SUBJECT : Japanese Naval Radio-telegraph Installation
at Funabashi.


1. There is a requirement by the Allied Forces for additional radio facilities in the Tokyo area. It has been determined by inspection that the Japanese Naval Radio-telegraph installation at Funabashi will best meet the requirements of projected Allied operations. Accordingly, the Japanese Government will make the subject installation available for immediate use by occupation forces under the control of this Headquarters.

2. It is directed that the Board of Communications make arrangements to provide an adequate staff of transmitter attendant and maintenance technicians. Japanese Navy technical personnel who are trained in the operation and maintenance of the equipment may be employed in a civilian status.

3. For the present, the Japanese Navy may continue to operate authorized circuits from this station.

4. Details of these arrangements will be coordinated with the Chief, Civil Communications Section of this Headquarters.



1. Reference is made to the Ordinance of the Ministry of Finance on the Preservation of the Property of Specified Powers, dated 20 September 1945. (CLOM No. 49).

2. You are directed to permit the Siamese Embassy to withdraw from its accounts in the Yokohama Specie Bank and the Mitsubishi Bank, such sums, not to exceed ¥60,000 monthly, as are required to defray the official expenses of the Siamese Embassy and the living and other personal expenses of Embassy personnel and of Siamese officials and nationals.







3. Paragraph 3 b of Memorandum cited in 2. above prohibits all exchanges of currency for persons leaving Japan.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo

SUBJECT : Instructions Concerning the Surrender of Arms
by the Civilian Population of Japan.

1. The following instructions supplement those issued by this headquarters in a Radiogram to the Imperial Japanese Government, above subject, dated 24 September 1945:

- a. The Imperial Japanese Government shall surrender all firearms, swords, bayonets, daggers and other weapons, ammunition, explosives and components thereof collected from the civilian population to U. S. Army representatives in accordance with instructions issued by the Commanding Generals of the Sixth and Eighth Armies and the Commander of the Fifth Fleet, USN.

(1) The following exceptions will be allowed:

- (a) Firearms and knives required for hunting purposes, and swords considered objects of art.
- (b) Explosives required by legitimate business of industrial organizations.

(2) Individual licenses and permits covering the above exceptions will be issued by the Imperial Japanese Government and reported monthly, by list, to this headquarters, the Commanding Generals of the Sixth and Eighth Armies, the Commander of the Fifth Fleet, USN, or other appropriate Occupation Force Commanders.

(3) Individuals and organizations duly licensed to retain and use firearms and explosives, or components thereof, shall comply with such instructions as may be issued by the appropriate Occupation Force Commander in the area.


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- b. The Imperial Japanese Government shall take whatever action is necessary to comply with these instructions and prevent violations or exception in the issuance of licenses or permits. Initial collection of arms, ammunition and explosives and issuance of licenses for authorized retentions shall be completed by 1 December 1945. Such subsequent checks and inspections shall be conducted as are necessary to detect violations and evasions of these instructions.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government shall submit a complete report to this headquarters not later than 1 December 1945 and monthly thereafter, indicating the number of firearms and weapons and the amount of explosives or components thereof confiscated or licensed, by type and location, together with copies of instructions to prefectural Governors and Police Chiefs and proclamations issued to effectuate the instructions issued by this headquarters.

1. Reference is made to memorandum concerning release of printing material, dated 15 October 1945.

2. You are directed to reduce the amount of material available for sale to Mainichi, Yomiuri and Asahi newspaper companies to permit publication by each of them of 215,000 single sheet newspapers, 11" x 16" every third week.

3. Revised estimate of weekly requirement is:

a. Sixty-three (63) reams (two and one-half rolls) of newsprint.
64" wide.

b. One hundred and twenty-six (126) pounds of "newsblack"
printing ink.

c. Suitable wrapping and tying material to package one hundred
and ten (110) bundles, 12" x 12" x 16".

SUBJECT : Funds and Operations of Leybold KK.

1. Reference is made to CLO Memorandum No. 213, transmitting application of subject enterprise for release of its funds so that it may execute orders for chlorinators placed by the Eighth United States Army.

2. It is directed that expenditures by this enterprise be allowed insofar as necessary to purchase materials and other expenses which are incidental to the production and repair of chlorinators and hot water heaters in accordance with procurement demands of the Sixth and Eighth United States Armies. All expenditures and receipts and production operations of the enterprise will be subject to prior approval of supervisors designated by this Headquarters.

3. You will require monthly reports to be furnished of the operations and transactions of subject enterprise, copies of which will be delivered to this Headquarters and to the supervisors of the enterprise. These reports will contain the following information:

a. Contracts placed with Leybold KK, including date of contract, production schedule, total value of contract, and Army requiring the procurement.

b. Number of units completed each month.

c. Expenditures made during previous month and expenditures authorized for following month, including detailed explanations of each expenditure.

d. Receipts of the enterprise from all sources with detailed explanation of each receipt.

e. All additions and alterations to physical plant and equipment with full explanation of each addition and alteration.

f. All changes in the officers, directors and shareholders of the enterprise with names, addresses and nationalities of individuals concerned.

4. You will also require Leybold KK to furnish the following information within 15 days of the date of this memorandum:

- a. Place of organization or incorporation of Leybold KK; length of time the company has been in operation; location of head office and of all branches or sales offices.

 - d. List of present directors and executive officers, including nationality and present address.
 - e. List of directors and executive officers as of January 1, 1942, including nationality and address.
 - f. List of shareholders as of January 1, 1942 and as of September 1, 1945, including names, nationalities and addresses.

1. Reference is made to CLO Memorandum No. 241 with attached list of applications by German Nationals.
2. It is directed that the following information be furnished to this headquarters with respect to each applicant.
 - a. Type of business organization (sole proprietorship, partnership, stock company, etc.) and date and place of organization.
 - b. Names, addresses and nationalities of officers, directors and stockholders.
 - c. Description of the nature of applicant's business since 1937, including products manufactured or merchandised and period engaged in such activity.
 - d. If the proposed transactions involve payment of debts by applicant, person to whom debt is owed and detailed statement of transaction giving rise to the obligation.
 - e. If application is for withdrawals from bank deposits of the applicant, name of bank in which account is maintained and present balance in account.
 - f. If withdrawals are intended for general operating expenses, an itemized statement of these expenses, specifying names, addresses and nationalities of persons to whom payments will be made and, if employees, their positions with the enterprise.
 - g. If a payment is desired to be made to applicant, the name of the bank into which funds will be paid and full details of transactions that gave rise to the obligation.
 - h. If transactions relate to insurance payments, the following facts:
 - (1) Address of property damaged or destroyed.

- (2) Brief description (Dwelling, store, factory etc.)
- (3) Occupied?
- (4) For what purpose?

- (10) Will proceeds be used to repair or replace old structures?


3. Consideration will be given to these applications upon receipt of the foregoing information.





Inclosure 1 To Be Used in Reporting Commercial and Industrial Companies

1. Each of the reporting companies will submit a separate report for itself and for each of its subsidiaries on financial and other allied matters as more fully described in the following paragraphs.

2. For the purpose of this directive, a subsidiary is defined as any corporation, partnership, or association for the purpose of doing business in which the reporting company is directly or indirectly the owner, of, or enjoys other beneficial interest in 10% or more of any one class of stock or indebtedness outstanding, or exercises control to the extent of 10% or more over voting controlling operations or policy.

3. a. All reports will be prepared in English according to the principle and in the form of the best accounting practice current in the United States.

b. Reports will be typewritten on white paper eight (8) by eleven (11) inches. If that size is not available, paper used will be approximately that size, but in any case all pages of any one report will be uniform.

c. Text will be single spaced, while double spacing will be used for financial statements, schedules, tabulations, lists, rosters, and other such matters.

d. Five copies of each report will be submitted.

e. In the upper right hand corner of each page, one-eighth (1/8) inch from the top of the page, will be typed the abbreviated name of the company and the number of the section of the report.

4. Each report submitted will be for the reporting company only. It will not be consolidated to include both the company and its subsidiaries and affiliates.

5. Reports will be compiled on the basis of the calendar year, excepting that if any company's books or records are kept on a fiscal year basis, the fiscal year corresponding most closely may be substituted. In all cases, however, the same basis will be used for all periods under review in any one report. Furthermore, the reports of parent companies and of their subsidiaries will be submitted on the same basis, unless the books of such companies are ordinarily kept on a different basis.

6. The report will be divided into sections, each section to correspond in numbering and in content with the following subparagraphs.

a. Section 1. EARNINGS

A record of earnings for each of the years 1935 through 1944, both years inclusive. Such statement will show sales, cost of sales, charges for depreciation and depletion, income from investments, taxes paid, dividends paid, and surplus earnings transferred to surplus.

b. Section 2. BALANCE SHEET.

A balance sheet as at the close of each of the years 1935 through 1944, both years inclusive. Such statements will show plant and property gross and net of reserves for depreciation and depletion, investments, patents and processes if carried separately, and itemization of current assets to show bank deposits, receivables, and inventories. The basis on which inventories are calculated will be noted. Capital liabilities will be shown in detail, current liabilities will be broken down as to type, such as bank loans payable, accounts due, and so forth.

(INCL 1, CONT'D)

c. Section 3. CAPITALIZATION.

(1) A tabulation as at the close of 1944 of the authorized, issued, and outstanding amounts of each class of capital stock, voting trust certificates, or other evidences of equity in assets or earnings; and of each class of bond, debenture, or other evidence of indebtedness excepting only those included in current liabilities.

(2) A tabulation by years for the period 1935 to 1944, both years inclusive, of all changes in capitalization, the number of shares of face value of capital stock or indebtedness issued or retired, the proceeds of issue or cost of retirement, and the purpose of the sale or retirement.

(3) A complete description of each class of security listed in subparagraphs (1) and (2) above, including the rights and privileges of each class of security, particularly the voting rights, participation in profits, and preferences as to assets and earnings.

d. Section 4. CONTROL.

(1) A list of all holders of record at the close of 1944 who held 500 shares or ¥ 100,000 or more of any class of the company's securities. Such list will include the number of shares or the face amount held.

(2) A list by years of all holders of 1% or more of any one class of stock or indebtedness in such cases as additions or subtractions from the holdings occurred during the course of the year, together with the extent of the change.

(3) A list by years, to be compiled at the close of each year from 1935 to 1944, both years inclusive, of foreign nationals having any ownership of or interest in the capital stock or indebtedness of the company. Reference may be made to reports previously made on this subject, and copies of such reports attached.

(4) Lists called for in subparagraphs (1), (2) and (3) may be prepared by company's registrar, transfer agent, or other fiscal agent acting in those capacities, but the reporting company will not thereby be relieved of responsibility for the accuracy of the lists.

e. Section 5. REAL ESTATE, PLANT & EQUIPMENT.

(1) A schedule of all installations or groups of installations, each amounting to ¥ 200,000 or more in gross value before charges for depreciation and depletion and located as a geographical unit, such schedule to be prepared as of the close of 1944.

(2) A brief description of each of the foregoing properties. Detailed and itemized descriptions of plant and equipment are not desired.

(3) The location of each installation, with particular references to location outside of the home islands of Japan.

(4) A list of products and capabilities for each installation with particular reference to items described in paragraphs 4 and 5, Directive Number 3, dated 22, September 1945. Reference may be made to inventory submitted in accordance with paragraph 6 of aforementioned directive, and a copy of same attached.

(5) Note of damage to plant or equipment due to bombing, fire, or other causes incidental to the recent war in such cases as the value of plant or property, or the capacity to produce has been affected to the extent of 10% or more.

(INCL 1, CONT'D)

(6) A list by years for each year from 1935 through 1944, both years inclusive, of all additions to installations or groups of installations described in subparagraph 6.e.(1) above, or deduction therefrom, in such cases as the addition or subtraction for the year amounted to $\$$ 100,000 or greater. Decreases in plant and property due to charges for depreciation and depletion as shown in Earnings, are specifically excluded.

f. Section 6. INVESTMENTS.

(1) A list at the close of each year, 1935 through 1944, both years inclusive, showing the amounts held of all stocks, voting trust certificates, equities in ownership, or other evidences of participation in earnings or profits; and of all bonds, debentures, notes, and other evidences of indebtedness excluding only those which are included among Receivables in Current Assets.

(2) A complete description of each investment listed, including voting rights, profit participation, and the percentage of the investment to the total outstanding securities of that class by the issuing company.

(3) The cost, book value, and date of acquisition of the investment to the holding company.

(4) Notation on each investment of any agreement between holding company and issuing company for management, or any sales or cartel agreements, or any other arrangements or agreements other than purchases and sales in the normal course of current business. Copies of any such agreements will be attached.

(5) A list for each year, for the years 1935 through 1944, both years inclusive, of all investments purchased or otherwise acquired, the cost thereof, and the reason for purchase. A similar list for each of the same years of all securities or other investments sold or otherwise disposed of, together with the proceeds thereof, and the reason for sale.

g. Section 7. CURRENT ASSETS.

(1) A schedule as at the close of each year 1935 through 1944 of all bank deposits, together with the bank of deposit and the rate of interest paid, in every case where the deposit amounts to 3% or more of the company's cash funds and deposits at the year end.

(2) A schedule as at the close of each year 1935 through 1944 of all accounts receivable, together with a description thereof, including the rate of interest, due date, and date item was incurred, in every case where the receivables amounts to 3% or more of the reporting company's receivables at the year end.

h. Section 8. CURRENT LIABILITIES.

(1) A schedule as at the close of each year 1935 through 1944 of all accounts, bills, or notes payable, and all other evidences of indebtedness other than those included among capital liabilities, together with a description thereof, the interest rate paid, the date due, and the date incurred, this schedule to include all payables in every case where the amount of same totaled 3% or more of the reporting company's payables at the year end.

i. Section 9. SALES

(1) A list by years of customers and the total sales made to such customers for the year where such sales were 3% or greater of the reporting company's total sales for the same year, this list to cover the years 1935 through 1944.

(2) Notation on the foregoing list of persons listed in Investments Section 6, or in Management Agreements, Section 11.

(INCL 1, CONT'D)

j. Section 10. COST OF SALES.

(1) A list for each of the years 1935 through 1944 of vendors and the total purchases made from such vendors in such cases as those purchases were 3% or more of the reporting company's purchases of material for the same year.

(2) Notation on the foregoing list of persons listed in Investments Section 6, or in Management Agreements, Section 11.

k. Section 11. MANAGEMENT FEES.

A schedule for each of the years 1935 through 1944 of all fees or other compensation paid or received for the management of this or other properties, for research and development, for manufacture and sale under licenses of any nature, for the granting of financial assistance, for agreements to provide loans or capital--in short, fees of any nature whatsoever, excluding only wages and salaries, and fees for legal work, auditing, or accounting made in the ordinary course of business.

l. Section 12. PUBLIC STATEMENTS.

(1) A copy of all reports made to shareholders during the years 1935 through 1944, whether or not formal annual reports, including balance sheets, statements of earnings, addresses by the president, chairman of the board, or other official of the company, or other matters published for the information of stockholders.

(2) A copy of the articles of incorporation together with any amendments thereto.

7. If reporting company cannot comply with any of the terms of this directive or the attached annex, a report of non compliance will be submitted together with the reasons therefor. Reference will be made in such report to the corresponding paragraph in this letter of instructions.

8. Inasmuch as time is of the essence each section of this report will be submitted separately promptly after completion.

Enclosure No. 2. To be used in Reporting Banks or other Financial Institutions

1. Each banking institution will submit a report providing the information as detailed below. Where certain banks have in the course of the past ten years absorbed other banking firms, a separate report will be submitted for each bank so absorbed from the initial date until the date of absorption by the parent institution.

2. Each banking institution will submit a report for each of its subsidiary or dependent bank. A subsidiary or dependent bank is considered for the purposes of this report to be one in which the reporting institution is directly or indirectly the owner of, or enjoys other beneficial interest in 10% or more of the paid up capital or exercises control to the extent of 10% or more over voting controlling operations or policy.

3. a. All reports will be prepared in English according to the principles and in the form of the best accounting practice current in the United States.

b. Reports will be typewritten on white paper eight by ten and one half inches; if that size is not available, paper used will be approximately that size, but in any case all pages of any one report will be uniform.

c. Text will be single spaced, while double spacing will be used for financial statements, schedules, tabulations, lists.

d. Five copies of all reports will be submitted.

e. In the upper right hand corner of each page one eighth (1/8) inch from the top of the page, will be typed the abbreviated name of the bank and the number of the section of the report.

e. Section 5. BRANCH INSTITUTIONS

(1) A schedule of all branch offices or agencies of the parent institution in Japan located by city and prefecture, with total deposits of each for the years 1935 to 1944, both years inclusive.

(2) A schedule of all branch offices or agencies outside Japan, located by city and country with brief statement of main business handled by each such foreign branch and balance sheet for each as at the close of business for such institution. A statement as to location of assets held by foreign branches as at the close of business of such branches.

3. It is the responsibility of the Imperial Japanese Government to provide diplomatic personnel residing at the Fujiya Hotel with such services and supplies, exclusive of the quarters and standard subsistence outlined in paragraph 2, as are required by international custom. However, it is not considered necessary for the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs to retain storage, office or quarters space in the Fujiya Hotel in order to discharge these responsibilities. The Gohra Hotel should be adequate for these purposes.

4. You will notify immediately by telegraph all mining companies employing such Korean laborers, of these arrangements.



a. Inaugurate or re-establish measures for:

(1) The control of animal diseases which might seriously affect the health of the personnel of the Occupation Forces, or the civil population, or which might reduce the livestock population resulting in impairment of local sources of meat or dairy products or of draft animals.

(2) The inspection of meat, meat food, or dairy products.

b. Preserve all statistical records on animal diseases, and meat, meat food, or dairy inspection.

c. Prepare and submit to this headquarters:

(1) An immediate report of each initial case of the following animal diseases, to include location and control measures in effect; Anthrax, Blackleg, Foot and Mouth Disease.

(2) A monthly statistical report of the following animal diseases by prefecture, to include number of cases, deaths, destroyed and recovered:

Anthrax	Swine Erysipelas
Infectious Abortion	Texas Fever
Blackleg	Fowl Pest
Glanders	White Diarrhea of Chickens
Foot & Mouth Disease	Rabies





1. Reference is made to radio this headquarters ZAX 7046 which directed that measures be instituted to limit and control entrance of Koreans seeking repatriation into Shimonoseki, Fukuoka, Senzaki and other areas of Kyushu and Southern Honshu until present congestion has been relieved.

2. This headquarters has been informed that Koreans are now crowding into the Kobe-Osaka-Nagoya area.

5. It is essential that the Japanese Government take immediate steps to restrict Koreans to areas in which they are now located until such time as present congestion in areas listed in paragraphs 1 and 2 above is relieved. An overall plan for repatriation of Koreans, listing ports of debarkation, and rates of flow through the ports will be issued in the next few days by this headquarters. Upon receipt of this plan you will control movements of subject personnel in accordance therewith.



3. Details of these arrangements will be coordinated with the Chief Civil Communications Section of this Headquarters.







1. a. The following plan governing the repatriation of non-Japanese nationals to their respective homelands will be placed in effect without delay.

b. The entire plan revolves around the use of Reception Centers and the flow of non-Japanese to be repatriated through these centers in the numbers that can be accommodated by the available shipping.

c. Memo to the Japanese Government, file AG 370.05 (15 Oct 45)GC dated 15 October 1945, subject: "Reception Centers in Japan for Processing Repatriates" and Memo to the Japanese Government, file AG 091 (16 Oct 45)GC, dated 16 October 1945, subject: "Policies Governing Repatriation of Japanese Nationals in Conquered Territory" are included in and become part of this plan.

2. The following Reception Centers will be used to process non-Japanese repatriates leaving Japan:

Senzaki Primarily to process departing Koreans.

Hakata Primarily to process departing Koreans and Chinese formerly domiciled in North China.

Kagoshima Primarily to process departing Chinese formerly domiciled in Central China.

Kure Primarily to process departing Koreans and Chinese formerly domiciled in North and Central China. Will be used to lessen the load of Senzaki, Hakata and Kagoshima.

3. The Japanese Ministry of Welfare will:

BASIC: Memo, IJG, File AG 370.5 (1 Nov 45)GC, dtd 1 November 1945, subject: "Repatriation of Non-Japanese from Japan".

a. Make the necessary arrangements with the other Ministries concerned to insure that each of the Reception Centers mentioned in paragraph 2 above is kept filled with outgoing repatriates to the capacities shown in paragraph 3a of Memo to the Japanese Government, file AG 370.5 (15 Oct 45)GC, dated 15 October 1945, subject: "Reception Centers in Japan for Processing Repatriates".

b. Scrutinize carefully the shipping schedules furnished so that Reception Centers do not become congested.

4. The Japanese Ministry of Welfare will be guided by the following in preparing plans for the flow of repatriates to Reception Centers.

a. Koreans will be cleared from areas in the following order:

- (1) Moji - Shimonoseki - Hakata Area.
- (2) Osaka - Kobe Area.
- (3) Remainder of Japan.

b. Within the areas mentioned in paragraph 4a, above, priority for Koreans will be given, in order, to: demobilized soldiers, former forced laborers and other Koreans.

c. Controls will be established to fix Koreans desiring to return to Korea in their present abodes until they are directed to move under the provisions of this plan.

d. A special priority will be established for the repatriation of Chinese and Korean coal miners residing in Northern Honshu. They will be evacuated at a rate of 1000 per day beginning not later than 14 November 1945.

e. Chinese formerly domiciled in North China will be returned to Northern Chinese ports at a rate of not to exceed 10,000 per month. Those domiciled in Central China will be returned to Shanghai at a rate not to exceed 2,000 per month.

f. Empty spaces on vessels bound for northern Chinese ports will be filled with Koreans who will be offloaded in Korea.

g. Plans for the return of those individuals formerly domiciled in Formosa, the Ryukyus and South China will be deferred until further notice.

BASIC: Memo, IJG, File AG 370.5 (1 Nov 45)GC, dtd 1 November 1945, subject: "Repatriation of Non-Japanese from Japan".

5. The Japanese Government will be furnished shipping schedules governing the movement of:

a. Japanese merchant and naval vessels in the same manner as at present.

b. United States Landing Ships, Tank, as they are established, through the same channels. Their schedules will indicate which LST's may be outloaded, with Koreans, Chinese destined for Northern and Central China.

6. The Japanese Ministry of Welfare will furnish all non-Japanese repatriates outloaded on LST's with one day's supply of pre-cooked rice and sufficient dry rice for the voyage plus one day.

7. The Japanese Government, in order to prevent congestion at Reception Centers and unnecessary suffering by repatriates, will adopt among others the following measures:


a. Inform all concerned of the essential parts of this plan through the media of the press and radio.

b. Through the same media urge the prospective repatriates to remain in their former places of abode until their movement to Reception Centers can be planned and calling their attention to the sufferings that will result from overcrowding of centers and the consequent delays in carrying out the program.

8. Japanese Ministry of Welfare will modify their plan, contained in C.L.O. No. 549, subject: "Repatriation of Koreans", dated 20 October 1945 to conform with provisions of this memorandum.

9. A report will be submitted showing the number of repatriates leaving Japan each week. The week will be from Monday through Sunday inclusive and will reach this headquarters not later than the following Wednesday. The following information will be included: name of vessel, time of departure, port of departure, destination, number of passengers by nationality, and total departed to date by nationality.

b. Upon receipt of this memorandum you will confiscate, collect, and deliver into the custody of United States Forces all heroin in Japan. Place and date of delivery will be as designated by the appropriate Army Commanders.

c. You will furnish this headquarters a prompt report of the disposal of each stock of heroin. Each report shall contain the following information:

- (1) Owner of heroin.
- (2) Date of removal and place from which removed.
- (3) Date and place of final delivery into custody of United States Forces.
- (4) Name and title of official transferring custody.
- (5) Name, Rank, and organization of Officer receiving custody of heroin.

1. From this date the operations of the Japanese whaling industry will be conducted in strict conformity with the terms of the International Conventions regarding whaling except insofar as inconsistent with previous or subsequent directives from this Headquarters.
2. The International Conventions with respect to whaling are:
 - a. Convention for the Regulation of Whaling signed at Geneva, 24 September 1931.
 - b. Agreement for the Regulation of Whaling, and Final Act signed at London, 8 June 1937.
 - c. Protocol amending the Agreement for the Regulation of Whaling signed at London, June 1937, and Final Act of the Conference signed at London, 24 June 1938.
3. Statistical, biological and other reports as required under the terms of these Conventions will be submitted to this Headquarters.
4. Complete utilization will be made of the carcass of each whale taken by the Japanese whaling industry and, insofar as possible, the meat of the whales will be marketed as food.

You will furnish to this Headquarters within ten days a statement of the action taken by you and complete details, supported by bank account records and statements of all transactions involving the account of Uzami Yoneichi with the Fukuoka Branch of the Imperial Bank which were effected subsequent to the establishment of the credit described in paragraph 1 of this memorandum.

SUBJECT : Dissolution of Holding Companies.

1. Receipt of the proposed plan for the dissolution of Mitsui Honsha, Yasuda Hozensha, Sumitomo Honsha and Kabushiki Kaisha Mitsubishi Honsha is acknowledged.
2. The plan proposed therein is approved in general and the Imperial Japanese Government will immediately proceed to effectuate it. No disposition of any property transferred to the Holding Company Liquidation Commission will be made without the prior approval of the Supreme Commander. You will submit the legislation through which the Holding Company Liquidation Commission will be created to the Supreme Commander for approval. It should be clearly understood that full freedom of action is retained by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to elaborate or modify the proposed plan at any time and to supervise and review its execution.
3. The Imperial Japanese Government will immediately take such steps as are necessary effectually to prohibit the sale, gift, assignment or transfer of any moveable or immoveable property, including securities and other evidences of ownership, indebtedness or control by Mitsui Honsha, Yasuda Hozensha, Sumitomo Honsha and Kabushiki Kaisha Mitsubishi Honsha and the members of the Mitsui, Iwasaki, Yasuda and Sumitomo families or by any person acting in their behalf.
4. The Imperial Japanese Government will deliver to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, within fifteen days of the receipt of this memorandum, a report listing:
 - a. All moveable or immoveable property, securities and other evidences of ownership, indebtedness and control in which the members of the Mitsui, Iwasaki, Yasuda and Sumitomo families had any right, title or interest as of November 1st, 1945.
 - b. All transactions involving moveable or immoveable property, including securities and other evidences of ownership, indebtedness and control by any member of the Mitsui, Iwasaki, Yasuda and Sumitomo families since January 1st, 1945.

5. It is the intention of the Supreme Commander to dissolve the private industrial, commercial, financial and agricultural combines in Japan, and to eliminate undesirable interlocking directorates and undesirable intercorporate security ownership so as to:

a. Permit a wider distribution of income and of ownership of the means of production and trade.

b. Encourage the development within Japan of economic ways and institutions of a type that will contribute to the growth of peaceful and democratic forces. The plan proposed by the Imperial Japanese Government in the memorandum referred to in Paragraph 1 above will be considered only as a preliminary step toward these objectives.

6. Accordingly, the Imperial Japanese Government will promptly present for approval by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

a. Plans for the dissolution of industrial, commercial, financial and agricultural combines in addition to those mentioned in the communication acknowledged in Paragraph 1 hereof.


b. Its program to abrogate all legislative or administrative measures which create, foster or tend to strengthen private monopoly.

c. Its program for the enactment of such laws as will eliminate and prevent private monopoly and restraint of trade, undesirable interlocking directorates, undesirable intercorporate security ownership and the segregation of Banking from commerce, industry and agriculture and as will provide equal opportunity to firms and individuals to compete in industry, commerce, finance and agriculture on a democratic basis.

7. The Imperial Japanese Government will immediately take such steps as are necessary effectually to terminate and prohibit Japanese participation in private international cartels or other restrictive private international contracts or arrangements.

MEMORANDUM FOR: IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo

SUBJECT : Japanese Participation in Air-Sea Rescue Operations.

1. In order to provide for the participation by Japanese surface craft in operations designed to rescue aviators forced down in Japanese waters, it is desired that you issue appropriate instructions to accomplish the following:

a. Crews of all Japanese vessels will be on the alert for airmen known or believed to be forced down in Japanese waters. If the vessel is in a position to effect rescue of airmen in distress, it will proceed without delay to the scene of the accident and conduct rescue operations. All personnel rescued will be cared for in the best possible manner until they are returned to a unit of the Allied Occupation Forces.

b. Detailed radio reports concerning rescue of airmen forced down at sea will be transmitted without delay to the Japanese Naval Radio Station in Tokyo, or to its successor agencies following the inactivation of the Imperial Japanese Navy Department. Insofar as its functioning for this purpose is concerned, this station will hereinafter be referred to as the "Rescue Communications Center". Suitable instructions will be issued by you to cause such reports to be assigned the highest priority classification, and to be transmitted either directly to the Rescue Communications Center or via the minimum practicable number of intermediate point-to-point stations; it is intended that this will be accomplished within the capabilities of existing communications facilities through the use of special procedures and channels to be designated by you and subject to the approval of the Civil Communications Section of this Headquarters.

c. When a vessel not equipped with radio transmitting apparatus effects the rescue of uninjured airmen in distress, it will proceed according to the best judgement of the Master of the vessel. Personnel requiring medical attention exceeding the facilities of the rescuing vessel, will be delivered to the nearest port possessing suitable facilities for the proper care of the personnel involved. Upon delivering any rescued personnel to a port, the Master of the vessel will promptly report all particulars, through shore based communications facilities, to the Rescue Communications Center.

d. The Rescue Communications Center will telephone to Advance Echelon, Far East Air Forces, all reports and information received pertaining to the rescue of airmen, or aircraft in distress.

e. The Rescue Communications Center will broadcast information received from Far East Air Forces that pertains to aircraft known or believed to be lost in Japanese waters. These broadcasts will be scheduled at least six times during the hours of daylight, selected so as to be well distributed throughout the day. The time schedule and frequency channels for these broadcasts will be as designated by you subject to approval by the Civil Communications Section of this Headquarters. You will require all Japanese vessels, and the shore stations with which they communicate, to listen in on these broadcasts, and any vessel in a position to effect the rescue of airmen in distress will proceed without delay to the area indicated and conduct rescue operations.

f. The above prescribed broadcast will be supplemented by any other methods of communication between the Rescue Communications Center and ships in Japanese waters that can be arranged within the capabilities of existing communications facilities. These supplementary methods will be employed in cases where excessive delay would be involved in waiting till the next regularly scheduled broadcast period for the transmission of distress traffic.


g. Any Japanese vessel in a position to initiate rescue operations in response to appeals made by either of the methods outlined in e and f above, will immediately transmit to the Rescue Communications Center a report of its position and intentions with respect to conduct of rescue operations.

2. All special communications arrangements will be submitted to the Civil Communications Section of this Headquarters for consideration, and coordinated with Advance Echelon, Far East Air Forces.

3. For your information, it is estimated that the foregoing procedure may be required for the rescue of aircraft lost in Japanese waters approximately once or twice a month, depending upon the weather.

4. Direct communication between Advance Echelon, Far East Air Forces, and the Imperial Japanese Navy Department (or the successor agency which will assume the function of operating the present Naval Radio Station in Tokyo) is hereby authorized on matters specifically relating to the establishment and operation of the rescue procedure prescribed herein.

These persons will be apprehended as suspected War Criminals and delivered to the Commanding General XI Corps, at XI Corps Stockade Number 2 (Omori Prison) Yokohama, at the earliest practicable date.
