SUBJECT: Organization of the Historical Project

1. Following is the organizational outline of the Historical Project:

I. INTRODUCTION

This volume will develop the broad fundamental policies by which SCAP was guided and will show their extension and application to the several specific fields of activity treated in detail in the specialized monographs. It will provide a perspective view, properly highlighted, of all the problems, objectives, activities and accomplishments of the Occupation, the interrelation and interaction of policies in respect to diverse fields, and an exposition of the principal accomplishments of the Occupation in each field covered by the specialized monographs.

II. SPECIAL TOPICS MONOGRAPHS

1. Administration of the Occupation

Contents:

Determination of policy -- dominant role of the United States, initial action (appointment of Supreme Commander, utilization of Japanese Government); international policy-making organs, chain of command, Allied Council for Japan (composition, consultative and advisory character).

Administration -- the Supreme Commander (initial action, dual role as SCAP and CINCPAC, establishment of GHQ); the regime of control (military government plans and action, abandonment of direct military government organization, functions of GHQ SCAP, implementation of policy, surveillance by SCAP, special missions to SCAP).

Conduct of Japan's foreign relations -- postsurrender territorial limitation, Japanese interests abroad, SCAP administration of foreign affairs, foreign missions accredited to SCAP, displaced persons, foreign individuals and business organizations, re-establishment of Japanese representation abroad.

2. Logistic Support of the Occupation

Contents:

Utilization of Japanese supplies and services -- general policies, housing, general construction, real estate, labor, transportation, communications, materials and supplies, maintenance, yen fundings, sundry expenses.

Impact on the Japanese economy -- financing Occupation Forces, contributory assets (incentive goods, BIG-5, GARIOA, miscellaneous assets).

3. Population

Contents:

Pre-Meiji period -- nature of the balance of population and resources.

Meiji to World War II -- population growth, trends and movements; population problems; attempted solutions.

The population problem in its Occupation context -- limitation of resources (land, food, minerals, fuel and power); impact of demobilization and repatriation.

Population -- censuses, population trends, analysis, population movements.

Measures directed toward solution of problem -- economic recovery, foreign trade, Japanese movements to limit population increase.

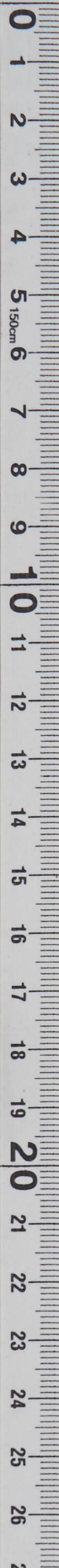

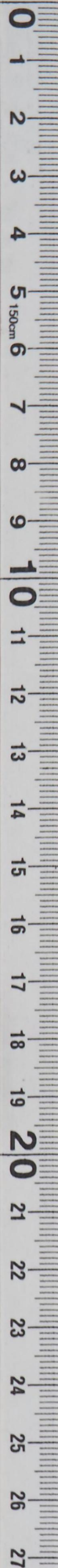
