1. In compliance with ADCL 200-1 dated 11 April 1951, the following information is hereby submitted.

At 1305, 22 April 1952, M/Sgt Malloy received a phone call from Mrs. [REDACTED] O. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that Mrs. [REDACTED] had called her stating that she had seen three saucer-shaped objects in the sky. Mrs. [REDACTED] was then interviewed by Lt. Todd.

(a) Three (3) saucer-shaped objects gray-brown in color on the underside and shiny metallic on all other surfaces. Estimated speed at 300 mph.

(b) Time sighted at 12:15 IST 22 April 1952, and lasted a period of two (2) minutes.

(c) Observation was visual and speed estimated at 300 mph.

(d) Location of observer 45° 15' N. Latitude. 120° 10' W. Longitude. Object North of this position. Object moving toward East at approximately 20,000 to 40,000 ft.

(e) Witnessed by Mrs. Stockton with no observer experience.

(f) Weather - Clear 60/ - N/E 3



At 12:15 on the 22nd of April 1952, I was standing in my yard in Condon, Oregon. I saw three saucer-shaped objects moving East, North of Condon. They were in formation and the larger saucer apparently in the lead. They were gray-brown in color on the underside and shiny metallic on all other surfaces. They were moving at a fast rate of speed and I saw them only for approximately two minutes. The larger was revolving, but it was so far away that I couldn't tell the direction.
