Frank:

Re: Bill for Exceptions to  
Taxation upon those Japanese who  
engage in services for Allied Forces  
relating to the Korean Conflict:

ESS/Moss stated informally  
that it "sounds like a racket."

ESS/Shavell, to whom Moss referred  
the bill, said that ESS highly  
disapproves and also knows that the  
Japanese government is against the  
bill.

ESS policy has been to restrict  
any exemptions whatsoever. Further-  
more, Shavell said that the nature  
of the bonus (allowance) to the  
marine workers is essentially no  
different from special bonus granted  
to laborers in other forms of  
dangerous activity, such as mining.  
To exempt the allowances of marine  
workers would lead to similar re-  
quests by miners, fishermen, etc.
