Advices from Holland are that though weather has been unfavorable, the bulb crop is good and prices stiffening. Exports to all countries are expected to be larger. Hyacinths, though plentiful, are so much in demand that prices are rising. Lilies, except for rubrum, are somewhat lower than last year. We recommend that all your needs be covered promptly, since late purchases are more likely to cost you more, than less.

# Secrets of Success in Forcing Fall Bulbs 

Success in forcing tulips, narcissi, hyacinths, and iris in greenhouses and cold frames is largely dependent upon temperature control. All the factors which influence healthy growth are discussed in the following digest. It combines the basic principles originally established by scientific investigation in Holland, with the results of long experience in producing and forcing tulips under conditions prevailing in the United States. Every florist who attempts to grow these bulbs in a greenhouse or cold frame should be familiar with the facts which follow.

## PRINCIPLES OF GROWTH ON TULIPS AND NARCISSUS

In forcing bulbs exact temperature control must be maintained for optimum results. Following are some of the growing principles that must be followed to get consistently good results from year to year.

When you receive bulbs from us, initiation of their flower buds is complete, and the floral parts may be examined by cutting a few bulbs horizontally with a knife and examining with a microscope. All the parts of the flower should be visible including petals, stamens and pistil. To find the flower bud, start cutting the bulb in the center and gradually work down by small segments in layers. The leaves will surround the flower, and will be cut first, and should not be confused with the flower parts. Most varieties respond best to $68^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ until the bud has been initiated in the bulb. After bud initiation $48^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ is the proper storage temperature.

Precooling is the procedure of controlling the temperature so that the leaves, stem and flower bud elongate most rapidly in proper balance with one another. Most varieties respond best at $48^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ for the elongation period. Vaughan's precooled bulbs have been given the optimum elongation temperature, as soon as possible after bud initiation has been complete, so that the best and earliest blooms possible can be obtained.

## PROCEDURE FOR GROWER TO FOLLOW

Upon receiving either precooled or regular Tulip bulbs, plant them at once and grow them as close to $48^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ temperature as possible until the shoots are about 2 to 3 inches high. When the plants are at least 2 to 3 inches high they may be moved to the greenhouse bench at listed dates for each variety. When the shoots start to emerge, it is wise to spray all flats or pots with a solution of fermate made in the proportion of 1 pound of fermate to 100 gallons of water with 4 ounces of Grasseli S. S. 3 combined spreader and sticker. This spray will control and prevent the spread of fungous diseases
including Botrytis, or tulip "Fire". A dust of $50 \%$ sulfur and $50 \%$ hydrated lime can also be used with good results particularly as a preventive. This dust should be applied freely after each watering until the flats or pots are removed to the growing bench.

Tulip bulbs can never be "forced" without taking unnecessary chances of white tip, bud blast or soft, poor quality bloom. If the temperature control has been followed as above, the best and earliest bloom will result without growing at above $60^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. Only certain varieties respond favorable to precooling and early forcing, and poor results will be obtained if late varieties are put in the growing bench too soon. Bulb seasons vary as to their early forcing qualities, and it is necessary to play a little on the late side by a week or so rather than risk the entire crop. $60^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ means Day and Night temperatures, and we recommend growing the first two weeks in the bench at $55^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. We have seen bulbs grown at $60^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ come perfectly one week after those grown at $67^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ had white tip and blasted buds. We recommend the following varieties for early bloom in order of benching and earliness. Single Early and Mendel tulips come into bloom early but their substance generally does not come up to Cottage or Darwins. Approximate dates follow.

Varieties may be held for later blooming by continuing the growing at $48^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ until the plants are almost ready to bloom in storage or by growing cooler than $60^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ on the bench. Tulips should be planted in well drained soil, and not over watered or under watered. They will need more frequent waterings on the bench than in storage. Any well balanced fertilizer improves the color of foliage and flowers, but do not use an overdose.

If it is impossible to plant bulbs at once on their arrival, at least unpack and store them as close to $48^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ as possible. Nothing will spoil them faster than temperatures above $70^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$.

If you are going to grow them in a cold frame, pick a site with good drainage and water with cold water thoroughly before placing the flats or pots. A shady spot is preferable so that the sun does not keep the soil temperature high during possible warm Fall days. Cover the flats or pots with 3 or 4 inches of sand so that sprouts will not be broken easily when the time comes for moving into the greenhouse. Where winters are severe, put on a heavy layer of leaves or straw just before hard freezes are apt to come in your temperature zone. Spray the tops of pots or flats with Fermate mixture or dust with sulfur mixture on bringing into the greenhouse. Grow day and night at $60^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ or below; or $55^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ at night and $63^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ during the day. Generally speaking tulips grown in storage that is too cold will grow too short with large flowers; if grown in storage that is too warm the flowers will be small on thin, weak stems. Extreme heat in the greenhouses, any temperature from $67^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ and up, may cause buds to blast or flower tips to turn white, and have poor color. If the plants become dry at any stage of growth bud blast will result.

## IRIS

Iris bulbs do not have the flower buds initiated until the plant is approximately $21 / 2$ inches high in growth and large sizes only may be used for early flowering. Upon receipt of Iris Wedgewood 10 ctm . and up you should plant them and grow at $55^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$, not higher, in the bench or in storage; $48^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ would be acceptable but delays growth about one week. After the plants are $21 / 2$ inches high they should be definitely moved to the greenhouse and the day or night temperature should never be allowed to go above $60^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. Iris need lots of water and can not withstand dry soil conditions. Plant the bulbs shallow in deep flats. Late varieties or small sized Iris bulbs should be grown more slowly at about $45^{\circ}$ to $50^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ until about two weeks before blooming time when the temperature may be raised to $60^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ days and $55^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ nights. Plant Iris in deep flats so the roots have plenty of room, and the plants require good light conditions. Foliage may be trimmed as necessary to allow more light and decrease evaporation and drying out of flats, benches or pots.

## NARCISSUS KING ALFRED

Plant all Narcissus bulbs as soon as received. Bulbs should be grown at $48^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ until the shoots are 2 to 3 inches long at least. It does not hurt them to be left in much longer. Precooled King Alfred may be put on the bench as soon as they are 3 inches long. Grow at $60^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ for three weeks and finish at $65^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. Narcissi like well drained soil, but water freely when heavy foliage growth is in crop. November 28 should be about the proper date to set precooled stock on the bench from the bulb cellar or cold frame. Regular stock of King Alfred should
follow 2 to 3 weeks later, continuing with other varieties as their foliage indicates on forcing types.

## HYACINTHS

Hyacinths if not planted immediately should be stored at $70^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ in a dry place. Delayed planting is permissible for getting quality blooms late. Grow at $50^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ in storage until the flower bud is entirely out of bulb at which time transfer to greenhouse for growing on gradually, increasing the temperature up to $70^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ over a period of two weeks.

## BULB CULTURE SUMMARIZED

The principal points for success with bulb stock of Tulips, Iris and Narcissus are:

1. Order and plant Tulips and Narcissus on time from September 1 to October 15. Best results out doors are obtained from these planting dates also.
2. Use moist soil in planting bulbs, and plant shallow so there is plenty of food and room for the roots. Water well after planting.
3. After unpacking as soon as received, store bulbs as close to $48^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ as possible. Bulbs give off heat; in closed containers this can be serious.
4. Plant as soon as possible, and grow at $48^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ until plants are 2 to 3 inches high. All bulbs should be well rooted before being brought into greenhouse. $48^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ is a good rooting temperature. If bulbs have heaved up in the flats or pots by their rapid rooting, they should be pressed down again with careful handling.
5. In the greenhouse grow cool, never above $60^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ early, or $65^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ for last two weeks of growth.
6. Do not allow flats or pots to dry out.
7. Do not plant Iris too close on benches, 3 inches apart in 4 inch rows is about right, or $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ in flats.
8. Use preventive spray or dust on Tulips.
9. Watch out for bright days raising house temperatures above maximum allowed. Nothing will spoil them faster than temperatures above $70^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$.
10. Get to know varieties.
11. Buy from a reliable source where honest size of bulbs, and true varieties can be expected on delivery.
12. Overhead heat is best for bulb culture as pipes under the bench often heat the plants more than the house thermometer indicates. Where pipes under the bench are used it is wise to string a roll of wrapping paper about a foot high above the edge of each side of the bench. This prevents warm air from circulating up around the side of the bench and drying and heating flats along the edges.
13. We have found dusting bulbs with Spergon is a good preventive of rooting troubles in Tulip culture, particularly in late field plantings.
14. Check your thermometers for accuracy. It is not unusual to find thermometers 5 degrees off and this could ruin a bulb crop run at $65^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ close to maximum.

## MEXICAN LILIES

Temperature Control Protects Crop
Paul R. Krone, of Michigan State College, writes in the June, 1946, issue of "Under Glass":
One of the best lots of Easter Lilies that I saw last spring was a batch of Mexican lilies at the Coy Kendall range in Belleville, Michigan. The bulbs were potted up late in January and carried at a 68 degree continuous temperature. They made Easter beautifully and there were virtually no splits or blasted buds.
This lot of plants certainly bears out Dr. Post's assertion made a year or so ago that a major factor in the blasting of Lily buds is a low soil temperature combined with a high air temperature. He discovered that when lilies are subjected to 50 degrees or lower in the greenhouse at night and this is followed by a bright sunny morning, 100 per cent of the buds are blasted.
He ascribed the difficulty to lack of water since the water loss from the top of the plant is rapid in the sun and the intake of water from the cold soil is slow, resulting in insufficient water in the plant.

Mr.Coy Kendall says that the bulbs should be potted by January 10 , but that the temperature should not be allowed to drop below 65. Dr. Post says that no danger is involved until the buds are visible and from then up until a week before blooming. He recommends that where it is necessary to drop night temperatures below 60 to hold the crop for Easter, the temperature should be raised to 60 degrees at least two hours before the sun strikes the buds.

## PRODUCING BETTER SEEDLING PLANTS

A new growing material to use in place of soil, called mineralite, promises to end many of our problems in germinating fine seeds. Mineralite is a form of mica and is made by roasting a special kind of mica ore until it expands or pops like popcorn.

After heating, the grains of mineralite are porous-a single particle less than $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ in diameter may have thousands of tiny holes. These pores trap so much air that it is practically impossible to drown out seeds grown in this material At the same time, it holds many times its weight in water, so that when handled right, seeds don"t dry out. These $t$ wo things-plenty of air and plenty of mois-ture-are the most difficult parts of the growing operation to control.

Mineralite also controls damping-off. Because it is roasted at more than 2,000 degrees, the damping-off fungus as well as other forms of life that might cause trouble are destroyed. Also, all soluble chemicals are driven off, so that mineralite can t hurt growing plants.
By using mineralite with proper heat controls as a substitute for soil, and
by watering as soon as the first true leaves appear with liquid fertilizers, the by watering as soon as the first true leaves appear with liquid fertilizers, the grower has complete control over every single thing that affects plant growth. rdinary soil with mineralite in any method of growing that has worked well for you in the past. The only difference is that as soon as the first pair of true leaves can be seen, mineralite will have to te watered with a solution of liquid fertilizer to supply the food found in soil. We have found that Hy-Gro, a complete fertilizer which includes the minor elements, is effective when used with one level teaspoonful to a quart of water. Most annuals should be watered twice with this solution before setting out.
An effective way to use mineralite was developed by Dr. Neil Stuart of the Beltsville Experiment Station. An ordinary flat is lined with a tray made out of black paper (The ready-made tray made by the Bird Mfg. Co., fits a standard size flat). This tray is only one inch deep, so that no matter how much water is applied, the mineralite does not become saturated
An ordinary clay flower pot is placed in the center of the flat on the black paper tray. Mineralite is then poured around this pot. After planting, water s poured in the flower pot until the surface of the mineralite looks slightly damp. (Usually, the pot should be filled four or five times.) In many cases it does not need further watering until after the seedlings are showing, since the ray forms a reservoir that keeps the whole flat moist for days.
In our own tests, we find that either straight mineralite used in place of soil, or $50-50$ mineralite and soil will give better results than soil alone. The mixture is not quite as disease-free as straight mineralite, but there is much less trouble from damping off than in soil alone
No special technic is needed to sow seed in mineralite. Broadcasting over the surface seems to be satisfactory even with seeds that we ordinarily think need to be covered. One of the surprising things about seedlings grown in straight mineralite is the enormous mass of hair roots produced. This usually comes free with a wad of the mineralite attached. Don t try to wash off or brush off this material or you may damage the roots. It is because of this mass of roots (which is usually left behind when seedlings are sown in soil) that min-eralite-grown seedlings recover so quickly after transplanting. The correct size of mineralite particle is important.

## Growing Cuttings in Mineralite

Mineralite is better than sand for rooting cuttings. It allows just as much air to get to the cutting as sand, yet holds so much moisture that it needs watering only about one-fifth as often. Because of closer moisture control, cuttings root quicker. More of the roots are saved because they come free with the cutting instead of remaining behind in the sand. Because of the high heat used in processing it, it does not contain fungi which cause damping off.
