1. Attention invited to the inclosed communication from the Yogyo Cement Co., Ltd., Osaka City, which cites electric power shortage as the principal deterrent to the production of required quantities of limestone at their quarry at Ohirayama, Kochi Prefecture.

2. This headquarters became familiar with the Yogyo cement plant in the course of a recently completed study of cement producing facilities in Osaka Prefecture. The Yogyo plant is known to be one of the principal indigenous suppliers of cement. The study further revealed that a large number of the current construction projects in Japan, particularly in this area, are directly dependent upon the cement made available by the Yogyo Company.

3. At the present time, the Yogyo Company is planning to expand its Osaka plant facilities. The expansion program will not only result in increased cement production, but will relieve, to a degree, the effect of growing unemployment by creating jobs for a large number of persons. However, expansion cannot be considered unless maximum supplies of limestone are available.

4. It is recommended that the criteria cited in the inclosed communication be studied to determine what assistance can be rendered in connection with maximum utilization of limestone production facilities at the Ohirayama quarry.

1. In reference to your letter requesting release of 36 dozen pencils, dated 26 January 1949, the following paragraphs from SCAPIN 1900, subj: "International Postal Service", dated 28 May 1948, are quoted for your information:

a. Paragraph 7c: "Gift articles, as distinguished from relief items, such as watches, fountain pens, etc., will not be permitted entry."

b. Paragraph 7f: "Excessive quantities of permitted items; that is, quantities in excess of the reasonable needs of the addressee and/or his immediate family, will be extracted by the Japanese Customs Service and delivered to the appropriate agency of the Eighth Army for distribution to recognized relief agencies."

2. As provided in above paragraph, the pencils mentioned in your letter were confiscated and disposed of accordingly.

3. Request you inform the sender of the existing regulations to prevent similar occurrences in the future.
