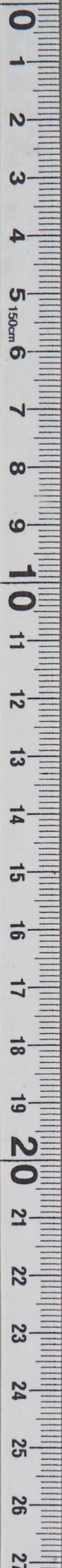

1. 1. By letter dated 13 October 1950 the Commander-in-Chief, Far East, established a Table of Distribution for a War Crimes Division in the Judge Advocate Section, Headquarters Eighth Army. The Table of Distribution included a total of sixty-two persons, consisting of twenty-six officers, one warrant officer, and thirty-five enlisted men. By letter dated 4 November 1950 (TAB A), addressed to the Command Staff Judge Advocate, General Headquarters, Far East Command, through technical channels, the Chief of the War Crimes Division advised that augmentation of the Table of Distribution as formerly published was necessary and requested an additional forty-three spaces, consisting of nineteen officers and twenty-four enlisted men. Pursuant to the request of the Chief of the War Crimes Division, this office initiated a draft of radio (TAB B) to the Chief of Staff, through G-1, dated 14 November 1950, approving the augmentation as requested. Approval of the draft of radio is now pending.
2. The purposes for which the personnel are provided by the original Table of Distribution and the personnel supplied by the proposed augmentation are the investigation, preparation, and conduct of trials of suspected war criminals and embrace, accordingly, investigators, interpreters, law members, trial counsel, and court reporters. In view of the international character of the war crimes program, as well as the improbability of furnishing United States personnel in all instances, it is contemplated, and the pending proposed radio so instructs, that spaces in the augmentation will be filled, insofar as practicable, with non-United-States United Nations nationals and Republic of Korea personnel.
3. By radio G 28002 KJA (TAB C), dated 20 November 1950, from the Commanding General, Eighth Army, to the Commander-in-Chief, Far East, authority was requested to organize a United Nations War Crimes Command as a separate Army unit, utilizing the Table of Distribution authorized for the War Crimes Division, Judge Advocate Section, Headquarters Eighth Army, and further requested authority concurrently to discontinue the War Crimes Division, Judge Advocate Section, Eighth Army.
4. Following receipt of the cited radio, a letter dated 19 November 1950 (TAB D) was received from the Chief of the War Crimes Division explaining the above request. The letter sets out that one of the principal reasons for the desire on the part of the Commanding General, Eighth Army, to organize the separate command is to facilitate housekeeping and security

upon separation of the war crimes functions from the Headquarters Eighth Army. Both a Table of Distribution and Table of Allowances would be involved and the command would operate separately from Headquarters Eighth Army except for staff and command supervision.

5. The Commanding General, Eighth Army, does not state that establishment of a separate command is necessary to enable fulfillment of the mission assigned to the War Crimes Division of the Judge Advocate Section, Eighth Army, nor that a separate housekeeping unit or independent logistic support is needed to enable such fulfillment. On the contrary, it is apparent that separate housekeeping and security personnel are made necessary by the establishment of a separate War Crimes Command.

6. The establishment of a separate command would multiply the administrative burdens imposed upon the officer primarily charged with the responsibility for the conduct of war crimes trials and, in the opinion of this office, in the absence of a demonstrated need for a separate command, the addition of any handicap to efficient performance of the primary mission is undesirable.

7. Attached for approval is a draft of radio (TAB E) to the Commanding General, Eighth Army, advising him that his request for the establishment of a separate war crimes command is not favorably considered at this time.

8. Recommend approval of TAB E.

I. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMAND. 1. The Commanding General, Eighth United States Army, has been assigned the mission of conducting combat operations in Korea, including the logistical support of such operations. In order to relieve the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army, of the responsibilities and functions normally charged to a communications zone, the Japan Logistical Command is established effective 25 August 1950, as a major command of the Far East Command.

2. The missions of the Commanding General, Japan Logistical Command, are:

a. Those presently prescribed by current directives for the Eighth United States Army performed within the geographical limits indicated in paragraph 4.

b. Logistical and administrative operations for the support of United Nations Forces engaged in operations in Korea, except those specifically delegated to other commanders.

c. Logistical and administrative operations for the support of combat and service units stationed in Japan or en route thereto.

d. Such additional missions and functions as may be directed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers or the Commander-in-Chief, Far East.

3. The Japan Logistical Command will be operated in accordance with the general principles established in Department of the Army publications and with pertinent instructions contained in directives of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and Commander-in-Chief, Far East.

4. The geographical area of responsibility of the Commanding General, Japan Logistical Command, is that presently assigned to the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army, exclusive of Korea; and those posts, camps, stations, and areas presently assigned to the Commanding General, Headquarters and Service Group, General Headquarters, Far East Command; the Commander, United States Naval Forces, Far East; and the Commanding General, Far East Air Forces.

5. That portion of the Headquarters and Headquarters Company, Eighth United States Army, still remaining in Japan, is redesignated Headquarters and Headquarters Company, Japan Logistical Command. All personnel, appropriated and budgeted nonappropriated funds, property, and records are transferred to the latter organization effective 25 August 1950, except as directed in paragraph 8. Headquarters and Headquarters Company, Japan Logistical Command, will be organized in accordance with Tables of Distribution to be published.

6. All posts, camps, stations, depots, ports, and other military installations in the geographical area indicated in paragraph 4 are transferred to the Japan Logistical Command.

7. All units and detachments in the geographical area indicated in paragraph 4, presently assigned or attached to the Eighth United States Army, are transferred in their present status and station to the Japan Logistical Command.

8. Headquarters funds and Contingency of the Army Project 435 funds now under control of the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army, will remain under his control.

II. APPOINTMENT OF COMMANDING GENERAL. Announcement is made of the appointment of Major General WALTER L. WEIBLE, 011308, United States Army, as Commanding General, Japan Logistical Command.



1. Eighth Army letter, AGFB 322, 12 Aug 50, to CINCFE requested authority to reorganize the 8085th Signal Depot Co. CG Eighth Army stated that personnel and equipment required in this reorganization are on hand in Eighth Army.

2. Signal C/N 1 to G-3 thru G-4, 24 Aug 50, indicated Signal's concurrence in Eighth Army's request and recommended approval. Signal O stated that the reorganization will make the unit capable of furnishing its own transportation for use between the port and depot and in the depot area.

3. Eighth Army's request for reorganization consisted of augmenting the present company with 3 truck drivers (heavy), 8 six ton semi-trailers and 3 4 - 5 Ton Truck tractors. 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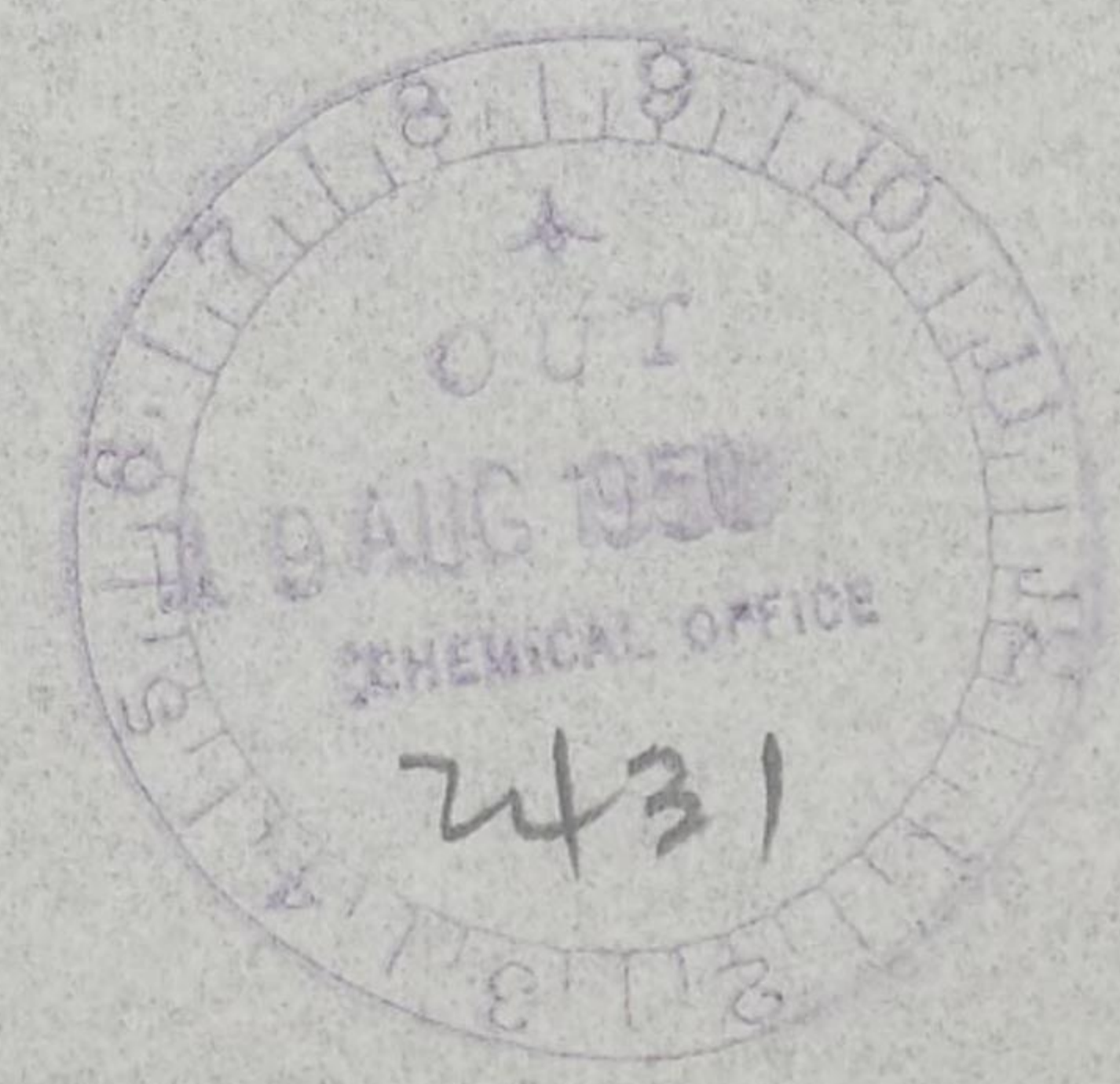
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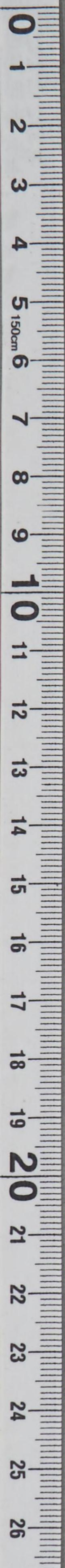

4. C/N 2 informs G-3 that personnel and equipment have been requested from the ZI and indicates G-4 concurrence in the proposed reorganization.

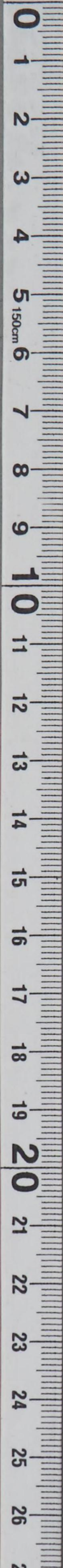

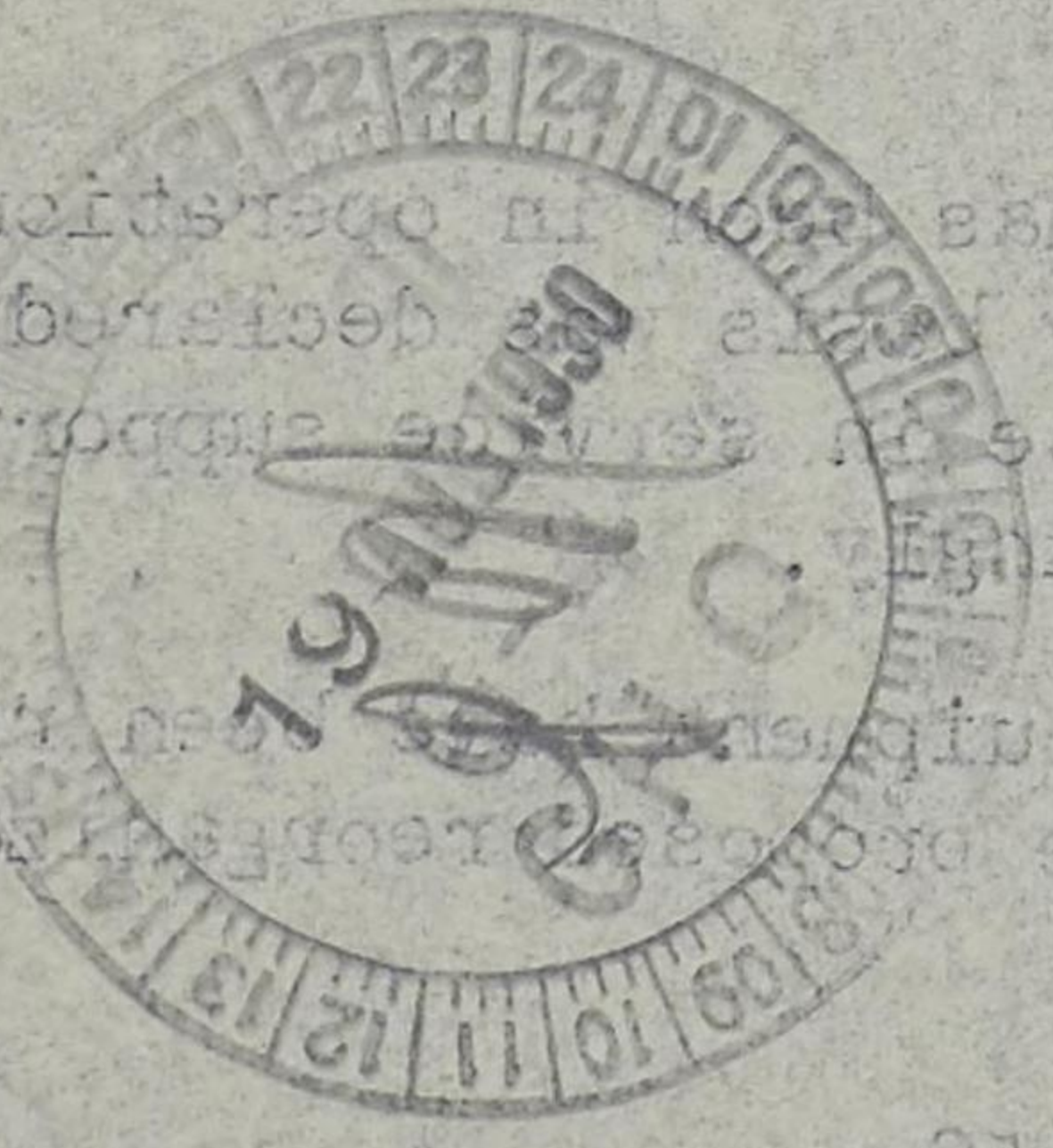
