# Why start a biography in Wikidata?

1. The notability standard is less stringent.
  - [WP:BASIC](#) states: People are presumed **notable** if they have received significant coverage in **multiple published [secondary sources](#)** that are [reliable](#), **intellectually independent** of each other, and [independent of the subject](#).
  - [Wikidata:Notability](#) states: An item is acceptable if and only if it fulfills at least one of these two goals; that is, **if it meets at least one of the three criteria below**:
    1. It contains **at least one valid [sitelink](#)** to a page on Wikipedia, Wikivoyage, Wikisource, Wikiquote, Wikinews, Wikibooks, Wikidata, Wikispecies, Wikiversity, or Wikimedia Commons.
    2. It refers to an instance of a **clearly identifiable conceptual or material entity** that can be described using **serious and publicly available references**.

    3. It fulfills a **structural need**, for example: it is needed to make statements made in other items more useful.

# Why start a biography in Wikidata?

1. The notability standard is less stringent.
2. It can, and should, be a collection point for collecting citations.
  - URLs and DOIs can be entered as references just by themselves, although adding a retrieval date and perhaps the language can be helpful.
  - Book and journal citations also can be used as references, but more fields are advisable.
  - Citations are required for most item property/values to display in the [{{Infobox person/Wikidata}}](#) template.
