SUBJECT: Transfer Recommendation for Guantanamo Detainee, Sharhulab Mirmuhammed, ISN: US9AF-00313DP

1. (S) **Personal Information:** Sharhulab Mirmuhammed is an Afghan national born in 1972 (age 30) in Brayiam, Afghanistan. Detainee has latent tuberculosis but is otherwise in good health.
2. (FOUO) **Detention Information:** Detainee is from Brayiam village, Kagai District, Jalalabad Province, Afghanistan. Detainee traveled to nearby Samsai village to celebrate Eid and to attend the funeral of a local villager. While in Samsai, detainee met an individual who informed him that there was work available in Pakistan. Detainee departed Samsai on approximately 4 January 2002 for Wacha Dara, Pakistan to seek employment. When detainee arrived at the Afghanistan-Pakistan border, Pakistani officials approached and questioned him concerning four Arabs who were just apprehended. The Pakistani border patrol believed that detainee was a guide for the four Arabs in their custody. Detainee was taken to the police station in Parachinar, Pakistan and transferred to U.S. forces on 5 January 2002. Detainee was subsequently transported to Guantanamo Bay Naval Base, Cuba on 15 January 2002 because of his knowledge of covert travel routes through Tora Bora mountains south of Jalalabad, Afghanistan to Parachinar, Pakistan. The detainee has been cooperative, but Joint Task Force Guantanamo considers the information obtained from and about him as neither valuable nor tactically exploitable.
3. (S) **Assessment:** Based on current information, detainee ISN: US9AF-00313DP is assessed as being neither affiliated with al-Qaida nor a Taliban leader. Moreover, based on the detainee folder, the knowledgeability brief, and subsequent interrogations by JTF Guantanamo, the results of which are available on the JTF Guantanamo detainee database, the detainee has no further intelligence value to the United States and will not be seen for further intelligence purposes. Subject detainee has not expressed thoughts of violence or made threats toward the U.S. or its allies during interrogations or in the course of his detention. Based on the above, detainee does not pose a future threat to the U.S. or its interests.


