No. 1469 Telegram No. 898 To Ambassador Sato at Moscow (Trgent, office-chief cipher) 19:30, 13 July 1945 Reference to my telegram No. 893, It was considered proper that I should receive Ambassador Malik and convey the intended dispatch of the special envoy, but as Malik was ill abed, I sent Ando, Director of the Bureau of Political Affairs, to convey to the Ambassador that His Majesty desired to dispatch Prince Konoe as special envoy, carrying with him the personal letter of His Majesty stating the Imperial wish o end the war; that you were to convey the matter to the Soviet sovernment; and that the Ambassador should concurrently accord facilities in this cornection. Ambassador Malik promised to telegraph promptly about the matter to his Government.
