raj in India is indeed a very serious one

The article goes on to say that Lord Wavell, during his 18 months of Governor Generalship In India realised that the situation was very critical for the British Raj and therefore went posthaste to Britain to see whether he could induce his masters in Whitehall to give some concessions to India and thus appease the nationalist forces in the country. However, says the journal, it is not necessary to assume that the Viceroy's mind runs in the direction of further concessions to the Congress Party or any other party.

Meanwhile, a report from New Delhi states that in a desperate attempt to appease the nationalist forces in the country, the British authorities have ordered the unconditional release of 19 more political prisoners in Orissa. The report adds that

### Fresh American Attempt Foiled On Okinawa

A Nippon Base in Okinawa Islands, April 29 (Domei)-Following his abortive offensive on April 26 in the southern sector of Main Okinawa Island, the enemy again faunched a new offensive from early morning on April 28 in the sector on the eastern side of Kochi. However this fresh offensive, made by approximately 500 troops and 20 tanks, was once again smashed by Nippon forces when they put four enemy tanks out of com-mission and inflicted more than 200 casualties on the enemy.

Tokyo, April 28 (Domei)-Dr. Hiroshi Shimomura, President of the Board of Information, in a statement issued today revealed that the highest army and naval leaders met in conference last night with Premier Admiral Baron Kantaro Suzuki and frankly discussed measures for ensuring victory in the war.

Dr. Shimomura's statement declared: "Centering around Premier Suzuki, army and naval leaders met at the Premier's official residence on the evening of April 27 and exchanged frank opinions regarding measures for certain victory in the war."

### Ceylon Revolutionary Leader Now Rearrested For Anti-Br. Activities

Colvin Colombo, the known anti-British revolutionary and President of the Samajist Party, which has been banned by the British authorities has peen re-arrested in india according to a despatch from Colombo. Dr. Colvin despatch Silva escaped British prison in 1942, and was reported to be actively participating in anti-British activities in India.

The despatch adds that four leading members of the Samajist Party were arrested in Ceylon in 1940 under the so-called Defence Regulations but escaped in 1942 after which the party was banned by the British Raj and its prominent members rounded up. ## Sector Checked

This enemy force numbering about 500 men retreated to a point north of Kochi, where it is now constructing positions.

### First Step Taken Toward Indonesian Freedom

Macassar, April 29 (Domei)-As a tep toward the realization of Indonesian independence, in keeping with Nippon's already announced aim, the Naval Administration today formally announced regulations providing for the institution of an advisory council system in the Celebes, South Borneo, Ceram and the Lesser Sundas, the regulations being effective immediately, the appointment of councillors is expected to follow quickly.

The decision of the Naval Administration provides for the establishment. of three types of advisory councils, One will be attached to the Central Naval Administration Headquarters. another to the District Civil Administration and a third to the Provincial Administration. The advisory councils will be entrusted with the task of making constructive suggestions in political and administrative affairs.

The announcement issued by the Naval Administration is significant not only as a further manifestation of Nippon's sincerity to foster the aspirations of the Indonesian races, but also as a definite indication that Nippon desires that Indonesians in the Celebes, South Borneo, Lesser Sundas and Ceram should ultimately attain independence on an equal footing with Indonesians in Djawa.
