



# Why do we need a UCoC?

# A broader picture:

- Over 50% of Wikipedias and around 20% of other Wiki projects have no conduct policies/guidelines.
- As per the Community Insights report (2018), 40% of over 250 people surveyed reported that existing conduct policies needed "Quite a bit" or "A lot" of improvement.
- About 22% of Wikimedians reported avoiding Wikimedia projects for one to three days because they felt unsafe.

### **Establishing Norms:**

#### A Universal Code of Conduct

**Objective:** The Board of Trustees has recognized the need for a standard set of behavioral guidelines for the movement as a whole. Trust & Safety is working with communities to start building that set of guidelines. This project is in the early stages of discussion.

A Universal Code of Conduct for Wikimedians will foster ethical behavior, goodwill, and a good working atmosphere in the community.

#### Goals:

- Identify existing behavioral policies in the communities/projects.
- Find common values, and analyze discrepancies.
- Discuss the concept with community members at conferences and on Meta, and take their inputs.
- Incorporate the ideas and develop a comprehensive set of guidelines that work for all.







# What have we done so far?

## Collected ideas and studied practices:


#### **Assembled community policies**

- Gathered all conduct policies and behavioural guidelines from existing projects/communities.
- Started to identify which policies have been working really well and which ones have had problems.
- Analyze how various communities have prioritised policies differently.
- Assigned uniqueness quotient to projects based on their conduct/behavioural policies.
- Collected ideas at Wikimania

### Wikipedia conduct policies distribution






# Other major projects

0 = No or little work done on policies

1 = Very similar policy names and content to Wikimedia Terms of Use

2 = A combination of original and translated policies

3 = Completely separate structure and content


