

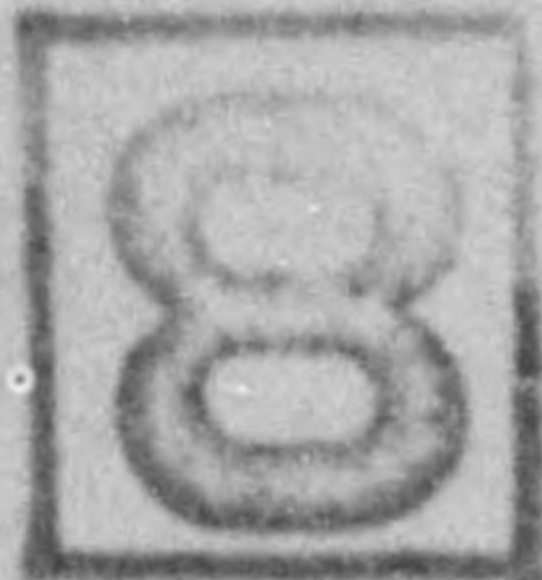



1930: Commenced the management of plant at Osaka for the purpose of manufacturing tools and repairing machines.

1938: Removed machineries in the above plant from Osaka to Gifu in order to meet the demands of Gifu city to bring up its industrial level, and besides the repair of general machines which is most demanded in Gifu district at that time, researched in order to manufacture small type lathes.

1941: Commenced the manufacture of high speed minute lathe, and at the same time made hobbing of automobile's gear.

1944: Due to the directive of War Munition Ministry, obliged to convert for the manufacture of simplex lathe, but before changing to the regular production ordered to reconvert in March 1945, and began to manufacture parts of aircraft, but in course of manufacture of their parts the war came to an end, accordingly ceased the operation.

1945: In Oct, commenced the repair of burnt machines (chiefly wood working machines) due to the ardent request of plants in this city and its environs, and also began to manufacture wood working machines needed for lumbers which are used by occupation forces and rehabilitation residences, and at the same time made the hobbing of mission gear which is most shortage among the parts of automobile, and came to the present time.

K. reasons why need the remaining of plant:

1. Gifu city and its environs were mostly burnt down by the war calamity, and its rehabilitation is an urgent problem. our company fortunately escaped from war damage, accordingly we earnestly desire to contribute for the reconstruction of Gifu city with our equipments and techniques.
2. Hitherto the mechanical industrial facilities were scarce in this district, moreover the majority of them was destroyed by the war calamity, accordingly if the equipments of our plant which were only left, is removed away as reparations, there will be a lot of obstacle for the rehabilitation of this district.
3. This district is rich in wood production, accordingly. wood working machines manufactured in our company are much demanded for sawing of lumber used for occupation forces and rehabilitation.
4. Wood working machines partly, are overflowing in the markets, but conscientious goods are very scarce. Machines manufactured in our company are exquisite, because they were applied with the equipments and techniques of manufacturing machine tools, and we believe that they are indispensable in the industrial fields.
5. All employees ardently wish to continue works and earnestly desire for the exception from the reparation plant.

K.K. Gifu Kosakuki Seizosho (The Gifu Machine Tools Mfg. Co., Ltd.) had been established in March, 1938, and since then it has contributed for the development and promotion of mechanical industrial circle in Gifu prefecture, namely, it enlightened the various plants in this prefecture and made them improve their mechanical facilities, and also set up the technician's training institute annexed to the plant and trained many young mechanical workers and sent out them to the mechanical industrial circle, and so on.

In 1940, this company researched and finished the minute lathe by themselves without any military or official support, and this minute lathe got a good reputation in the mechanical industrial circle, and the existence of Gifu mechanical industrial circle was recognized broadly due to it.

In 1944, due to the increased pressure for the civilian production, this company obliged to convert to the manufacture of war munitions, but with the war's termination commenced the manufacture of wood working machines and wood sawing machines which were indispensable for the rehabilitation of post wartime.

Wood sawing machines and wood working machines are very important, because this prefecture is one of the principal wood producing districts in Japan, and also they must be exported in future as returned goods, moreover, on the way of post war economical reconstruction in order to effect a highest capacity with a minimum equipment, it is required to apply an excellent equipment and technique, accordingly we designated this company as most suitable plant, and recommended it to the National Wood Working Machine's Association, and now we intend to elevate it as the superior wood working machines mfg. plant in this prefecture, and to make it one help for the rehabilitation of the peacetime production in this prefecture.

As this company has special function in this prefecture, whether this company remain or not, much concerns in the prosperity of the peacetime production, accordingly I petition for the exception of this plant from reparations.

LETTER ATTACHED TO THE APPLICATION

In 1938, the Mayor Matsue's days, in accordance with the municipal request to promote the industry in Gifu city, K.K. Gifu Kosakuki Seizoaho (The Gifu Machine Tools Mfg. Co., Ltd.) was completed under municipal support, by which the purchasing of its land and the construction of its building etc, were carried out.

Since the establishment of this company, it engaged devotedly in the manufacturing of civilian machines in and about the Gifu city, and strove to elevate the function of its machinery and equipment, and also endeavoured to improve its manufactures, Especially I admit that this company contributed to the betterment and improvement of machine tools, which are the mother of various machines.

During the war time this company manufactured the munition by the military order, but after the War's termination it undertook the revival and repair of various kinds of machine damaged by the war calamity, and helped their reconstruction by speedy working.

Since 1932, YASUICHI KODAMA, now the president of this company had been aiding the mechanical industry in Gifu city, and promoted its development. By his relation to the city, this company was established under the municipal support. Now our city, which lost a majority of the facilities due to the war calamity, must speedily reconstruct the peace-time industry, and in order to achieve this purpose and to obtain good results, I wish to make use of their technics and equipment. This is the essential purpose of this company.

Accordingly I hereby beg your honour for the exception of this plant from the reparation plant, because this plant is indispensable for the stability of our citizen's life.

Our association is much expecting its manufactures, and in case its machineries are taken away as reparations, it will become imposible to manufacture the wood working machines, and also there will be obstacles for the rehabilitation works.

We hereby earnestly request you will give special consideration for the removal of its machineries.

We, the employees of K.K. Gifu Kosakuki Seizosho (the Gifu Machine Tools Mfg. Co. Ltd) hereby wish to present a petition to your honour with reference to the matter that the above factory where we are engaged in, have been listed in the reparation plants this time, and we earnestly desire that you will give us special favour in consideration of the eager attitude of all employees.

Our factory is located inconveniently, but taking advantage of its location, we escaped from the war calamity, and at present are continuing operation without any damage to the machineries, buildings and other equipments. We feel a great pleasure of that we can work for the reconstruction of peaceful Japan, and we are encouraging so as to revive this feeling upon our works.

We were working without having least expectation of that our factory, name of which was unawared not only in Japan but even in Gifu district, would be named to reparation plant as one of the leading plants in Japan, therefore, when we found the name of our factory in the list of reparation plants announced this time, we, all employees were much shocked thinking that our works and eager attitude will come to nothing, but on the other hand we felt some pride as the employees working in the important plant as to designated by the Allied Powers, and we fell into the confused feeling. Nevertheless, at the 1st and 2nd inspection by the officers of Military Government, it was ordered that untill the further directive the work, manufacture of machines and operation of machineries, may be continued on as hitherto, and at present we are continuing work believing the speech of the president that all employees should make efforts for the production without creating unrest. For the operation of factory, immediately after the war's termination the company's officials studied about what to do after conversion, and as a result they determined to manufacture wood working machines with reference to the rehabilitation of residences which are most urgently required under the situation since war calamity, and also to manufacture parts of automobiles' engine which are very shortage in Japan at present after getting permission from the Allied Powers, and for these manufacture they decided to make use of all the technique of

manufacturing the machine tools to the new production. Accordingly we, the employees thought that how our works contribute to the promotion of rehabilitation and the relief of communication, and also thought that it is our responsibility working in undamaged plant to perform all orders from general customers, though we are sometimes ordered to make a difficult processing or to deliver good within the earliest period because the majority of plants in Gifu City were burnt down and our factory is equipped with excellent machineries being not paralleled with those of other plants, and now we are delivering goods exhibiting the highest capacity of our machineries.

The relation between labour and capital is especially in good harmonization, because in our factory many employees have been trained in our company for long years, and we have never occurred the problem relating the treatment, because the company usually amended the treatment preceding to the employee's demand. The management Council was established by the members of committee designated from the employees, and the operation of business was carried out by the resolution of committee. Sports were encouraged and entertainment meeting were held as the healthy recreation. As a result the relation between the company and employees is in excellent condition.

Under the present circumstances when many plants have been closed down by the directives since the war's termination, or have lost their facilities by the air-raid, in case our factory is taken up as reparations, we consider that there will be a lot of obstacles not only in this prefecture but also in this country, and at the same time all employees will be obliged to loss hopes and stability of life at once.

We, all employes hereby wish to present a petition to your honour electing representatives, and beg you will give full consideration of our factory's present situation and our difficult circumstance, and petition you will exempt our factory from the reparation plants so as that we can work on for the reconstruction of new Japan at the present condition.

1. The Gifu Kosakuki Seisoshu Co., 1791 Hokujo, Gifu City has been inspected and reviewed for possible partial exemption. It is the opinion of this headquarters, that this plant is capable of the production figures as specified in their enclosed application. The wood working machines (wood planners) produced are class one machines, management is well informed on production processes, and machine tool manufacturing methods. This establishment employs 114 experienced machine tool workers.

2. The following is an aggregate for our recommendation:

a. The Gifu Kosakuki Seisoshu Co. was incorporated and commenced operation in 1938. Plants constructed after 1937 cannot be considered essential to civilian economy.

b. Other non-reparations facilities are available. Alternate sources have been found in this area, wood planners and automobile replacement parts (transmission gears) are in sufficient numbers for such industrial facilities in this Prefecture.

c. The interim reparations program was designed to remove certain types of equipment and productive units from Japan, that are obviously in excess of requirements. This selection within the machine tool industry was correctly selected, and as such considered surplus in its entirety to a minimum Japanese peacetime economy.

3. In view of the above mentioned and the facts contained in the attached check sheet, this headquarters recommends that this plant remain on the reparations list and further recommends disapproval of the enclosed application for partial exemption.
