



Upon delivery by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to the Board of Trade (Boeki Cho) of the duly endorsed bill of lading for the cargo, a formal receipt in quintuplicate (5 copies) for the raw cotton covered by each bill of lading, prepared in the prescribed form, will be signed and sealed by the Board of Trade (Boeki Cho) and its representative and submitted to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Properly endorsed ocean bills of lading will be surrendered to the U. S. Maritime Commission at port of arrival in exchange for appropriate delivery orders for the cargo.

4. Receipts in quintuplicate (5 copies), showing the total number of bales of cotton actually discharged and delivered from the above mentioned vessel will be signed and sealed by an authorized representative of the Board of Trade (Boeki Cho).


5. The Board of Trade (Boeki Cho) will provide for the handling, protection and insurance of this cotton against all insurable losses from time of taking delivery until further notice.


