

One plane of this squadron took off on a snooper mission over Ponape Island with orders to attack targets of opportunity. The plane arrived over the target at 0730 and took up a circling patrol 65 the island. At various times during this patrol, mative cances were sighted and destroyed. Intense, inaccurate, light A/A was encountered during a photo run over the aimstrips at an altitude of 500'. The fire appeared to originate from the high ground surrounding the field and came from north, south and east, putting the plane in a heavy crossfire. Upon approaching langar Island for reconnaisance, 2 bursts of heavy A/A were encountered at 2,500' and a range of one to two miles. The plane pulled up into the clouds and the fire ceased. The plane left the target at 1010, landing at 1230.
