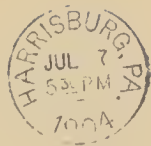

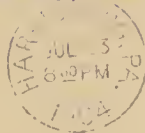

Messrs. S. H. & H. Chapman,

Dear Sirs:-

Yours of the 27th to hand, with the four coins enclosed. I don't understand why you sent me the 1801 cent and the 1808 cent in good condition, after I ordered them in very good condition. Also, why you charge me \$.75 for each of them, when on the 13th inst. you quoted them to me at \$.75 in very good condition. In short, you want to charge me the same price for good coins as for very good coins; and there is quite a difference in the condition of coins, and should be a corresponding difference in price.

The Columbian 1/2 Dollar of 1892 is the only satisfactory coin sent me;- the Isabella Quarter is tarnished, and the two cents are not in the condition in which I wanted them for \$.75.

Considering this, I will keep the four coins as they are and send you the \$.14 postage, or else return the two cents and have you exchange them for two of the same date, but in very good condition; also, either return the Isabella Quarter, or let you exchange it for one which is uncirculated and not tarnished.

We both forgot to sign our letters, and I suppose this explains the oversight on your part.

Do you guarantee all your coins not to be counterfeit, restrikes, or altered?

Please write as soon as possible and let me know whether you will agree to any of the above propositions.

I am very sorry that this misunderstanding has occurred, and I hope it can be adjusted to our mutual satisfaction.

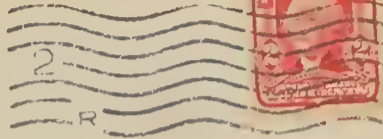
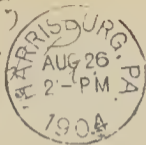

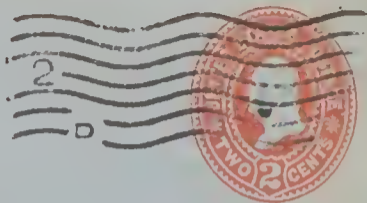
