c. Letter 387.6/540-46, General Headquarters, SCAP,
subject: "Transportation Permit", dated 7 June 1948.

2. In compliance with reference 1a above, the Kyushu Maritime Bureau was instructed to begin loading reparations on 3 June. To facilitate loading, two large lighters were authorized to be loaded in advance but due to difficulty encountered with the loading of the Hai Siu, caution about loading too many lighters was emphasized. Specific instructions were given to the Maritime Bureau who relayed them to the Shipping and Stevedoring Co. Ltd. (Sasebo Harbor Transportation Co. Ltd). This company took the liberty of loading ten extra lighters which in so doing, was the cause of an additional charge of 45,489.50 yen to the loading operations of the "Chi Chung".

3. On 5 June this headquarters was notified by TWX Cite GE-359, Kyushu Military Government Region that the Chinese vessel "Chi Chung" had been substituted for the S.S. "Hai Cho" and would arrive at Sasebo 9 June. In as far as this situation had not arisen previously, it was

concluded that the Transportation Permit would follow immediately, and laborers were hired for that date.

4. On 7 June at 1130 hours, the Sasebo Fleet Activities notified this headquarters that radio contact had been made with the Chi Chung and it was expected to dock at 1530 hours making it two days ahead of schedule.

5. Upon arrival at the port, Captain Wu of the Chi Chung requested the use of laborers to shift 400 tons of commercial cargo. It was pointed out that the Reparations Section has no authority to move or shift commercial cargo and that he would have to make a private transaction between himself and a Japanese contractor and that under no condition shall this cost be billed against reparation.

6. It was understood by this headquarters that all space on the Chi Chung was reserved for loading reparations equipment, had this been the case the Chinese could have cleared this port of all machinery allocated to them on the first segment, but consequently 295 metric tons remain.

7. It is recommended by this headquarters that the cost for demurrage for two lighters from 8 to 15 June which amounts to 2,015.60 yen plus the laborers wages for 9 June which amounts to 6,560 yen be charged against the Chinese Reparations instead of being the responsibility of the Japanese Government.

1. Reference is made to the following:

- a. A. G. Letter 387.6/540-12 General Headquarters AFG 500 dated 1st March 1948, subject: "Transportation Permit".
- b. A. G. Letter 387.6 General Headquarters AFG 500 dated 6 March 1948, subject: "Transportation Permit".
- c. A. G. Letter 387.6/540-36 General Headquarters AFG 500 dated 28th April 1948, subject: "Amendment of Transportation Permit".

2. In compliance with the above reference, the Japanese made the necessary arrangements for the transfer of equipment allocated to China, from storage in warehouses to the dock area. Sorting 50% on the dock and the remainder in lighters. This work had to be started in advance due to the difficulty in removing package from warehouse with no overhead cranes.

3. All the ground work was completed on the 28th of April, expecting the S.S. HAI SHU in Sasebo on the 30th.

4. On the 29th of April, Kyushu Military Government Region notified Sasebo Port Detachment, the HAI SHU would not arrive in Sasebo until the 10th of May. This unexpected change had caused a great deal of confusion. First of all, 16 lighters were loaded with 20% of the packages allocated to China. Leaving the lighters loaded would result in an additional charge to the Japanese Government of 176,065 yen. On the other hand, if lighters were unloaded, which would take roughly five days, then on 5th of May loading operation would have to start again to be ready on the 10th, for the "HAI SHU". This would result

in considerable unnecessary handling of cargo, therefore it was decided to leave the cargo stored in the lighters.

5. On the 12th of May, Kyushu Mil Govt Region notified this headquarters, the arrival date was changed to the 14th of May.

6. In compliance with the Transportation Permit, the Fleet Activities in Sasebo must be informed as to the exact arrival date of each ship. In the case of the "HAI SIU", the Port Detachment informed the Fleet Activities four different times that the arrival date of the Chinese ship was changed.

7. The Fleet Activities have given complete cooperation in placing, their floating cranes and tug boats at the Port officials disposal, to facilitate the loading and docking of Reparation Ships.

8. In view of the continual change in schedule, which resulted in an additional charge of 176,085 yen for demurrage on lighters loaded with reparation machinery allocated to China, it is recommended that this charge from 30th of April to 14th May be billed against the Chinese reparations bill instead of against the responsibility of the Japanese Government.

1. Request information on the Idemitsu Koki K.K. (Hiye Plant 07-21) (Iribe Plant 07-54) as to the listing now on record at higher headquarters.
2. Attached prior correspondence (copies) may be of value in the above request. This company produced aircraft parts during the war and although the 4th indorsement states that the plants would be listed as aircraft on a later annex to SCAPIN 1263, no information was received by this headquarters.
3. Eighth Army's 5th indorsement assigned code numbers to these plants but category was not stated.
4. This plant was erroneously inventoried under munitions in November 1946 and was removed by a revised listing of SCAPIN 1258.
5. The Idemitsu Koki K.K. has submitted application for release based on the technicality stated. This application is being held pending clarification from higher headquarters.

SUBJECT : Report on the condition of demobilization as end
of 1947 fiscal year.

Seeing the fiscal year 1947 end by March 31st the Western Demobilization Liaison Office Fukuoka wishes to report your office the outline of business we have done in 1947 fiscal year and its present condition.

- I. It is greatly to be noted that due to incredible help given by Allied Powers, the transportation on repatriates in 1947 fiscal year from South and China (excluding Soviet) was greatly accelerated. At the same time, cooperation of various offices concerned and earnest endeavour shown by our members gained a satisfactory result in winding up the remaining business of demobilization.

However, inspite of earnest endeavour made by SCAP and against the expectation of thousand Remaining Kins of those who remain in Soviet Camps, we regret very much that our business in this section did show only a little progress. The transportation of Japanese from Soviet port was closed temporarily since last December and it is suggested to be reppen from April this year. There remain still a great number of Unverified War Unknowns to be dealt with and much of our time now is spent for investigation and clearing up of this problem.

II. Results obtained by our Office in 1947 fiscal year in detail.

A) In concern to our business which relates between our Office and various Occupation Authorities, in the fiscal year 1947 we had managed about 100 cases. This figure is analyzed in below.

Looking as a whole enquiries made by SCAP Legal Section to our Office holds its highest mark.

We have also shown a good cooperation for 108th Graves Registration in locating the places of US Plane Crashes in Kyushu. and finding their remains. We are glad to see that this business has come to its conclusion by this February.

B) Up to this date (As of 1st Feb.1948) out of 957,641 men who followed to army from Kyushu area, 874,981 men (Returned alive 707,421 men, and dead 197,553 men.) were already dealt and still 82,660 Unverified War Unknowns remained to be uninvestigated in Kyushu. And, this figure includes those who still remain in Soviet territory.

Except Soviet Section, repatriation from other areas such as China, Philippine and Strait Settlements was almost completed by Feb.1948 leaving about 29,031 men who are subjected to be investigated as Unverified War Unknowns.

REMARKS:

1. Reparation Plant #21-5 was issued a conversion permit (1946) to manufacture acetanilide (Chemical) however, owing to the inadequate operating facilities available, the plant was not put in operation.

2. Evacuation of the reparation machinery and equipment from the above listed plants except for Plant #21-6 will automatically force plants to discontinue operation. The remaining plants have purchased only a few machines subsequent to the termination hostilities to support permitted operations.

This will displace approximately 904 laborers and clerks within the 3 plants.

It is anticipated that 30 to 35 percent of these displaced laborers and clerks will be able to find employment elsewhere for they are skilled. However, it would be rather difficult for the remaining to be employed elsewhere for this Prefecture does not have any factories of these categories.

1. References are as follows:

Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, File AG 387.6 (22 Jul 47) REP, (SCAPIN 1751), dated 22 July 1947, subject: Responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer, and Delivery of Equipment and Records Allocated to Claimant Nations Under the Reparations Program.

b. Letter for Commanding General, Eighth Army, from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, File AG 387.6 (22 Jul 47) REP, dated 22 July 1947, subject: Responsibility of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer and Delivery of Equipment and Records Allocated to Claimant Nations Under the Reparations Program.

2. Attached as Inclosure 1 is a copy of a memorandum for the Japanese Government instructing the Japanese Government to dismantle, package and transport to a port designated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and to load, stow and brace aboard ships to be provided by the Claimant Nations, each and every item of equipment appearing on the subject notices, together with such motors and other accessories as pertain thereto, in accordance with detailed instructions in reference 1a. Memorandum will be released on 3 February 1948.

3. Commanding General, Eighth Army, will be responsible for supervising the work of the Japanese Government and its agents in the implementing of reference 1a and any amendments thereto, in relation to the packing, transporting, etc. of the items appearing on the attached notices. Particular attention will be paid to packaging of machines which are annotated with an "X" in the fifth column of the allocation notice. 1. Reference is Operational Directive 5/11 for 1946, Headquarters Eighth Army, subject: "Packing and Shipping of Facilities Allocated for Reparations Removal", dated 6 October 1947.

2. a. At the present time, claimant nations are given a preliminary list of the code numbers of machines to be allocated to them from the arsenals listed in Inclosure 1 to above reference. Delegates from the claimant nations then may inspect the machines listed to decide upon acceptance or rejection of individual items. This decision is tentative pending publication of an official Allocation Notice which should follow about a month later.

b. After the recipient nations have completed the inspection of a designated arsenal for the purpose of tentatively deciding upon items of equipment desired, packaging operations will be limited to the tentatively selected items only. Thereafter, packaging of the selected items will be carried to completion except for final closure of the crate in order to permit the introduction of the packing list. Conversely, skidding and other packaging operations will cease on all non-selected items.

c. Tentatively selected items may be identified as those bearing a recipient nation's initial which has not been crossed through with an "X"; non-selected items may identified as those which bear an "X" through the initial of the recipient nation. These markings are made with chalk at the time of the inspection.

d. The Japanese Government will be required to place full packaging crews in the arsenals not later than the date tentative selections shall have been made.

e. In conjunction with the packaging of the tentatively selected items, an overall packaging schedule will be developed for each of the arsenals listed in Inclosure 1 to above reference, indicating by inventory

code number the equipment to be packaged during each two (2) week period. Schedule will include only those items of equipment tentatively selected as defined in paragraph c above. If reparations equipment has been cleaned and preserved during normal preventive maintenance operations in a manner similar to that described in Annex 5 of SCAPIN 1751, it is not necessary to repeat the cleaning and preservation operations, provided the equipment still remains in a good state of preservation. The decision as to whether a piece of equipment should be recleaned and represerved will depend upon the merits of the individual case.

1. The Japanese Government will be directed by this headquarters to remove items of reparations equipment during the next ninety days which are required for occupation force uses. These items will include transformers and associated electrical equipment, boilers, pumps, motors and some general purpose industrial equipment for repair and utility purposes. These removals may be made from all arsenals and from only such other installations as appear on the attached lists:

- (a) Synthetic rubber plants (Incl. 1)
- (b) Aircraft plants (Incl. 2)
- (c) Research laboratories (Incl. 3)

2. Japanese removal agencies will be required to clear with the military government team exercising custody and control prior to effecting removals. Action will be suspended by military government teams on removal orders which interferes with custody and maintenance of reparations equipment or which seriously hamper critical operations authorized under Operational Directive 5/5. Immediate recommendation will be made to this headquarters whenever removal action has been suspended.

3. Representatives of this headquarters will inspect the installations listed to select items desired for removal. Conference at this time should preclude necessity for suspension of removal directives in most cases.

4. In no circumstances will machine tools, secondary metal working equipment or motors already inventoried as part of individual motor driven tools or secondary metal working equipment in Army or Navy Arsenals be removed. Most of such motors are attached to their respective machines but some have been separated from the machines and segregated for custody and maintenance. In making removals from plants other than arsenals every
