Johnson have associated themselves with the intention of forming a corporation under the name of the November Club, for the purpose of literary, social and educational purposes, and establishing and maintaining a place for a reading room, library and social meetings, and have complied with the provisions of the Statutes of this Commonwealth in such case made and provided, as appears from the certificate of the President, Treasurer, and Directors of said corporation, duly approved by the Commissioner of Corporations, and recorded in this office.

Now, therefore, I, William M. Olin, Secretary of this Commonwealth of Massachusetts, do hereby certify that said Emily A. Means, Elizabeth L. Handy, Abby L. Thomson, Ida M. McCurdy, Abbie J. Smith, Helen M. Coy, Maria S. Merrill, Elizabeth B. D. Smyth, Catherine S. Tyer, Philena MíKeen, and Mary A. Johnson, their associates and successors, are legally organized and established as and are hereby made an existing corporation under the name of the Noiember Club, with the powers, rights, privileges, and subject to the limitations, duties and restrictions which by law appertain thereto.

Witness my official signature hereunto subscribed, and the seal of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts hereunto affixed this fifteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

## Tay-fiaus

Article I.-Membership.
The membership shall include the following classes: Regular, Honorary, Associate, and Substitute Members.

## Regular Members

The regular membership shall be limited to one hundred and fifteen.

Each member of more than a year's standing may present to the Board of Directors the names of four candidates for membership. The names thus presented shall constitute a waiting-list for that year only. Members shall be chosen from this list. The voting shall be by ballot, and the votes of seven members of the Board of Directors shall be necessary for an election.

Regular members shall sign the By-Laws, and shall pay an entrance fee of three diollars, and an annual fee of five dollars which shal! be due at the first meeting in November.

They shall elect officers of the Club, and act upon all questions that shall come before them.

Membership shall be forfeited by non-payment of the annual fee within one month after it is due.

## Honorary Members

Honorary membership shall include:-

First, all regular members of the Club who have permanently removed from Andover.

Second, any distinguished person elected by the Club.

## Associate Members

Any lady temporarily residing in Andover, whose name has been proposed in writing by three regular members, may be elected by the Board of Directors as an associate member for a term of three years.

The voting shall be by ballot, and, the candidate shall receive at least seven votes.

The annual fee shall be the same as that of a regular member.

An associate member shall not participate in the business of the Club, nor be re-elected, nor retain membership after removal from Andover.

The number of associate members shall not exceed fifteen.

## Substitute Members.

A regular member intending to be absent from Andover at least three months shall notify the secretary to that effect, and may appoint a substitute member for that Club year, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors. No member shall appoint a substitute for more than one year. After that time the power of appointment shall pass to the Directors.

Substitute members shall not take part in any business of the Club.

Article II.-Officers.
The officers of the Club shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and six Directors, who shall together constitute a Board of Directors.

Officers shall be elected by ballot at the annual meeting; the President, Vice-Prelsident, Secretary and Treasurer for one year, and two Directors for three years.
No Director shall be eligible for re-election until one year after the expiration of her term of service. All vacancies in the Board of Directors shall be filled by the Club at a regular meeting, notice of the election having been given at the preceding meeting.

## Duties of Officers.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors, and shall perform all the duties usually belonging to her office.

In the absence of the President, her duties shall devolve upon the First Vice-President; or, in her absence, upon the Second VicePresident. In the absence of all these officers the Club may elect a President pro tempore.

The Secretary shall keep a full record of all meetings of the Club; and at each meeting the records of the previous meeting shall be read for correction and approval. She shall also have charge of the correspondence of the Club.

The Treasurer shall collect and have charge of all dues, fees, and other moneys of the Club; and shall spend or invest the same as may be directed by the Board of Directors. Bills shall be approved by the President before payment.

A correct account of receipts, expenditures, and investments shall be kept, and near the close of the year the same shall be audited by someone appointed by the Board of Directors, but not from its own members. The accounts shall be closed annually, and a report thereof submitted by the Treasurer to the Board of Directors at its last meeting for the year.

This report shall be read to the Club at the annual meeting.

The Board of Directors shall have charge of all affairs and manage all business of the Club, concerning which no other provision is made in the By-laws. The Board of Directors shall appoint one of its number as a Clerk, who shall keep its records and attend to such correspondence as it may direct. The Board shall submit, at the annual meeting, a report of the work of the Club for the year then closing.

> Article III.-Quorum.

Twenty regular members of the Club shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

## Article IV.-Meetings.

The annual meeting shall be held upon the first Monday in May.

Regular meetings of the Club shall begin at a date and hour determined by the Board of Directors. From the first meeting in November until the first Monday in May, these shall he held fortnightly upon the same day of the week as the first meeting.

Special meetings of the Club may be called by the President, through the Secretary, at the request of six Directors.

Special meetings of the Board of Directors shall be called by the President, through the Secretary, at the request of two Directors.

The Board of Directors shall arrange its own calendar, but shall adjourn all meetings, except the last for the year, to a fixed date.

> article V.-Manual.

The business of this Club and of its Board of Directors shall be conducted according to the rules of procedure given in "The Woman's Manual of Parliamentary Law," by Harriette R. Shattuck, when not otherwise provided for in the By-Laws.

> Article VI.-Guests.

At the regular meeting of the Club, when the entertainment is given by its own members, no guests shall be invitedi. An exception to this rule may be made in favor of the
leader of the department which entertains on that day, who shall be authorized to give special invitations at her discretion.

When anyone who is not a member of the Club takes part in an entertainment, each member may bring one guest.

Article Vil.-Amendments.
At any regular meeting the By-Laws may be amended by a vote of two-thirds of the members present and voting, providing the amendment proposed has been presented in writing at a regular meeting of the Club at least two weeks previous.

Article Vili.-Suspensions.
By a unanimous vote, any By-Law, except Article VIII, may be suspended at any meeting for that day only.

This By-Law cannot be suspended.

## 

FOR NOMINATING AND ELECTING OFFICERS OF THE NOVEMBER CLUB.
At the first meeting in April the President shall appoint a committee of three (3), (no member of which shall be an officer of the Club), to prepare a ticket of officers to be elected at the annual meeting.

This committee shall send to each member of the Club a blank form naming the offices to be filled, and requesting the return of the blank within one week, with the choice of each officer required. These returns shall be regarded as the voice of the Club, suggestive to the committee, but not limiting their choice.

After these returns have been received, the nomination committee shall prepare a ticket, placing upon it the name of one candidate for each office, having first obtained the consent of each candidate. The tickets shall be distributed and voted upon at the annual meeting. Should no person receive a majority of votes for any office, there shall be another ballot for such office.

Members shall vote by placing a cross before the name of the candidate for each office, and the voting shall be continued until all the offices are filled, unless ordered by the Club.
The above report, as amended, was adopted February 24, 1902, as the Rule for the nomination of officers.
