1. On the approval of Marbo Operation Plan No. 6 and with the concurrence of CinCPac Flt, USAFI Guam was transferred on 1 Sept 1950 from Army to Navy control. According to the plan all administrative matters (including the operation of USAFI) connected with Navy activities in Guam will be conducted under the direction of CinCPac.

2. As a result of several days conference with Lt (jg) Carlson from the staff of Commander Navy Forces Marianas, it was developed that ComNavMarianas desires to continue operation of USAFI Guam as a subordinate USAFI under the technical control of USAFI Japan. Otherwise, he will have to organize a complete USAFI branch at considerable additional expense in money and personnel or accept the undesirable time lag inherent in dealing direct with USAFI Madison. TI&E Section, GHQ, and USAFI Japan have no objection to servicing USAFI Guam since no change is involved in present operations. The volume of work from USAFI Guam is expected to be only a small portion of the total work load of USAFI Japan.

3. Proposed message (Tab A) requests approval of the plan for USAFI Japan to continue exercising policy control over USAFI Guam as a branch USAFI in FEC and to provide correspondence lesson service, to record and report tests and registrations, to supply USAFI materials, and in general to provide a direct technical channel for USAFI Guam. Part II of the proposed message is deemed required as Army Regulations do not specifically prescribe for a Navy operated USAFI branch.
